PART 1945 - EMERGENCY

Subpart D - Emergency Loan Policies, Procedures and Authorizations

Section 1945.151 - Introduction

- (a) Policy. This Instruction supplements FmHA Instruction 1945-D and prescribes the procedures for making Farm Loan Programs direct Emergency (EM) loans.
- (1) Exhibit A of the Instruction supplements the requirement for specifying the average production figures for major agricultural commodities in the State of Oregon, by County, for the past 5 years. The information for some of the commodities was obtained from the Oregon State University Extension Service Agricultural and Resource Economic Office.
 - (2) Exhibit B of this Instruction supplements the requirement for specifying the average State price for major agricultural commodities in the State of Oregon and the price for the forage equivalent commodity as described by Exhibit C of this Instruction. The information for some of the commodities was obtained from the National Agricultural Statistic Service (NASS) report, "Agricultural Prices." All other commodity prices were obtained from the NASS report, "Crop Summary Value," and the Oregon State University Extension Service Agricultural Resource Economics Office.
 - (3) Exhibit C of this Instruction supplements the requirement for specifying the average State Forage yield for those forage commodities which are not published in Exhibit A of this Instruction. The information for some of the commodities was obtained from the National Agricultural Statistic Service (NASS) report, "Agricultural Prices." All other commodity prices were obtained from the NASS report, "Crop Summary Value," and the Oregon State University Extension Service Agricultural Resource Economics Office.
- (b) Program Administration. Unless otherwise prohibited, authority delegated to the State Director by FmHA Instruction 1945-D is hereby redelegated to the following State Office employees: Farm Loan Chief and Farm Loan Specialists.

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Section 1945.163 (a) - Production Losses

When determining the actual loss incurred and obtaining the gross value of a normal year's production for those commodities that suffered a loss due to the disaster, the Farm Loan Managers, Farm Loan Officers, and the County Executive Directors should use Exhibit A of this Instruction. The average production yields in Exhibit A will be used for those commodities and those years when the applicant's reliable farm records or the FSA "actual" or "established" yields are not available. However, the production yields in exhibit A may be combined with the actual yields obtained from the applicant's farmer records when FSA "established" yields are not available.

Section 1945.163 (a)(2)(iv) - Gross Dollar Value of Production Losses

The gross dollar value of production losses will be calculated for all crops and livestock enterprises, which were a part of any single enterprise that suffered losses due to the disaster. The unit price for those commodities that incurred a loss will be obtained from Exhibit B of this Instruction when determining the value of the normal year's production.

Section 1945.163 (a)(2)(xi) - Loss Calculations for Hayland, Pasture and Rangeland

For Counties Josephine, Jackson, Klamath, Deschutes, Jefferson, Wasco and Hood River and East of these counties, we will use the following method:

When calculating the actual production loss for hayland, pasture, and rangeland used for grazing livestock, the "Charge Per Head or Animal Unit Method" as described by FmHA Instruction 1945-D, Section 1945.163 (a)(2)(xi)(B) will be used. The established rental charge per animal unit per month will be the amount as provided by Exhibit B of this Instruction described as "**Grazing Fee.**"

For Counties West of Josephine, Jackson, Klamath, Deschutes, Jefferson, Wasco and Hood river will use the following method:

When calculating the actual production loss for hayland, pasture and rangeland used for grazing livestock, the "Forage Equivalent as described by FmHA Instruction 1945-D, Section 1945.163 (a)(2)(xi)(C) will be used. For the purposes of the calculation for the following described forage commodities the established State Price published in Exhibit B of this Instruction will be used:

CORN, SILAGE

HAY, SILAGE

OTHER HAY

The Forage Equivalent values produced will be the County average yield for the forage commodities listed above described in Exhibit A of this Instruction for the County the production loss has been incurred. If there is not a County Yield described in Exhibit B for the County then the State Average Yield described in Exhibit C of this Instruction for the forage commodity will be used.
