AGI RECONCILLIATION PROCESS

Producers who are active participants in programs offered through FSA and/or NRCS are required to complete form CCC-931 Average Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) Certification and Consent to Disclosure of Tax Information. By completing and signing the form, the Producer is certifying their AGI compliance and giving the FSA Office permission to submit the form to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for verification of their income. In the event that the form is rejected by the IRS, the form is to be sent back to the originating FSA Office. The FSA Office will then notify the producer of the reason the form was rejected and will assist the producer in obtaining a correct form. The FSA Office will then submit the corrected form back to the IRS for processing.

Unfortunately, there was some confusion at the IRS. The IRS has erroneously returned over 8,000 forms that were received for the 2012 program year instead of sending them back to the originating FSA Office. If you receive a form CCC-931 returned from the IRS, contact your local FSA Office for assistance. We apologize for any confusion this may cause.

2012 DCP SIGNUP UNDERWAY

The signup period for the 2012 Direct and Counter-cyclical Payment Program (DCP) has begun and will end **June 1, 2012**. As established through the 2008 Farm Bill, there will **not** be advance payments issued for 2012. All payments will be issued to eligible producers mid-October 2012. The payment rate factor for 2012 increased from 83.3% of the base acres to 85% of the base acres. For further details pertaining to the 2012 DCP signup or to schedule an appointment to signup, contact your local county office.

ACREAGE REPORTS

Most programs offered through the Farm Service Agency require producers to timely file an acreage report on all of their land. An acreage report, also known as a crop certification, is a report of what is planted or voluntarily growing on a producer's land. If nothing is planted and the land is to remain vacant, a report of the ground being "fallow" would be completed. If the land is rangeland, a report of the ground being "native grass" would be completed.

The deadline to timely file a report of acreage on small grains including wheat, barley and oats, is May 15, 2012. This includes oats planted as a cover crop or for green manure. The deadline to timely file a report of acreage for all other crops including fallow ground and native grass (rangeland) is July 15, 2012. If the crop will be planted after its applicable deadline, the producer will have 15 days after which it is planted to timely notify the county office.

If a producer misses the filing deadline for their applicable crop, they can request a late filed acreage report to be completed. The county office will then

perform a field visit to verify the existence of the crop and will be required to assess a fee for the service.

WEED CONTROL

As Spring is right around the corner, we would like to take this time to remind producers of their obligation to maintain the weeds on their farmland. Those producers who are enrolled and participate in the Direct & Counter-cyclical Payment Program (DCP) are contractually obligated to maintain all weeds and noxious plants that are growing on their payment acres, also known as base acres. Weeds that are growing out of control serve as a nuisance to neighboring farms and the general public. Producers who are found to have unmaintained

weeds will receive written notification to control the weeds. Failure to comply will result in a reduction of DCP payments. If you have any questions or would like to anonymously report an out of compliance farm, please notify your local county office.

GOVDELIVERY — THE NEXT STEP TO SAVE TIME & INCREASE EFFICIENCY
