PROGRAM DEADLINES

Disaster Programs:

Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP)
 – Calendar Year 2008 Losses must file notice of loss and application by Sept. 13, 2009. Jan 1 - July 12, 2009 losses must file notice of loss by Sept. 13 and application by Jan. 30, 2010. All other losses for Calendar Year 2009 must file notice of loss within 30 days after death is apparent and application by Jan 30, 2010.

County Committee Election:

August 3 – nomination period ends.
 December 7 – final date to return ballots

DCP and ACRE:

August 14 - Deadline to sign up for 2009 Direct & Counter-Cyclical Program (DCP) and Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) Program.

Commodity Loans & LDPs:

Wool & Mohair - Jan. 31
 Unshorn Pelts (LDPs) - Jan. 31
 Small Grains - March 31
 Honey - March 31
 Upland Cotton - May 31
 Feed Grains - May 31
 Soybeans/Minor Oilseeds - May 31

Acreage Certification Deadlines:

Small Grains for Grain - May 31
 Small Grains for Grazing - 15 days prior to grazing
 Small Grains for Haying - 15 days prior to haying
 Spring Seeded Crops - August 1
 CRP - August 1
 NAP - August 1 or 15 days prior to the onset of harvest or grazing for all other crops.

Emergency Loans:

Producers have eight months from the date of a disaster declaration to apply for loans to help cover production and physical losses.

Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP):

Eligible producers must apply for coverage and pay the applicable service fees by the application closing date. Must have NAP coverage on all noninsurable crops to be eligible for supplemental disaster assistance programs.

Application Closing Dates:

September 1 - aquaculture, barley, canola, Christmas trees, nursery crops, rye, spelts, triticale, turf grass sod, and wheat.

December 1 - all grasses, alfalfa, apricots, asparagus, blueberries, caneberries, cherries, clover, grapes, lespedeza, honey, mixed forage, nectarines, oats, peaches, plums, strawberries, and vetch.

January 1 - apples and pears.

March 15 - coarse grains, vegetable and melon crops, amaranth, chestnuts, cotton, pecans, pumpkins, safflower, sesame, squash, and walnuts.

◆ \$250 per crop; \$750 per county; \$1,875 per producer for all counties.

 ACRE - \$65,000 plus any Direct payment reduction.

Conservation Reserve Program: \$50,000

Emergency Conservation Program: \$200,000

Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program: \$100,000
