USDA ANNOUNCES REVISIONS TO 2002-CROP CANE SUGAR MARKETING ALLOTMENTS AND ALLOCATIONS

WASHINGTON, March 13, 2003 – The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) today announced the reassignment of unused cane sugar allocations from processors in Hawaii and Puerto Rico to processors in Louisiana, Texas and Florida.

While CCC is required to make a determination on the need for reassignments by May 1, CCC is taking this action earlier at the request of sugarcane producers and processors, to better reflect actual 2002-crop sugar supply, particularly in Louisiana. Hurricanes in Louisiana last November caused distortions in mill production levels relative to their allocations and unexpectedly prevented the marketing of sugar. In an effort to realign mill allocations, CCC sent out a survey to cane processors in February 2003 to capture revisions to expected 2002-crop sugar supply.

The Hawaiian cane allotment was reduced by 22,951 short tons, raw value (STRV), while Puerto Rico's allotment was reduced by 5,946 STRV. Florida gained 15,864 STRV, Louisiana gained 9,280 STRV and Texas gained 3,753 STRV.

The final allotments/allocations were calculated from a combination of two steps: First, because 50 percent of cane sugar state allotments and processor allocations are based on the estimate of current crop production, updated production estimates from the February survey yielded new allotments/allocations (See column B of the attached table). Cane sugar marketing allotments/allocations will change throughout the year as the estimates of current production improve. Second, based on the February survey results, 30,947 STRV were reassigned from Hawaii and Puerto Rico processors. This amount was then proportionately redistributed only to those cane processors, who revealed in the same survey, a shortfall in allocation for the current crop year.
