County Committee (COC) Elections

The election of local agricultural producers to Farm Service Agency (FSA) County Committees is important to farmers and ranchers. County Committee members assist FSA by helping deliver FSA farm programs at the local level. Farmers and ranchers who serve on county committees help oversee administration of farm programs in their counties and work to ensure FSA agricultural programs serve the needs of local producers.

This year, the 2013 election will take place in central Monterey County (LAA#2). This are lies between Gonzales and San Lucas. A map of this area is available in the County Office. The COC nomination deadline is August 1, 2013. The nomination form is available at USDA Service Centers and online:

Microloan Program

The Farm Service Agency (FSA) has a new Microloan (ML) program to better serve the unique financial operating needs of beginning, niche and small farm operations. The low-interest FSA Microloan can help farmers with credit needs of \$35,000 or less. The streamlined application process fits

the needs of new and smaller producers. Eligible applicants can apply for up to \$35,000 to pay for start-up expenses such as hoop houses to extend the growing season, essential tools, irrigation and annual expenses such as seed, fertilizer, utilities, land rents, marketing, and distribution expenses. As financing needs increase, applicants can apply for a regular operating loan up to the maximum amount of \$300,000. Applicants can also obtain financing from a commercial lender under FSA's Guaranteed Loan Program. Crop Acreage Reporting Dates

Producers should file a crop acreage report each year. Filing an accurate acreage report for all crops and land uses, including failed acreage and prevented planting acreage can prevent the loss of benefits for a variety of programs. Failed acreage must be reported within 15 days of the disaster event and before disposition of the crop. Prevented planting must be reported no later than 15 days after the final planting date. Acreage reports are required for many Farm Service Agency programs. For all crops, including Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) crops, acreage reports are to be certified by the deadline for each crop. For exact deadlines on certifications for each type of crop and *late filed acreage reporting provisions*, call the County Office for information.

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2014 Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance (NAP) Closing Date

The NAP program is a risk management tool that provides catastrophic coverage for most crops that are not insurable by Federal Crop insurance. For a nominal fee, or a waived fee if you meet the limited resource farmer definition, you may purchase coverage on your crop for losses due to adverse weather. Participants must file an acreage report and production records each year, meet applicable Adjusted Gross Income eligibility requirements, file a timely notice of loss on the crop that is damaged, and incur greater than a 50% loss of production on the crop by unit to qualify for benefits. Fruit and nut trees must meet specific age requirements to obtain coverage. If you do not see the crop you grow on this list, contact this office for clarification. The CCC-471 NAP Application for Coverage form and the applicable fee must be submitted by these dates in order for your crop to have coverage in 2014.

Direct Countercyclical Program (DCP) Deadline

The sign-up period for DCP is coming to a close. Producers are encouraged to sign up for DCP before the Aug. 2, 2013 deadline. The 2013 DCP program provisions are unchanged from 2012. Producers must file complete acreage reports and meet other eligibility requirements to participate. Contact the FSA county office for an appointment to enroll or for additional information.

Foreign Land Notification

Foreign Landowner Notification. The Agricultural Foreign Investment Disclosure Act (AFIDA) requires all foreign owners of U.S. agricultural land to report their holdings to the Secretary of Agriculture. The Farm Service Agency administers this program for USDA. Foreign persons who have purchased or sold agricultural land in the county are required to report the transaction to FSA with 90 days of the closing. Failure to submit the AFIDA form could result in civil penalties of up to 25 percent of the fair market value of the property. If you are a county government official, real estate agent, attorney or are involved in real estate transactions remember to notify foreign investors of these reporting requirements.
