Drought Resources

NRCS Conservation Drought Assistance to California Farmers & Ranchers

Emergency Conservation Program Available in 50 Counties for Drought

Farm Service Agency (FSA) announced the Emergency Conservation Program (ECP) is available in 50 California counties as a result of the ongoing drought in the state. **Applications for ECP are being accepted through March 27, 2014.** ECP provides emergency funding and technical assistance to farmers and ranchers to rehabilitate farmland and rangeland damaged by natural disasters. Participants may receive cost-share assistance of up to 75% of the cost to implement approved emergency conservation practices. Producers must submit their requests for ECP assistance to FSA prior to beginning construction work. For more information, please see the ECP Press Release or visit your local FSA office.

Emergency Loans Authorized for California Drought in Multiple Counties

USDA has designated 54 of California's 58 counties as natural disaster areas due to drought, making them eligible for low interest Emergency (EM) Loans from Farm Service Agency (FSA). The maximum amount for an EM loan is \$500,000. For more information regarding the program, please see FSA's press release here. Drought Assistance from Rural Development

Rural Development has several programs that may help rural communities, businesses, ag producers, farm workers and others impacted by California's ongoing drought. Opportunities include \$3 million in Emergency Community Water Assistance Grants (ECWAG) to help rural communities whose water supply is at risk. Additional help is available for homeowners that need help drilling a well or connecting to a community water system, food banks that anticipate increased demand, ag producers wanting to offset ag irrigation costs, and others. Deadline Extended for Value-Added Producer Grants

The application deadline for Rural Development's Value-Added Producer Grant (VAPG) program has been extended, and the new deadline will be posted in the Federal Register soon. USDA Releases First Look at Census of Agriculture

On February 20, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) released the 2012 Census of Agriculture preliminary results providing a first look at state and national data. The report included information on farm numbers, land in farms and farmer demographics. In 2012, California's number of farms decreased to 77,864, down 4 percent from 2007. In 2012, the value of agricultural products sold totaled \$42.6 billion in California, compared to \$33.9 billion in 2007. Deadline for Conservation Innovation Grant Pre-Proposals is March 14, 2014

The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) in California has announced March 14, 2014, as the deadline to submit project pre-proposals for fiscal year 2014 Conservation Innovation Grants (CIG). CIG is a voluntary program intended to stimulate the development and adoption of innovative conservation approaches and technologies while leveraging federal

investment in environmental enhancement and protection, in conjunction with agricultural production. NRCS California is requesting CIG project pre-proposals that focus on water quality and quantity, air quality and climate change, energy conservation, waste recycling, and wildlife. Sales Closing Dates Near for Crop Insurance Programs

The USDA's Risk Management Agency (RMA) reminds producers that the sales closing dates for spring crop insurance programs are almost here. Producers should make sure to sign up, review, or change their crop policy before the date has passed. The last day to buy or change a policy for barley and wheat (in Lassen, Modoc, Shasta and Siskiyou counties), oats, mint (winter coverage option), and potatoes (in Modoc and Siskiyou counties) is **March 15, 2014**. Producers are encouraged to contact a crop insurance agent as soon as possible or you can find an agent on the RMA website at http://www.rma.usda.gov/tools/agent.html.
