Section 9 allows Georgia to use indemnity funds already provided for cotton producers and ginnerers that suffered losses due to the failure of a warehouse.

Section 10 increases loan deficiency payments and marketing loan gains for 2001 crops to \$150,000.

Section 11 requires that all funding be expended by September 30, 2001. If MLA payments exceed \$5.5 billion, the Secretary must reduce payments on a pro rata basis to ensure that payments do not exceed the \$5.5 billion limitation.
