1 Overview

A Background

Handbook 2-CRP allows special provisions for state licensed shooting preserves with respect to hunting. A commercial shooting preserve may be operated on CRP if certain parameters are met.

B Purpose

This notice provides information on state commercial shooting preserves.

2 Commercial Shooting Preserves

A Provisions

Handbook 2-CRP, subparagraphs 276 B and C specify the commercial shooting preserve provisions. Specifically,

- the commercial shooting preserve must be licensed by the applicable state agency
- operated according to the state agency rules
- barrier fencing cannot be constructed to prohibit wildlife access to and from the CRP acreage
- mowing may occur on up to 20 percent of a field if done outside the May 1 through July 1 nesting season. Location of the mowing should be changed from year to year.

B Oklahoma Commercial Hunting Areas Rules and Regulations

Exhibit 1 provides the rules and regulations for commercial shooting preserves in Oklahoma. The rules allow hunting on commercial hunting areas year round for native and non-native wildlife species. It is required that the commercial shooting preserve be identified with signs. The rules of shooting preserves for wildlife, other than birds, require a fence to be constructed to prevent licensed wildlife from escaping and big game animals belonging to the state from entering. This fencing provision does not conform to procedure in 2-CRP, subparagraph 276 B. Therefore, the Oklahoma shooting preserve rules would eliminate utilizing CRP for wildlife other than birds.

2 Commercial Shooting Preserves (continued)

C Modification of CPO for Mowing

Participants, with commercial shooting preserves on CRP that elect to mow up to 20 percent of a field, must have the CPO revised to reflect the mowing activity. The location of mowing shall be changed from year to year. No other modification to the CPO is necessary.

D List of Commercial Hunting Areas

Exhibit 2 provides a state list of 2003 commercial hunting areas. The person applying for a commercial hunting area may elect whether or not to have their name published; therefore, areas of the list with “asterisks” are those that elected not to have their name published.

E Review and Action on List of Commercial Hunting Areas

Review the list for potential CRP participants with shooting preserves on CRP. Inform the CRP participant to provide documentation of the approved commercial hunting area for the file and spot-check purposes. Additionally, the participant shall be informed of the need to complete a CPO modification if mowing will be done and that the mowing may not occur during the primary nesting season. The participant shall be informed that wildlife, other than birds, cannot be placed on CRP under the CRP commercial shooting preserve rules, due to the state’s fencing requirement.

The county office shall take steps to identify additional participants with commercial hunting areas that are possibly not on the list or whose names were not released for public listing. These participants shall be sent the same information discussed above. Attempts shall be made through newsletters or CRP participant letters.

The CED may periodically contact the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife representative for commercial hunting areas, Dennis Maxwell, at 405-521-3719, to request an updated list of county commercial hunting areas.

3 Recreational Hunting

A Recreational Hunting vs. Commercial Shooting Preserves

All hunting can be termed “recreational.” However, 2-CRP, par. 276, distinguishes between hunting on a state-approved commercial shooting preserve (commercial hunting area) and on land that has no special use permit on it which is termed “recreational hunting.” Recreational hunting and hunting on a commercial shooting preserve have different rules that may apply. Subparagraph 2 has outlined the specifics for hunting and having a commercial shooting preserve on CRP.

3 Recreational Hunting (continued)

A Recreational Hunting vs. Commercial Shooting Preserves (continued)

Recreational hunting allows participants to lease hunting rights or assess fees for hunting during the normal hunting season for pursuit of game normal to the area. The recreational hunting must be conducted consistent with state law and any limits for the appropriate game specie. Hunting is not allowed during the primary nesting season of May 1 through July 1. Mowing, mowing hunting lanes, or manicuring the acreage for recreational hunting is not allowed.

B Publicity

Counties shall continue to keep producers informed on CRP recreational hunting and commercial shooting preserve provisions on CRP through all available means.

