Plan

A solid business plan is a necessary next step. You will need to develop strategy, create a budget, analyze costs of production, and evaluate feasibility under different economic environments.

Land

No matter the size and scope of your operation, land is a critical component to any farm. Finding farmland can be challenging, but there are many resources to make the process easier.

MDA Farmlink

FarmLink is a free, online program that helps connect retiring farmers and new farmers, buyers and sellers, renters and landlords, and employers and employees. Users can list and research farms and farmland for rent or sale, and much more.

Farmland Clearinghouse

This Land Stewardship Project resource connects beginning farmers looking to rent or purchase farmland with established farmers/landowners who are seeking a beginning farmer to purchase or rent their land in the Midwest.

Farm Land Access Hub

The Farmland Access Hub is a consortium of partners including non-profits, government agencies, local companies, and private citizens dedicated to assisting beginning farmers with their quest for land tenure. By bringing together this large group we can make a greater impact on land tenure in Iowa, Minnesota, and Wisconsin by: pooling resources and knowledge, identify beginning farmers in need of assistance, providing financial and technical resources, to aid in a search for land tenure, and search and discovery of suitable farmland.

Cropland Grazing Exchange

The Cropland Grazing Exchange (CGE) matches livestock farmers with crop farmers who have forage (crop residues, cover crops, etc.) to harvest. The CGE is an interactive map that shows the locations of farmers who have livestock to graze and farmers who have cropland they want grazed.

• USDA Inventoried Properties

This website lists available FSA inventory of farmland property for purchase. Beginning farmers and ranchers have first priority to purchase these properties at the appraised value.



Fund

Operate

With your business plan officially in motion you can focus energy on optimization. You will need to be monitoring your balance sheet, evaluating earnings, and utilizing risk management strategy.

USDA Rural Development (RD)

RD offers over fifty financial assistance programs for a variety of rural applications including, but not limited to, value-added producer grants and loans and grants for rural renewable energy systems to increase efficiency.

• Livestock Risk Protection (LRP) Calculator

Livestock producers can use this calculator to gauge what it would look like if they purchased different combinations of LRP at different times of the year, over the past few years and can compare it to their own operation from that year to determine if LRP would be beneficial. The calculator also helps make decisions about LRP in the future.

Farm Answers

Farm Answers is the USDA-NIFA beginning farmer and rancher clearinghouse, providing resources to help you get started farming, as well as tools to help more seasoned producers succeed.

• Beginning Farmer Tax Credit

The Minnesota Beginning Farmer Tax Credit provides state tax credits to landlords and sellers (asset owners) who rent or sell farmland, equipment, livestock, and other agricultural assets to beginning farmers in the current tax year. Funding is limited. Tax credits are funded in a first-come, first-served manner regardless of the deadlines. Applicants are highly encouraged to apply early in the year and may apply before sales close, if needed.
