DCP SIGNUP EXTENDED

The **annual** sign up for the 2007 Direct and Counter-Cyclical Program (DCP) has been extended through *August 3*, 2007.

<u>APPOINTMENTS ARE STRONGLY</u> <u>ENCOURAGED</u>. After August 3rd, there is a \$100 late fee per farm.

A 22% advance of the Direct payment can be requested for any month December through September of the program year. The final portion of the Direct payment will be issued October 2007 if all eligibility requirements are met.

An advance Counter-Cyclical payment may also be requested. This would be paid in October 2007 and February 2008, with the understanding that any unearned payment would need to be refunded.

DCP contract enrollment is an annual event. Producers need to sign a new CCC-509 contract each year to participate. Contact your local County Office for an appointment!

COC ELECTION RESULTS

Timothy Hood was re-elected to the Van Buren County Committee for 2007. Tim represents Lawrence, Paw Paw, Antwerp, Decatur, and Porter Townships. No alternates were elected.

Timothy Vosburg was elected to the Kalamazoo County Committee for 2007. Tim represents Kalamazoo, Comstock, Charleston, Texas, Portage, Pavilion, and Climax Townships. Tim's alternates are Steve Gazdag and Carl Randles III.

DCP REMINDERS

*Report any farming operation changes so that we can keep your records current. This includes changes in landownership or operators.

*Farm changes that require farm reconstitutions should be reported as soon as possible so we can update your records prior to 2007 DCP sign up. Farm divisions should be considered when you do not have a firm lease. We cannot enroll a farm with changes pending, so please let us know of your changes well before your appointment to signup.

*Do you have a signed lease from the landowner? A signed rental agreement or the landowner's signature on the DCP contract is required. A cash rent certification may be used if you rented the land last year, however, an advance payment cannot be issued for the farm until July 1, 2007.

*All farmers who produce a crop on the base acres are entitled to share in the DCP payment. Landowners who do not have a risk in growing the crop are not eligible to receive a DCP payment.

*Plan to update your payment limitation documents and other program eligibility records.

HOME GARDENS

A Home Garden is an area of fruits or vegetables on a farm planted for the consumption

and home use of a producer. *Home Gardens* are limited to a maximum of 2.0 acres. Home Gardens are excluded from acreage considered as FAV. If the total garden acreage on a farm is greater than 2.0 acres, the entire garden acreage will be considered as FAV and could affect program benefits.

MEASUREMENT SERVICE FEE CHANGE

The fee for measuring things such as field acreages and grain bins has been increased to a basic farm visit fee of \$30 plus \$16 for the first hour and \$8 for every 30 minutes after the first hour. There will be a charge for a minimum of one hour. *The minimum measurement service fee will now be* \$46.00.

REPORTING CROP ACREAGES

Producers are required to report their planted crops and acres to FSA in order to maintain eligibility for several program benefits:

- Direct and Counter-Cyclical Program (DCP) payments
- Commodity Loans and Loan Deficiency Payments (LDPs)
- Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) Annual Rental Payments
- Non-insured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) Payments

The deadline to report fall-seeded small grains is July 2, 2007. The deadline to report all other crops is July 16, 2007. Please contact your local county office to schedule an appointment to report crops.

PREVENTED PLANTED AND FAILED ACRES

Prevented planting is the inability to plant the intended crop acreage with proper equipment during the established planting period for the crop type because of a natural disaster. To be considered timely, producers who request prevented planting acreage credit must report the acreage and complete a notice of loss within 15 calendar days after the final planting date.

Late-filed prevented planting acreage claims will be accepted if requests are filed at such time to permit a farm visit to verify the eligible disaster conditions which prevented the specific acreage or crop from being planted *and* give COC the opportunity to determine that eligible disaster conditions, such as damaging weather or adverse natural occurrence as opposed to other factors, prevented the planting of the acreage or crop.