COMMERCIAL HUNTING AREAS

According to our rules. Commercial Hunting Areas shall have year round open season and bag limit on the harvest of any legally acquired wildlife or domestic animal harvested for sport. The following are requirements that you, the operator of the area, must operate under:

- (1) An wildlife must be tagged with tags available from the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation before being transported from the commercial hunting area [29 O.S., Sections 5-101 through 5-103]. These tags are the types of leg bans that the Department sells for attachment onto quail, pheasant, etc. As of present, the Department does not sell bands, or tags, for deer, elk, etc.
- (2) Any elk, mule deer, whitetail deer, pronghorn antelope or turkey must be tagged or otherwise permanently marked with appropriate commercial tags prior to the release and harvest of such animals, however this tagging requirement does not apply to wildlife harvested during regular hunting season for that specific area of the state. These tags are to be on the live animals before they are harvested by the hunter. These are to be on the animal to differentiate them from wild deer, elk, etc., so that the wild animals will not be shot out of regular seasons for those types of animals.
- (3) Licensee must sign a written invoice, which shall accompany such wildlife to final destination. These invoices shall be evidence of rightful possession and ownership for a period of twenty days from the date of said invoice. A copy of such invoices must be permanently kept for at least one year from date of expiration of license by the commercial propagator and must also include whether the birds were shipped alive or dead. Such invoice should contain the following:
 - (1) The propagator's permit number.
 - (2) The kind and number of each species killed, sold, given away, transported or shipped.
 - (3) The name and address of the recipient.
 - (4) The date received from licensee.

This invoice is to be given to the hunter before he leaves the area as a receipt of the animals that he has taken.

The following are the requirements that the hunter must follow in order to harvest an animal on a Commercial Hunting Area:

- (a) If a person is going to hunt any of wildlife licensed on the specific Commercial Hunting Area, including small game animals, such as quail, pheasants, chuckars, etc., they will need a hunting license. If they are a resident they can hunt these animals with a Resident Hunting License, a lifetime hunting (or combination) license, a Five dollar (\$5.00) Commercial hunting Area ten-day license, or if they are exempt from a resident hunting license they will not have to have a hunting license on the Commercial Hunting Area. If they are a non-resident and want to hunt any type of small game or wildlife other than elk, whitetail or mule deer they can buy the Five Dollar (\$5.00) Commercial Hunting Area ten-day license, or a non-resident annual hunting license, which is ninety two dollars and fifty cents (\$92.50). If they are a non-resident and want to hunt any wildlife other than elk, deer, turkey or pheasant, they may purchase a non-resident 5-day hunting license for forty two dollars and fifty cents (\$42.50). If the hunters purchase any of the above licenses, other than the Commercial hunting areas ten-day license, they can use them to hunt in Oklahoma on areas other than commercial hunting areas.
- (b) If a person is going to hunt specific types of animal, such as elk, whitetail or mule deer, pronghorn, antelope, or turkey, they may need to have additional licenses.
- (c) For a person, either resident or non-resident, who wants to hunt turkeys they will need, in addition to the appropriate hunting license listed above, the Turkey license, which is seven dollars and seventy-five cents (\$7.75) for each turkey taken.
- (d) If the hunter, either a resident or a non-resident who has moved from Oklahoma to another state, has a lifetime hunting or lifetime combination license, these licenses will enable the hunter to be exempt from a hunting license and any deer permit or elk permit.
- (e) For a resident without a lifetime hunting or lifetime combination license to hunt elk, they will need a hunting license listed above in (a) and will also need a Resident Elk permit, which is fifty one dollars (\$51.00) for each elk taken. For a resident without a lifetime hunting or lifetime combination license to hunt whitetail or mule deer, they will need a hunting license listed above in (a) and will also need a resident deer license, either archery, primitive or gun, which are twenty dollars (\$20.00) for each deer taken. If the hunter is exempt from the appropriate deer license during the appropriate regular deer season, either archery, primitive or gun then they would be exempt from the purchase of the deer license. There are no exceptions for an elk permit, other than the exemptions covered under (d) that lifetime hunting or lifetime combination is afforded.
- (f) For a non-resident to hunt elk they will not need a hunting license listed above but will need a non-resident elk permit which is three hundred and one dollars (~~\$301.00~~) for each elk taken. For a non-resident to hunt whitetail or mule deer they will not need a hunting license listed above in (a), but will need a non-resident deer license, either archery, primitive, or gun which are two hundred and one dollars (\$201.00) for each deer taken. There is also a non-resident combined deer permits available for each season for two hundred and fifty dollars (\$251.00), which allows the hunter to harvest one antlerless and one antlerless deer. There are no exceptions for deer or elk permits for non-residents, other than the exceptions covered under (d) that lifetime hunting or lifetime combination license is afforded.
- (g) To purchase a non-resident or resident elk permit they will need to get those from either our Oklahoma City office license section, from the Manning Hatchery at Medicine Park or you, the operator of the Commercial hunting Area may now purchase resident or non-resident elk permits and issue the permits to the appropriate hunters. If they are going to hunt elk during a time other than the Private Land Elk hunt it will be less confusing to the personnel at the Manning Hatchery if the hunters purchase the elk permits at the Oklahoma City office or through the Commercial hunting Area. When they purchase the permit they will need to have written permission from the commercial hunting area licensee, the same as a Private Land elk licensee would need.

