2008 SURE SIGNUP <u>BEGINS</u>

Signup for the Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payments program (SURE) for producers who suffered 2008 crop production or quality losses began January 4, 2010.

Unlike previous disaster programs. SURE takes into consideration crop losses on and revenue from all crops grown by a producer nationwide. It provides assistance in an amount equal to 60% of the difference between the SURE farm guarantee and total farm revenue. The farm guarantee is based on the amount of crop insurance and Non-Crop insured Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) coverage on the farm. Total farm revenue takes into account the actual value of production on the farm as well as insurance indemnities and certain farm program payments.

To be eligible, producers must have:

 met the risk management purchase requirement (RMPR) by either obtaining crop insur-

ance or NAP coverage for all economically significant crops; **PLUS**

- had a farming interest physically located in or contiguous to a county with a 2008 Secretarial disaster designation AND
- suffered at least a 10% production loss on at least one crop of economic significance;
 OR
- individually suffered at least a 50% loss of the normal production on the farm due to a natural disaster.

Producers had the opportunity to obtain a waiver of the 2008 RMPR through a buy-in provision. The RMPR may be waived for producers considered socially disadvantaged, a beginning farmer or rancher or a limited resource farmer.

HIGHLY ERODIBLE LAND AND WETLAND COMPLIANCE

Operators are reminded that in order to receive payments. Highly compliance with Erodible Land (HEL) and Wetland Conservation (WC) required. provisions are Farmers with HEL soils need to be aware of tillage, crop residue and rotation requirements as specified in their conservation plans. It is important that you very contact our office before modifying (e.g., tiling, draining, dredging, filling or leveling) any wetland or drainage ditch. Failure to obtain advance approval for any of these situations can result in loss of all Federal payments and eligibility.

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE

Any person convicted under federal or state law of a controlled substance violation could be ineligible for USDA payments or benefits. Violations include planting, harvesting or growing a prohibited plant (e.g., marijuana, opium poppies and other drug producing plants).

DESIGNATION BY LANDOWNER

When land with contract acres is sold, those contract acres normally transfer with the land to the new owner based on a cropland ratio.

However, the landowner and purchaser can agree to divide the contract acres in any manner that is mutually agreeable. To use this designation by landowner method, the land sold must have been owned for at least three years and the owner and purchaser must sign a memorandum of under-standing designating contract acres before completing the sale. POWER OF ATTORNEY

For those who find it difficult to visit the county office personally because of work schedules, distance, health, etc., FSA has a power of attorney form available that enables you to designate another person to conduct your business at the office. If you are interested, please contact our office or any Farm Service Agency office near you for more information.

1996 DEBT COLLECTION IMPROVEMENT ACT

The DCIA provides, among other things, that a person owing a delinquent nontax debt to the Federal Government is ineligible for Federal financial assistance, including direct loans (other than disaster loans) or loan insurance or guarantee. The Agriculture, Rural Development. Food and Drua Administration and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2001 amended DCIA to exclude marketing assistance loans or loan LDP's from the restrictions on barring delinguent Federal debtors from obtaining Federal loans or loan quarantees. Proceeds received from MAL's and

LDP's will be offset against any delinquent debt owed by the producer to FSA. Proceeds from MAL's and LDP's to producers who are members of corporations, partnerships or other entities will be offset against the producer's pro rata share of entity payments after notification of the intent to offset has been provided to the nonborrower entities.

Adjusted aross income must be certified by submitting a CCC-926 (Average Adjusted Gross Income Statement) annually. USDA has finalized a Memorandum of Understanding with the IRS to establish an electronic information exchange process for verifying compliance with AGI provisions for programs administered by USDA's FSA and NRCS. Participants must provide consent for the use and disclosure of tax information to USDA agencies by completing and submitting a CCC-927 (individual) or CCC-928 (entity) to the IRS. Participants who choose to not submit required forms for 2009 and 2010 will be determined noncompliant. CIVIL RIGHTS/ DISCRIMINATION PROCESS

As a participant in or applicant for programs or activities operated or sponsored by USDA, you have the right to be treated fairly. If you believe you have been discriminated against because of your race, national origin, gender, age, religion, disability or marital or familial status, you may file a discrimination complaint. The complaint should be filed with the USDA Office of Civil Rights within 180 days of the date you became aware of the alleged discrimination. FOREIGN LANDOWNER NOTIFICATION

The Agricultural Foreign Investment Disclosure Act (AFIDA) requires all foreign owners of U.S. agricultural land to report their holdings to the Secretary of Agriculture through FSA. Failure to submit the AFIDA form within 90 days of closing could result in civil penalties of up to 25% of the fair market value of the property. It is the foreign person's responsibility to report the land transactions.

RECORD CHANGES

Participation in FSA farm programs requires all records to be accurate and up to It is the producer's date. responsibility to inform FSA of changes to his/her farming operation including, but not limited to: land ownership changes, adding or dropping a tract of land (leases), entity type or ID number changes, marriage, divorce, deaths or changes in your financial institution for direct deposit. A copy of the deed must be submitted for ownership changes; copies of written lease agreements must be submitted for all cash leases.



FRAUD MAY LEAD TO DISQUALIFICATION

Producers found to have committed crop insurance fraud are ineligible for a number of programs administered by FSA and CCC. Any person found to have committed fraud will receive a notice and will have an opportunity for a hearing on the record. The person may be disqualified from receiving any benefits under a number of programs for a period of up to 5 years. Other sanctions may also apply.

SPECIAL ACCOMODATIONS

Special accommodations will be made upon request for individuals with disabilities, vision impairment or hearing impairment. If accommodations are required, individuals should contact the county FSA office staff directly or by phone.
