Maximum Loan Authorities Effective 10/1/2015



As outlined in 2-FLP Paragraph 244 A, FSA guaranteed loan limits increase annually each October 1st. The dollar limit of guaranteed loans is adjusted based on the percentage change in the Prices Paid by Farmers Index.

The new guaranteed loan limit is \$1,399,000, for loans approved on or after 10/1/15.

Please contact the FSA County Office for increased loan limits when working with multiple loans in both guaranteed and direct FSA loan programs.

FSA Farm and Ranch 2016 Planning Guide

Use of the FSA developed prices is optional; however, if has been found to be beneficial for lenders in cash flow preparation both in submitting guaranteed loan requests. If not using FSA's planning guide, the lender may use other price forecasts from land grant universities, published prices, and forward contracted prices, futures or price histories of specialty crops on other commodities. Key is to document those prices and discuss same with FSA. Preferred Lenders will follow their CMS Agreement of price projections. **All lenders** must use price forecasts that are reasonable and defensible according to 2-FLP Subparagraph 152 C.

FSA's 2015 Year in Brief

FSA completed a record year of providing farm loans to farmers and ranchers nationwide. FSA exceeded the volume of loans previously made. Previously our high number was in 1985. FSA provided \$2 Billion in loan dollars via the Guaranteed Farm Ownership Program and \$1 Billion in loan dollars via the Direct Farm Ownership Program. Both of these programs were the highest dollar loaned in history.
