#### **Drought Disaster Assistance**

USDA has streamlined the disaster designation process, lowered emergency loan rates and created greater CRP flexibility to help farmers and ranchers in drought-stricken areas across the country.

FSA's low-interest emergency loans will help producers recover from losses due to drought, and other natural disasters. The interest rate has been reduced to 2.25 percent, providing a much-needed resource for producers hoping to recover from production and physical losses associated with natural disasters.

USDA encourages all farmers and ranchers to contact their crop insurance companies and local USDA Farm Service Agency Service Centers, as applicable, to report damages to crops or livestock loss. In addition, USDA reminds livestock producers to keep thorough records of losses, including additional expenses for such things as food purchased due to lost supplies. # **ECP- Emergency Conservation Program**

ECP has been approved for water hauling in Lyon and Mineral Counties. Producers have until September 16th to signup. A request has been made for ECP for water hauling for Douglas, Mono and Esmeralda counties, so watch for the announcement of signups once they have been approved! Even though ECP has only been approved for Lyon and Mineral Counties, if you are hauling water in any other county, please notify the county office. If you are hauling water to livestock in areas because the existing water source has ran dry or you are moving to areas with no water to better utilize the pasture, contact your local FSA office for more information or to complete an application for the ECP program.

#### **Preventing Fraud**

The Farm Service Agency supports the Risk Management Agency in the prevention of fraud, waste and abuse of the Federal Crop Insurance Program. FSA has been, and will continue to, assist RMA and insurance providers by monitoring crop conditions throughout the growing season. FSA will continue to refer all suspected cases of fraud, waste and abuse directly

#### **NAP Losses and Deadlines**

The CCC-576, Notice of Loss, is used to report failed acreage and prevented planting and may be completed by any producer with an interest in the crop. Timely filing of a Notice of Loss is required for all crops including grasses. For losses on crops covered by the Non-Insured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) and crop insurance, you must file a CCC-576, Notice of Loss, in the FSA County Office within 15 days of the occurrence of the disaster or when losses become apparent. If filing for prevented planting, an acreage report and CCC-576 must be filed within 15 calendar days of the final planting date for the crop.

#### **Actively Engaged**

FSA wants to remind producers about the eligibility rules that require program applicants to be 'actively engaged' in farming. These eligibility rules apply to payments under the Direct and Counter-cyclical Program (DCP) or Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) program administered by FSA.

To be eligible, the stockholder or a member of a legal entity **must** normally make contributions of active personal labor and/or active personal management on the farming operation. The contributions are to be performed on regular basis, must be identifiable and separate from the contributions of others.

The exception to this rule occurs only if both of the following apply:

- -At least half of the interest in the legal entity is held by stockholders or members who are providing active personal labor or active personal management and;
- -The total direct payments received both directly and indirectly, by the legal entity and each of the members doesn't exceed \$40,000.

#### **FSA Farm Loans**

The Farm Service Agency is committed to providing family farmers with loans to meet their farm credit needs. If you are having trouble getting the credit you need for your farm, contact your nearest FSA office for details about direct and guaranteed loans. Ask your current lender about an FSA loan guarantee if you've had a setback and your current lender is reluctant to extend or renew your loan. Farm ownership loans or farm operating loans may be obtained as direct loans for a maximum of up to \$300,000. Guaranteed loans have a maximum limit of \$1,214,000. The one-time loan origination fee charged on FSA guaranteed farm ownership and operating loans is 1.5 percent of the guaranteed portion of the loan. To find out more about FSA loan programs, contact the county office staff to schedule an appointment.

#### **Beginning and Limited Resource Loans**

FSA has a program to assist beginning farmers and members of socially disadvantaged groups to finance agricultural enterprises. Under these programs, FSA can provide financing through either direct or guaranteed loans. FSA defines a beginning farmer as a person who:

- § Has operated a farm for 10 years or less
- § Will materially and substantially participate in the operation of the farm
- § Agrees to participate in a loan assessment, borrower training and financial management program sponsored by FSA
- § Does not own a farm in excess of 30 percent of the county's median size.

Each member of an entity must meet the eligibility requirements and loan approval is not guaranteed. Additional program information and loan applications are available at local FSA offices or visit www.fsa.usda.gov.

#### **Adjusted Gross Income**

USDA and the Internal Revenue Service have established an electronic information exchange process for verifying compliance with the adjusted gross income (AGI) provisions for farm programs. Written consent is required from each producer or payment recipient for the tax review process. No actual tax data will be included in the report that IRS sends to FSA. This process ensures that payments are not issued to producers whose AGI exceeds certain limits. The limits set in the 2008 Farm Bill are \$500,000 nonfarm average AGI for commodity and disaster programs; \$750,000 farm average AGI for direct payments and; \$1 million nonfarm average AGI for