Failed acreage is acreage that was timely planted with the intent to harvest, but because of disaster-related conditions, the crop failed before it could be brought to harvest. To be approved failed acreage, the acreage must have been reported as failed acreage before the disposition of the crop and the acreage must have been planted under normal conditions but failed as the result of a natural disaster and not a management decision.

PLANTING FRUITS AND VEGETABLES ON DCP ACRES

Planting fruits and vegetables (FAVs) on DCP contract acreage may adversely affect your program benefits. FAVs include, but are not limited to, green beans, dry edible beans, pumpkins, nuts, orchards, vineyards and most truck crops. Please contact your local FSA county office before your plant or lease land for FAV production to discuss acreage reporting requirements, prevention of possible violation of FAV provisions, payment reductions, and severe penalties.

NON-INSURED ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (NAP) REMINDER

A reminder to all producers who filed NAP applications for 2005: You MUST report acreage to remain eligible for the program. Also, an Application for Notice of Loss must be filed within 15 days of the weather event causing the loss, or within 15 days after it becomes evident there is a loss to the crop. Producers who sell roadside are reminded to call the office and request a pre-harvest appraisal.



2006-CROP COMMODITY LOANS AVAILABLE UNTIL MAY 31

May 31 is the deadline to request loans or LDPs on 2006-crop corn, soybeans and sunflowers. Marketing assistance loans provide producers interim financing at harvest time to meet cash flow needs without having to sell their commodities when market prices are typically at harvest-time lows. Loans mature on the last day of the ninth calendar month following the month in which the loan is approved. The current interest rate is 5.875%.

WOOL AND MOHAIR LOANS & LDPs

The 2007 crop year for wool and mohair began January 1st. Marketing Assistance Loans and Loan Deficiency Payments (LDPs) are available for 2007-crop wool and mohair. Ensure you have form CCC-633EZ on file in the County Office before you lose beneficial interest in your 2007 wool and mohair. This form is available online or in your local County Office.



LOCAL WAREHOUSES REMOVED FROM APPROVED LIST

The following locations have been terminated from the approved list for storage of price support grain loans because the warehouse operators have requested cancellation of the Uniform Grain and Rice Storage Agreement which controls the storage of Government-owned grains:



- ➤ The Andersons Agriculture Group LP, located in Albion, Michigan
- Marks Bros. & Company Inc., located in Decatur, Michigan

Any grains put into storage at these facilities will not be eligible for loans during the period these facilities are terminated from the list of warehouses approved by the Commodity Credit Corporation.

COMMODITY LOAN AND LDP SPOTCHECKING

Each month our field reporter checks different farm-stored commodity loans and Loan Deficiency Payments (LDPs) to ensure the grain is in good condition and that there is sufficient collateral to secure loans. Remember to check your grain periodically to make sure it isn't deteriorating. With the recent changes in temperature, checking your grain for moisture and hot spots is even more critical. Please contact your local FSA county office before moving any grain from the bin for any reason. If you do not obtain a release before removal or do not repay grain prior to feeding, you are in violation of your loan agreement. Remember, a quick call to the County Office is all it takes to stay in compliance.



UNAUTHORIZED DISPOSITION OF LOAN GRAIN

If loan grain has been disposed of through feeding, selling or any other form of disposal without prior written authorization from the County Office staff, it is considered unauthorized disposition. The financial penalties are severe and a producers name will be placed on a loan violation list for a two-year period. Always call the office **before** any loan grain is fed or sold.

eGOV CUSTOMER REGISTRATION PROCESS

- 1. Access your website of interest:
 - USDA Customer Statement http://customerstatement.usda.gov
 - Electronic LDP Signup http://www.fsa.usda.gov/egov/eldp_default.htm
 - Electronic DCP Signup http://www.fsa.usda.gov/egov/edcp_default.htm
- 2. Create an online user profile and apply for Level 2 access
- 3. Respond to the verification email within 7 days of receipt.
- 4. Visit the County Office in person and provide photo identification to the Local Registration Authority in order to receive Level 2 Activation.
- 5. Access Level 2 applications within 1 hour after profile has been activated.

SPECIAL ACCOMODATIONS
