DCP/ACRE Sign-up

2012 Direct and Counter-Cyclical Program (DCP) enrollment opened on Jan. 23, 2012 and closes on June 1, 2012. Call now for an appointment at the local office. Here are some IMPORTANT REMINDERS: 1) All producers planting on **DCP base** acres must be identified on the DCP/ACRE contract and receive a proportionate share of DCP/ACRE payment for the farm.

2) Changes on the farm after enrolling June 1st in DCP/ACRE **must** be reported to your local FSA office including: ownership changes, producer changes (individuals and entities) and changes in crop shares arrangements. **Note:** All changes must be made by Sept. 30, 2012.

Supplemental Revenue Assistance Program (SURE)

The sign-up for 2010 SURE losses continues through **June 1**, 2012.

The Supplemental Revenue Assistance Program (SURE) provides benefits for farm revenue losses due to natural disasters that occurred in the crop year 2010. SURE is available to eligible producers on:

Farms in counties with Secretarial disaster declarations, including contiguous counties, that have incurred crop production or quality losses, or both, and includes all crops grown by a producer nationwide, except grazed crops. Kern County was not a designated disaster county in 2010.

Any farm in which, for the crop year, the actual production on the farm because of disaster-related conditions is 50 percent or less than normal production of the farm.

Actively Engaged

USDA has amended the rules that govern the requirements to be 'actively engaged' in farming. These rules apply to eligibility for payments under the Direct and Counter-cyclical Program (DCP) or Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) program administered by FSA.

Normally the stockholder or a member of a legal entity **must** make contributions of active personal labor and/or active personal management for the farming operation. The contributions are to be performed on regular basis, must be identifiable, and separate from the contributions of others.

The exception to this rule for a stockholder or member of a legal entity only occurs when both of the following apply:

1) At least half of the interest in the legal entity is held by stockholders or

NOTICE TO HISPANIC AND/OR WOMEN FARMERS OR RANCHERS

COMPENSATION FOR CLAIMS OF DISCRIMINATION

If you believe that the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) improperly denied farm loan benefits to you between 1981 and 2000 because you are Hispanic, or because you are female, you may be eligible to apply for compensation.

The claims package will have detailed information about the eligibility and claims process.

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Farm Reconstitutions

At FSA, farms are "constituted" to group all tracts having the same owner and the same operator under one farm serial number. When changes in the ownership or operation take place, a farm reconstitution is necessary.

The reconstitution or recon, is the process of combining or dividing farms or tracts of land based on the farming operation. NOTE: to be effective for the current year, recons must be requested by August 1, 2012 for farms enrolled in specific programs. If not signed into programs then the deadline to request a recon is June 1, 2012.

members who are providing active personal labor or active personal management; and

2) The total direct payments received by the legal entity and each of the members can't exceed \$40,000.

Payment Limitations

Several FSA programs are subject to payment limitation provisions. Violation of any of these provisions may subject the producer to loss of payment and possible prosecution.

The following are current FSA program payment limitations;

Payment Eligibility

Note that specific eligibility criteria exist for the DCP and ACRE programs. Contact your nearest county FSA Office for further information regarding these and other provisions: 1) actively engaged, 2) cash-rent tenant rule and

3) foreign persons.

Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP)

The noninsured crop disaster assistance program (NAP) is a federally funded program that helps producers reduce their risk when growing food and fiber crops, specialty crops and crops for livestock feed. These benefits are only available for crops for which the catastrophic level of crop insurance is not available. Application for coverage must be filed by the applicable crop's application closing date.

Production records and applications for payment for all crops must be re-

ported to FSA no later than the acreage

reporting date for the crop for the following year. NAP Losses must be reported within 15 days of loss.

NOTICES OF LOSS;

In case of damage to any NAP covered crop at least one producer having a share in the unit must file a Notice of Loss in the FSA County Office;

- For prevented planting claims within 15 days after the final planting date.
- 2. For low yield claims and allowable value loss the EARLIER of;
 - a) 15 days after the disaster occurrence or date of loss or damage to the crop becomes apparent.
 - b) 15 days after the normal harvest date

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Average Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) Provisions

For 2012, there are now four qualifying levels for AGI provisions as follows;

- \$500,000 Nonfarm Income- if a person or legal entity has AGI nonfarm income that exceeds \$500,000, the person or legal entity is ineligible for all commodity program payments and benefits.
- 2) **\$750,000 Farm Income-** if a person or legal entity has AGI farm income that exceeds \$750,000, the person or legal entity is ineligible for DCP direct payments only.
- \$1,000,000 Nonfarm Income- if a person or legal entity had AGI nonfarm income that exceeds \$1,000,000, the person or legal entity is ineligible for all conservation program benefits unless at least 66.66% of total AGI is average adjusted gross <u>farm</u> income.
- 4) \$1,000,000 Total Farm and Nonfarm Income- if a person or legal entity has AGI farm and nonfarm income that exceeds \$1,000,000, the person or legal entity is ineligible for 2012 direct payment under DCP

Form CCC-931 must be completed to authorize the AGI certification process in conjunction with the IRS. The average AGI is based on the average adjusted gross income for the three taxable years preceding the complete taxable year. For the 2012 program year, the three taxable years for AGI would include 2008, 2009 and 2010. Please consult with your accountant or tax preparer to complete this form correctly.