800:25-13-1. Purpose

This Subchapter establishes requirements for residents of Oklahoma to have a Commercial Hunting Area License.

800:25-13-2. Statutory citations

Citations to statutes in this Subchapter refer to the most recent codification of the statute.

800:25-13-3. General provisions

- (a) No person may propagate or hold in captivity any wildlife or domesticated animals hunted for sport for commercial hunting area purposes without having procured a Commercial Hunting Area license for such from the Director.
- (b) The area to be hunted must be inspected and approved by Department personnel before a license is issued.
- (c) Commercial Hunting Areas shall have year round open season and bag limit on the harvest of any legally acquired wildlife or domestic animal harvested for sport, except:

(1) no person may:

(A) Kill or attempt to kill, injure or attempt to injure any cat or bear that can grow to a weight of fifty pounds or more that is:

(i) In captivity in this state; or

(ii) Released from captivity in this state for the purpose of being killed; or

(B) Conduct, promote, assist, or advertise an activity prohibited by this section, and

(2) no person may:

(A) Sell or offer for sale, transport or consign for transportation in this state, including interstate commerce in this state, a cat or bear that can grow to a weight of fifty pounds or more that is to be used for controlled killing prohibited under this section; or

(B) Sell or offer for sale a part of a product made from a cat or bear that can grow to a weight of fifty pounds or more that is used or is to be used in a controlled kill prohibited under this section.

800:25-13-6. Facility requirements

The facility requirements on a Commercial Hunting Area for wildlife are as follows:

(1) **Birds only.** The minimum requirement for fencing a bird area is a four strand barb wire fence.

(2) **Wildlife other than birds hunted for sport.** The minimum requirements for wildlife is at least eight foot of welded or woven wire or cyclone fence and the top two feet of the eight foot fence can be barbed wire, and must be fenced in a way to prevent licensed wildlife from escaping and big game animals belonging to the state from entering and be capable of retaining animals within the specified area, or other similar or suitable approved fence.

