### 1 Overview

### A Background

The Sorghum Promotion, Research, and Information Order (Order), or more commonly known as the Sorghum Checkoff Program, was implemented July 1, 2008, as authorized by the Commodity Promotion, Research, and Information Act of 1996 (Act) (7 U.S.C. 7411-7425), to maintain and expand existing markets and develop new markets for sorghum and sorghum products. The Act requires that the Secretary conduct a referendum among eligible sorghum producers and importers to determine whether the Order should be continued.

Eligible producers may cast a ballot at their local FSA County Office during a period beginning March 23, 2015, and ending April 21, 2015. The results of the Sorghum Checkoff Program Referendum (Referendum) will be published in an FR notice.

The AMS Administrator is responsible for conducting the Referendum. FSA is responsible for assisting AMS with the Referendum.

### **B** Purpose

This notice provides instructions to State and County Offices for carrying out FSA's responsibilities in conducting the Referendum.

# **D** State and County Office Action

State and County Offices shall assist AMS in conducting the Referendum according to paragraph 2 and Exhibits 1 through 6. AMS provided the instructions.

**Note:** The United Sorghum Checkoff Program Board (Board) will, through AMS, reimburse FSA for expenses incurred.

### 2 Action

# A Maintaining FSA's Impartiality

It is extremely important that State and County Offices follow this notice accurately and according to the dates and timeframe provided. AMS requested FSA's assistance to conduct this Referendum.

**Caution:** State and County Office employees and COC members shall use caution to ensure that FSA is **not** exhibiting bias or partiality. State and County Offices shall **not** become involved in any of the following:

- issues about the USDA regulations in 7 CFR Part 1221
- encouraging or discouraging persons from participating in the Referendum
- determining eligibility, other than in an official capacity
- prejudice for or against the Sorghum Checkoff Program.

### **B** Downloading LS-379

County Offices should obtain LS-379 (Exhibit 6) through the Internet and reproduce locally as necessary. LS-379 is available on the AMS web site at <a href="http://www.ams.usda.gov/AMSv1.0/sorghumpage">http://www.ams.usda.gov/AMSv1.0/sorghumpage</a>.

Note: LS-379 will only be available on the AMS web site beginning March 23, 2015, through April 21, 2015.

### **C** Recording Time in ARS

Employees participating in activities specific to the Referendum shall record time in ARS as "NonProgram/Other Agency Support". Program selection of AMS shall not be used by Federal employees as that program option is only to be used by employees of DACO or KCCO for a specific reimbursable agreement.

### **AMS Instructions for Conducting the Referendum**

# 1 Conducting the Referendum on the Order

### A Responsibilities

The AMS Administrator is responsible for conducting the Referendum.

FSA will assist in conducting the Referendum by doing all of the following:

- publicizing the Referendum
- accepting ballots for the Referendum from sorghum producers
- confirming eligibility of persons voting in the Referendum
- reporting Referendum results.

### **B** Purpose

These instructions:

- describe the significance of the Referendum
- establish procedures about:
  - State and County Office actions
  - eligibility
  - showing evidence an assessment was paid
  - canvassing and counting LS-379's and reporting results
  - retaining and disposing records.

### 2 Referendum Period

### A Significance of the Referendum

The Act authorizes a program of promotion, research, and information to be developed through the promulgation of the Order. The Act requires that the Secretary conduct a referendum among persons subject to assessments who, during a representative period established by the Secretary, have engaged in the production and sale of sorghum or importation of sorghum. For the Sorghum Checkoff Program to continue, it must be approved, with an affirmative vote, by at least a majority of those persons voting who were engaged in the production and sale of sorghum or importation of sorghum during the representative period.

### B Time and Place of Referendum

The Referendum will be held from **March 23, 2015**, through **April 21, 2015**, in County Offices.

# 3 Eligibility

### **A Eligibility Requirements**

The representative period for establishing eligibility for the Referendum is from January 1, 2011, through December 31, 2014. Persons who were engaged in the production and sale of sorghum or importation of sorghum and who provide documentation, such as a sales receipt or remittance form, **showing that they were engaged in the production and sale of sorghum or importation of sorghum** during the period from January 1, 2011, through December 31, 2014, are eligible to vote in the Referendum.

