# **IRS 1099 Changes**

Calendar year 2012 has brought changes to the way FSA reports farm program payments to the producer and to the IRS.

In past years, IRS Form 1099-G would be issued to show all program payments received from the Farm Service Agency, regardless of the amount.

Starting with calendar year 2012, producers whose total reportable payments from FSA are less Leah Mori than \$600 will not receive IRS Form 1099-G. Also, producers who receive payments from more than one county will only receive one Form 1099-G if the total of all payments from all counties is \$600 or more. Bryan Shupe

The same changes will apply to those who normally receive IRS Form 1099-MISC from FSA.

### Pennington ext. Guaranteed Loan Limit

County The Farm Service Agency has announced that as of Oct. 1, 2012 the loan limit for the Guaranteed Committee Loan Program is \$1,302,000. This limit is adjusted annually based on data compiled by the (COC): National Agricultural Statistics Service.

Chairman: The FSA overall lending ceiling increases every year according to an inflation index. The maximum combined guaranteed and direct farm loan indebtedness is now \$1,602,000. Fred Wilkinson

Seeding: Fall	The Farm Storage Facility Loan Program allows producers of eligible commodities to obtain low-
Barley,	interest financing to build or upgrade farm storage and handling facilities.
Fall Forage Seeding, Fall Wheat,	The new maximum principal amount of a loan through FSFL is \$500,000. Participants are now required to provide a down payment of 15 percent, with CCC providing a loan for the remaining 85 percent of the net cost of the eligible storage facility and permanent drying and handling equipment. New loan terms of seven, 10 or 12 years are available depending on the amount of the loan. Interest rates for each term rate may be different and are based on the rate which CCC borrows from the U.S. Treasury Department.
and all other Fall- seeded Small Grains,	Payments are made in two parts: a partial disbursement and the remaining final disbursement. The partial disbursement will be available after a portion of the construction has been completed. The final fund disbursement will be made when all construction is completed. The maximum amount of the partial disbursement will be 50 percent of the projected and approved total loan amount.
Perennial Forage,	Applications for FSFL must be submitted to the FSA county office that maintains the farm's records. An FSFL must be approved before any site preparation or construction can begin.