- (3) **Type of signs.** The type of signs to be used on a Commercial Hunting Area must be metal signs, of other weather-proof material and these signs must be posted at all corners and entrances and along the boundary at 220 yard intervals.
- (4) **Size of signs.** The size of signs to be used on a Commercial Hunting Area should be 24" x 12" and the signs must be placed inside and outside on boundary lines.
- (5) **Wording of signs.** The signs on a Commercial Hunting Area must contain the wording, "Commercial Hunting Area Licensed by Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation".
- (6) **Final Enclosure.** Prior to final enclosure of areas for the hunting of wildlife other than birds a drive must be made throughout the area in the presence of designated Department employees to make a reasonable effort to ensure that any wild whitetail or mule deer, elk, antelope, or other big game, are not present on the area. No wild whitetail or mule deer, elk, antelope, or other big game are to be reintroduced into the area after the final enclosure.
- (7) **Inspection.** The Commercial Hunting Area to be hunted must be inspected and approved by personnel of the Department and all records, and facilities, of such areas shall be available for inspection at all reasonable times by authorized representatives of the Department, and/or authorized representatives of the Department of Agriculture. The Department of Agriculture may request blood and/or meat samples be collected from all deer and elk killed and sent to their Department.

800:25-13-9. Tagging requirements

- (a) All wildlife must be tagged with tags available from the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation before being transported from the commercial hunting area [29 O.S., Sections 5-101 through 5-103].
- (b) Any elk, mule deer, whitetail deer, pronghorn antelope or turkey must be tagged or otherwise permanently marked with appropriate commercial tags prior to the release and harvest of such animals. However, this tagging requirement does not apply to any elk, mule deer, whitetail deer, pronghorn antelope or turkey harvested during the appropriate regular hunting seasons for such animals for that specific area of the state. After the third consecutive year of being licensed for such animals and inspection by a designated Department employee that wild elk, deer, or antelope are not gaining access to the Commercial Hunting Area the tagging of the licensed elk, deer, or antelope before harvest will not be mandatory.
- (c) Licensee must sign a written invoice which shall accompany such wildlife to final destination. These invoices shall be evidence of rightful possession and ownership for a period of twenty days from the date of said invoice. A copy of such invoices must be permanently kept for at least one year from date of expiration of license by the commercial propagator and must also include whether the birds were shipped alive or dead. Such invoice should contain the following:
- (1) The propagator's permit number.
 - (2) The kind and number of each species killed, sold, given away, transported or shipped.
 - (3) The name and address of the recipient.
 - (4) The date received from licensee.

WILDLIFE LAWS of OKLAHOMA**OKLAHOMA STATUE 4-106****COMMERCIAL HUNTING AREA LICENSE**

A. No person may propagate or hold in captivity any wildlife or domesticated animals hunted for sport for commercial hunting area purposes without having procured a license for such from the Director. Licenses shall be classified as big game, upland game, or a combination of big game and upland game.

1. A big game license shall be required for legally acquired exotic ungulates, domesticated animals so designated by the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission, exotic swine, and legally acquired whitetail and mule deer, turkey and other species of big game lawfully taken under the provisions of subsection A of Section 5-411 and Section 5-401 of this title. Wildlife that has been crossbred with exotic wildlife shall be considered native and not exotic unless documentation shows otherwise.

2. An upland game license shall be required for legally acquired captive raised pheasants, all species of quail, Indian chukars, waterfowl, and other similar or suitable gallinaceous birds; and shall include turkey if no other big game species are listed on the license or application.

B. Before obtaining such license or a renewal of such license the applicant shall:

1. Submit proof that such wildlife or domesticated animals hunted for sport will be or have been secured from a source other than the wild stock in this state. Any person obtaining or renewing such license shall submit a true and complete inventory of said animals before such license shall be approved;

2. Such license shall specifically list the different species and/or subspecies to be hunted on the listed hunting area or premises; and

3. Submit proof of being an Oklahoma resident.

C. Any game warden of the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation shall have authority to inspect any and all records and invoices pertaining to the commercial hunting operations of any person licensed or requesting licensure pursuant to this section and additionally shall have the authority to inspect any and all facilities, equipment and property connected to the hunting operation of any person licensed or requesting licensure pursuant to this section.