**Notes:** FSA-578 is **not** acceptable documentation.

If a producer raises sorghum for grazing or feed for one's own operation and no sales transaction has occurred, this producer is **not** eligible to vote.

The Act and Order define "**person**" as any individual, group of individuals, partnership, corporation, association, cooperative, or any other legal entity. The Act and Order define "**producer**" as any person engaged in the production and sale of sorghum in the United States and who owns or who shares the ownership and risk of loss of such sorghum.

The representative period is **January 1, 2011, through December 31, 2014**.

**Notes:** A group of individuals, such as any of the following, who are able to provide documentation that they were engaged in the production and sale of sorghum between January 1, 2011, and December 31, 2014, shall be entitled to cast **only** 1 vote in the Referendum:

- members of a family
- joint tenants
- tenants in common
- partnerships, general or limited
- owners of community property
- corporations.

Any individual member of a group, who is an eligible person separate from the group, may cast a vote in the Referendum separately.

**Example:** Husband and wife own operation A. Wife owns operation B. Two votes may be cast, 1 for operation A and 1 for operation B, if both operations provide **separate** supporting documentation for each operation.

# 3 Eligibility (Continued)

# B Participating in the Referendum or FSA-211

Participating in the Referendum by proxy or FSA-211 (to act for another) is **not** authorized, **except** that an authorized representative of any eligible producer entity (other than an individual person), such as a corporation or partnership, may vote in the Referendum on behalf of that entity. FSA-211 is **not** applicable since it specifically deals with FSA programs.

- An officer or authorized representative of a qualified corporation, association, or limited partnership may vote in the Referendum for that corporation, association, or limited partnership.
- A guardian, administrator, executor, or trustee of any qualified estate or trust may vote in the Referendum for that estate or trust.
- Proxy registration is **not** authorized. An individual **cannot** vote in the Referendum on behalf of another individual, such as spouse, share crop lease, etc.

**Important:** Under **no** circumstance should any person wanting to vote in the Referendum be refused.

### 4 Referendum Ballot Boxes and Obtaining LS-379's

### A Referendum Ballot Boxes

County Offices shall provide a holding box or container of sufficient size so arranged that no LS-379 can be read or removed without breaking seals on the container.

# B Obtaining LS-379's

Eligible persons may obtain LS-379 in-person, by mail, FAX, or telephone. The County Office shall mail directly to the person, at the address provided by the person, if requested by mail, FAX, or telephone. Persons may also obtain LS-379 through the Internet at <a href="http://www.ams.usda.gov/LSMarketingPrograms">http://www.ams.usda.gov/LSMarketingPrograms</a>. On the right side of the page, CLICK "Sorghum Program" and "Go to the Sorghum Referendum Page". CLICK "Form LS-379".

Note: LS-379 will only be available on the AMS web site beginning March 23, 2015, through April 21, 2015.

In-person, mail, or FAX requests **must** be for only one LS-379.

**Note:** A list of names is **not** an individual request.

### 5 Completing LS-379's

### A Overview

County Offices **must** provide all persons the opportunity to vote in the Referendum during regular work hours from **March 23, 2015**, through **April 21, 2015**.

A completed and signed LS-379 and supporting documentation **must** be returned to the County Office where the person's farm records are administratively located.

For the person **not** participating in FSA programs, the opportunity to vote in the Referendum will be provided at the County Office serving the county where the person's operation is located. If an operation is located in several counties, the voting office shall be determined based on the major portion of the operation's location. For the producer **not** participating in FSA programs, the opportunity to vote will be provided at the County Office where the person owns or rents land.

**Note:** Each person is entitled to participate 1 time.

### **B** Eligible Person Actions

Eligible persons **must**:

- complete LS-379 in its entirety
- provide **supporting documentation**, such as a sales receipt or remittance form, showing that the **person was engaged in the production or importation of sorghum** between January 1, 2011, through December 31, 2014
- sign LS-379 certifying that they were engaged in production or importation of sorghum between January 1, 2011, through December 31, 2014.

