#### **Overview of CRP**

#### Conservation Reserve Program

- Land conservation program
- Goal of the program is to re-establish valuable land cover to help improve water quality, prevent soil erosion, and reduce loss of wildlife habitat.
- Contracts for land enrolled in CRP are 10-15 years in length.





#### **Benefits of CRP**

Enroll partial or entire fields/farms at a time.

There are three areas in which we see CRP as beneficial.

- Money steady income, less productive land becomes valuable.
- Wildlife improves habitats, attracts wildlife species, and increases pollinator habitat
- Resources Reduce soil erosion, increase soil health, and protects air and water quality

## What is General CRP sign-up?

- Competitive offer process
- During a selected period of time
- Annual sign-up
- Producer offer is ranked against other offers nationally using an Environmental Benefits Index (EBI - will discuss later)
- Only offers ranked high enough using EBI will be accepted for enrollment.





#### **Interested in General CRP?**

#### **Land Eligibility for General CRP:**

- Erodibility have a weighted average Erodibility Index (EI) of 8 or greater.
  - FSA office determines this.
- Expiring CRP be currently enrolled in CRP in the last year of the contract set to expire on 9/30/2020 of the current FY.
- Conservation Priority Area's (CPA's) be located within an approved National or State CPA.
  - FSA office can tell you if your land is in CPA.





# **Cropping History**

# Eligible cropland, must include cropland that includes both of the following:

Planted or considered planted to an agricultural commodity during 4 of the 6 crop years from 2012 through 2017

Physically and legally capable of being planted in a **normal manner** to an agricultural commodity as determined by the COC.





#### **Working with Land Owners**

- What could be indicators of possible eligibility?
  - My land is in a watershed.
  - My land is on a slope.
  - There's a whole field that create dusty winds.








# **Land Eligibility**

# Met the Land Eligibility, what next?

#### **Producer Eligibility for General CRP**

- Owned the land for 12 months before:
  - the close of signup for general CRP signup (February 28, 2020).
  - Ask about waivers.

 Meet other eligibility qualifications such as AGI and payment limitations.





## **Environmental Benefits Index (EBI)**

- Wildlife habitat benefits resulting from covers on act acres (N1);
   10 to 100 points
- Water quality benefits from reduced erosion, runoff and leaching (N2); 0 to 100 points
- On-farm benefits from reduced erosion (N3); 0 to 100 points
- Benefits that will likely endure beyond the contract period (N4); 0
   to 50 points
- Air quality benefits from reduced wind erosion (N5) 3 to 45 points and;
- Cost (N6) varies.

# **Producer Choices that Affect EBI**

- Rental Rate Adjustments
- Cover and Species Mix
- Enhancements provided







# How long will it take to sign-up?

- The sooner the better.
- It depends on timeline.
- When making your appointment with FSA, tell them your history.
- It may take time to determine CRP Plan.





## **Getting the Records Correct**

# Come to your Local FSA Office with: **Proof of ownership**

- Copy of recorded deed or lease
- Land purchase contract or Rental Agreement
- Share crop contract
- FSA employee check of assessors records
- Certification of an heir (needs to be accompanied by will)






# How will you know if you're approved?

All producers that submitted an offer will get a letter.

They will be notified if their offer was accepted/rejected.







## Once approved, what next?

- Contact NRCS to develop conservation plans.
- Meet Deadlines each program has it's own requirements.
- Reimbursements cost share options and bills management.





## Be aware, start planning.

General CRP deadline is February 28th.

Schedule their appointment with local FSA staff ASAP.

It's best to begin working with FSA as soon as possible to build out a plan and submit your CRP offer.