D. 1. The annual fee for a commercial Hunting Area license for **Upland Game** under this section shall be One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

2. The annual fee for a Commercial Hunting Area license for **Big Game or Combination of Big Game and Upland Game** pursuant to this section shall be Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

E. Exemptions from this license requirement shall be operators of running pens used for the performance test or training of dogs. Operators of such running pens may acquire coyotes from wild stock without having to possess a fur dealer's license for such purpose and no license shall be required of those involved in performance testing or training dogs in such running pens so long as no other wildlife are taken or hunted in any manner.

F. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed sixty (60) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

G. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall have his license revoked. No new license shall be issued for a period of six (6) months from and after the date on which the revocation order becomes effective.

H. The Department is authorized to promulgate rules pertaining to commercial hunting areas.

Title 29 O.S. Sections 5-101 through 5-103**5-101. Hunting propagated wildlife or domesticated animals; sale or gift; transportation; invoices; records**

A. Except as otherwise provided for in this title, commercial hunting areas are subject to neither season or bag limit. Holders of commercial hunting area licenses may permit properly licensed persons to hunt, use, give away, sell, transport, trap or kill, within the confines of the commercial hunting area, any propagated wildlife or domesticated animals hunted for sport.

3 (commhunt.statutes effective December, 1992)

B. If said wildlife or domesticated animals or parts thereof are shipped or transported from the confines of the commercial hunting area, the commercial hunting area license holder or his lawfully appointed agent shall sign a written invoice which shall accompany such wildlife or domesticated animal to its final destination. Such invoice list:

1. The propagator's permit number;
2. The kind and number of each species killed, sold, given away, transported or shipped;
3. The name and address of the recipient; and
4. The date received from licensee;

and shall state that he has fully complied with the provisions of this section.

C. These invoices shall be evidence of rightful possession and ownership of lawfully taken wildlife.

D. A copy of such invoices must be permanently kept for at least three (3) years from date of expiration of license by the commercial propagator and must also include whether the wildlife was shipped alive or dead.

E. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of the section shall be punished by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed sixty (60) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

5-102. Tagging wildlife or domesticated animals hunted for sport to be removed from commercial hunting areas.

A. No person may remove any propagated or released wildlife or domesticated animals hunted for sport which are killed at a commercial hunting area, without attaching a tag to each of such killed wildlife or domesticated animals hunted for sport.

B. The tags, supplied by the Commission at reasonable cost, shall contain such information as the Commissions may require and shall be numbered consecutively.

C. Such tag must remain attached to the individual wildlife or domesticated animals hunted for sport until prepared and consumed and shall not be used more than once.

D. Any person convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed sixty (60) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

5-103. Liberation of propagated and other birds.

All wildlife or domesticated animals hunted for sport commercially propagated or transported into this state may be liberated into the wild subject to rules and regulations of the Commission.

Section 5-411

A. 1. No person, including but not limited to persons licensed for commercial hunting or wildlife breeders, may hunt, chase, capture, shoot, shoot at, wound, attempt to take or take, attempt to kill or kill, or slaughter an antelope, moose, whitetail or mule deer, bear, elk, mountain lion, rocky mountain bighorn sheep, wild turkey, or any subspecies except in open season under Section 5-401 of this Code.

2. No person shall sell, offer for sale or buy or offer to buy an antelope, moose, whitetail or mule deer, bear, elk, mountain lion, rocky mountain bighorn sheep, wild turkey or any parts thereof, except as otherwise provided by rules and regulations prescribed by the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission or by law.

3. The provisions of this subsection shall not be construed to prevent a hide from a legally taken deer to be sold or traded by a person who legally harvested or legally possesses a deer hide.


B. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to have in his possession any meat, head, hide or any part of the carcass of any wildlife not legally taken.

2. Any meat, head, hide or any part of the carcass of any wildlife not legally taken shall be subject to immediate seizure by a game warden.

3. Provided, the provisions of this subsection shall not apply to privately owned, domesticated animals so designated by the Oklahoma Wildlife Conservation Commission.

C. Persons excepted from the above are:

1. Department employees when in the performance of their duties.
2. Authorized agents when appointed under Section 3-202 of this title.