### C In-Person at the County Office

A person who obtains LS-379 in-person at the appropriate County Office may complete and return LS-379 at that time. The person **must**:

- complete and sign LS-379 in its entirety **and** attach (staple) the supporting documentation
- place LS-379 and attached supporting documentation in the ballot box.

**Note:** If a person voting in the Referendum wants the original supporting documentation returned, make a copy to attach to LS-379 and return the original supporting documentation to that person.

### 5 Completing LS-379's (Continued)

### D By Mail or FAX

Persons who return LS-379 by mail or FAX **must** complete and sign LS-379 in its entirety, and return it to the appropriate County Office along with supporting documentation.

When LS-379 is returned by mail or FAX, the County Office shall:

- date stamp LS-379 (must be received in the County Office before April 28, 2015)
- attach any supporting documentation (copies are acceptable)
- place LS-379 and supporting documentation in the ballot box.

**Note:** FSA-237 does **not** need to be on file for LS-379's returned by FAX.

### **6** Canvassing Ballots

### A Overview

The names of persons voting in the Referendum shall be **confidential** and may **not** be divulged except as the Secretary may direct.

Canvassing LS-379's shall take place on **April 29, 2015**. At least two COC members shall assist with the canvassing. If the County Office serves more than 1 county, then a COC member from each county served by the office shall assist in the canvassing.

**Exception:** STC or SED, if authorized by STC, may designate the following:

- CED and a State or County Office employee to canvass requests if it is determined that the number of LS-379's is so limited that having COC members present would be impractical
- CED and/or a State or County Office employee to canvass requests in any emergency situation precluding at least two COC members from being present to canvass the requests.

# LS-379's for the Referendum shall be canvassed according to subparagraphs B through F.

**Note:** It is the responsibility of the person to provide information needed by the County Office to determine eligibility. It is **not** the responsibility of the County Office to obtain this information.

# **6** Canvassing Ballots (Continued)

### B Valid LS-379's

FSA will consider LS-379 as being valid if LS-379 has been completed in its entirety and supporting documentation has been provided.

# C Ineligible Participants

If FSA **cannot** determine that a person is eligible based on the submitted supporting documentation, or if the person fails to submit supporting documentation, the person shall be determined to be ineligible.

### D Invalid LS-379's

An invalid LS-379 may include, but is **not** limited to, the following:

- LS-379 is not signed, completed in its entirety, or all required information has not been provided
- LS-379 and supporting documentation returned in person or by FAX was not received by COB **April 21, 2015**
- LS-379 and supporting documentation returned by mail was not postmarked by April 21, 2015
- LS-379 and supporting documentation returned **by mail** was **not** received in the County Office on or before **April 28, 2015**
- LS-379, or the supporting documentation, is mutilated or marked in such a way that any required information on LS-379 or supporting documentation is illegible
- LS-379 and supporting documentation was **not** returned to the appropriate County Office.

### **6** Canvassing Ballots (Continued)

### **E** Notification of Ineligibility

If FSA cannot determine that a person is eligible based on the submitted documentation, or if the person fails to submit the required documentation, the person shall be determined to be ineligible. FSA shall notify ineligible persons in writing as soon as practicable, but no later than **May 1, 2015**. Use the language shown in the following notification letter of ineligibility.

### Dear [challenged participant's name]:

This is to inform you that your eligibility to participate in the Referendum on the Sorghum Promotion, Research, and Information Order has been questioned.

In order for us to determine if your ballot for the Referendum is valid, you must provide us with supporting documentation showing that you were engaged in the production and sale of sorghum between January 1, 2011, and December 31, 2014.

If, within 5 business days after the postmark date of this letter, we do not receive in the County Office additional documentation supporting your eligibility to participate in the Referendum, your ballot will not be eligible to be counted.

# F Appeals

A person declared to be ineligible by FSA can appeal the decision and provide additional documentation to the County Office within 5 workdays after the postmark date of the notification letter of ineligibility according to subparagraph E. FSA will make a final decision on the person's eligibility and notify the person of the decision no later than **May 11, 2015**. Use the language shown in the following letter to notify the person of the decision. Ensure that the second paragraph reflects the decision made by FSA.

