Gary Six State Executive Director, Texas

Gary Six was appointed by the Trump Administration to serve as the state executive director of the Texas USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) in November 2017.

Prior to his appointment, Six served as county executive director (CED) in Yoakum County, Texas, for 32 years.

His USDA career began in 1977, when he worked as a temporary field man for the Randall County, Texas, FSA office while in college. Six completed the County Operations Trainee (COT) program in 1978 and became a CED. Between CED assignments, he also served for three years as one of the agency's first automation coordinators.

Six has served as president of the Texas Association of State and County Office Employees (TASCOE), McCulloch County Chamber of Commerce and the Yoakum County Livestock Association. He also served on the McCulloch County Livestock Association, and was a member of the Plains Independent School Board.

Six's career accomplishments were built on a strong foundation in education. He earned a degree in education from West Texas State University, now known as West Texas A&M University.

Six is a native of Plains, Texas. He and his wife, Kathy, now reside in the College Station area.