### Dear [challenged participant's name]:

This is to inform you that FSA has reviewed the documents that you provided in connection with the appeal regarding your eligibility to participate in the Referendum on the Sorghum Promotion, Research, and Information Order.

Based on your documentation, we have determined that you (meet/do not meet) the eligibility requirements. We are, therefore, (including/not including) your ballot for the Referendum among those that will be counted for the Referendum.

### 7 Additional Information

### **A Counting Ballots**

If there are **no** ineligibility determinations to resolve, LS-379's shall be counted on the same day as LS-379's are canvassed, that is **April 29, 2015**.

For County Offices that **do have** ineligibility determinations to resolve, LS-379's shall be counted **after** the ineligible determinations have been resolved, but no later than **May 11, 2015**.

LS-379 shall be counted as follows:

- number of valid ballots cast
- number of persons favoring the Order
- number of persons not favoring the Order
- number of invalid ballots.

### **B** County Office Report

County Offices shall certify and transmit the results and expenses to the State Office on the form in Exhibit 3 as soon as LS-379's are counted, but no later than **May 15, 2015**.

**Note:** Negative reports are **required**.

The results in each county may be made available to the public upon notification by the FSA Administrator that the final results have been released by the Secretary. A copy of the report shall be posted for 30 calendar days **following** the date of notification by the FSA Administrator in the County Office in a conspicuous place accessible to the public.

### C State Office Report

Each State Office shall certify and transmit the following to FSA, DAFO as soon as possible, but **no** later than **May 19, 2015**:

- results and expenses incurred by County Offices
- report summarizing the data contained in each of the reports from County Offices
- completed form in Exhibit 3 by e-mail to rick.pinkston@wdc.usda.gov
- negative reports that are **required**.

**Note:** One copy of the State summary shall be filed for a period of 1 year and available for public inspection **after** the results have been released.

# **7** Additional Information (Continued)

### D Results of the Referendum

The results of the Referendum will be issued by USDA in an official press release and published in the FR.

# **E** Disposition of Records

Each CED will place in a sealed container marked "**Sorghum Referendum**" all LS-379's, accompanying documentation, any other related material, and county summaries. The records will be placed in a secure location under CED's custody and the box marked "**Retain Until Further Notice**".

### **USDA Finalizes Procedures for Sorghum Referendum**

**WASHINGTON**, Feb. 19, 2015 – The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is announcing procedures for the upcoming referendum regarding the continuation of the Sorghum Checkoff Program and is announcing the dates it will conduct the referendum.

The Sorghum Promotion, Research, and Information Order requires that a referendum be conducted no later than seven years after the start of assessments, which began on July 1, 2008. For the program to continue, a majority of those voting must favor the continuation of the order.

USDA will conduct the referendum beginning on March 23, 2015, through April 21, 2015, at county USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) offices for producers and the Agricultural Marketing Service office for importers. Ballots may be obtained in person, by mail or facsimile at county FSA offices, or via the Internet.

Any eligible person engaged in the production or importation of sorghum from January 1, 2011, to December 31, 2014, is eligible to participate. Individuals are required to provide documentation such as a sales receipt or remittance form that shows they engaged in the production or importation of sorghum.

The Sorghum Checkoff Program, and its 13-member board, is authorized by the Commodity Promotion, Research, and Information Act of 1996. The Sorghum Checkoff is intended to be a national, coordinated, self-help marketing program designed to strengthen the position of sorghum in the marketplace, maintain and expand existing domestic and foreign markets and uses for sorghum, and develop new markets and uses for sorghum.

The final procedures were published in the Nov. 18, 2010, *Federal Register*. The notice announcing the dates of the referendum were published in the Feb. 19, 2015, *Federal Register*.

### **Questions and Answers About the Sorghum Referendum**

- **Q1.** How was the Sorghum Checkoff Program established?
- A1. The Sorghum Promotion, Research, and Information Order (Order) is authorized by the Commodity Promotion, Research, and Information Act of 1996 (Act) [7 U.S.C. 7411-7425]. The program became effective on May 7, 2008, when the Order was published. Assessments began July 1, 2008.
- **Q2.** Who administers the program?
- **A2.** The program is administered by the United Sorghum Checkoff Program Board (Board), which has 13 members representing 3 States and 4 at-large positions. Members of the Board are appointed by the Secretary of Agriculture. The Board develops budgets and contracts to carry out a coordinated program of promotion, research, consumer information, and industry information. The Board's office is located in Lubbock, Texas.
- **Q3.** What is USDA's role in the program?
- **A3.** USDA has 2 basic roles under the Act. The first role is to assist with the implementation of the Act, which includes preparing and publishing in FR rules and regulations, referendum rules, and other required documents. The second role is to oversee the program's activities conducted by the Board to ensure that they comply with the law.
- **Q4.** What is a Referendum?
- **A4.** A Referendum is an opportunity for producers and importers to say whether they would like the program to continue. If the results of the Referendum indicate that a majority of producers and importers voting in the Referendum do not favor continuation of the program, the program will be terminated. If the results of the Referendum indicate that a majority of producers and importers voting in the Referendum favor continuation of the program, the program will be continued.
- **Q5.** When and where will the Referendum be conducted?
- A5. The Referendum will be conducted March 23, 2015, through April 21, 2015, at FSA County Offices for producers. Individual producers and authorized entity representatives may participate at the FSA County Office where their entity's administrative farm records are maintained. Producers who do not participate in FSA programs can participate at the FSA County Office located in the county where the producer owns or rents land. To find your FSA County Office, contact the FSA State Office or visit

http://www.fsa.usda.gov/FSA/stateOffices?area=stoffice&subject=landing&topic=landing. The Referendum will be conducted March 23, 2015, through April 21, 2015, at the AMS Livestock, Poultry, and Seed Program office in Washington, DC for importers.

### **Questions and Answers About the Sorghum Referendum (Continued)**

- **Q6.** Who will participate in the Referendum?
- **A6.** Only those persons who are eligible to participate should vote. Participating in the Referendum is voluntary.
- **Q7.** Who is "eligible" to participate?
- A7. Producers and importers must certify that they or the entity they are authorized to represent were engaged in the production or importation of sorghum at some time between January 1, 2011, and December 31, 2014. Each producer or importer entity is entitled to only 1 request. Any group of individuals, such as families, joint tenants, a partnership, or a corporation as a producer or importer entity may only make 1 request for a referendum. However, any individual who is an eligible producer or importer separate from the group may request a referendum separately.
- **Q8.** What will I need to fill out?
- A8. To vote in the Referendum, a producer or importer will complete LS-379, Referendum on the Sorghum Promotion and Research Order Ballot, and provide supporting documentation showing that they were engaged in the production or importation of sorghum during the representative period. LS-379 may be obtained by mail, FAX, or in person from FSA County Offices or through the Internet at http://www.ams.usda.gov/AMSv1.0/sorghumpage during the Referendum period. Completed forms and supporting documentation must be returned to the appropriate FSA County Office (for producers) or AMS office (for importers) by FAX or in person no later than COB April 21, 2015; or if returned by mail, must be postmarked by midnight April 21, 2015, and received in the FSA County Office (for producers) or AMS office (for importers) by COB April 28, 2015.
- **Q9.** What will determine whether or not the Sorghum Checkoff continues?
- **A9.** If at least 50 percent of eligible producers and importers voting in the Referendum vote in favor of continuing the program, the Sorghum Checkoff will continue.
- **Q10.** When will the results be announced and how?
- **A10.** USDA will likely announce the results of the Referendum in June 2015. USDA will publish a press release and issue an FR notice announcing the results of the Referendum. The results will also be posted on the Internet at http://www.ams.usda.gov/AMSv1.0/sorghumpage.
- **Q11.** If sorghum farmers want to contact someone at USDA about the Sorghum Checkoff Referendum, who should they contact and how can they contact them?
