Adjusted Gross Income Form CCC-941

Average Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) Certification and Consent to Disclosure of Tax Information must be completed and submitted for everyone receiving payment directly or indirectly. If IRS verification indicates historical AGI exceeds \$900,000, documentation will be required.

Acreage Certification Deadlines

Perennial Grasses, alfalfa - November 15

Fall Seeded Small Grains and Canola - January 16

Small Grains for Grazing - Earlier of 15 days prior to grazing (NAP) or January 16

Peaches - January 16

Pecans - March 15

Spring Oats and Potatoes - May 15

CRP, Spring Seeded & other crops - July 16

NAP - July 16 or 15 days prior to the onset of harvest or grazing for all other crops

Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP)

Eligible producers must apply for coverage and pay the applicable service fee by the application closing date. Application closing dates include:

January 31 – various early planted fruit & vegetable crops

March 15 – summer and fall harvested crops as well as warm season grasses intended for summer grazing

May 1 – ornamental nursery

August 31 – alfalfa, aquaculture, canola, Christmas trees, turfgrass sod, cool season grasses intended for fall or next spring early grazing, & all small grain crops for grazing or hay

September 30 – greens & most perennial fruit crops

November 30 – asparagus, hay crops (except small grains), honey, & pecans

NAP Service Fees: \$250/crop; \$750/county; \$1,875/producer for all counties.

Premium of 5.25% of liability is applicable for coverage in excess of 50/55.

Fee waivers and 50% premium reduction is available for qualified Socially Disadvantaged, Limited Resource, and Beginning Farmers.

Conservation Programs

Conservation Reserve Program (CRP): Watch for local announcement of sign up period.

Continuous Conservation Reserve Program (CCRP): Applications received on an ongoing basis for application of Environmental priority practices.

Continuous Conservation Reserve Program-Grasslands: Allows pastureland to be enrolled in a 15 year contract to protect from conversion and maintain conservation benefits. Applications may be submitted anytime. Annual rental rates range \$15 - \$21 per acre.

Emergency Conservation Program (ECP): Provides assistance to repair farmland damaged by Natural disaster (tornado, flood, ice, wildfire, drought, etc) Report damage when it occurs. Watch for local announcement of a sign up period for assistance.

Tree Assistance Program (TAP): Provides financial assistance to qualifying orchardist and nursery tree growers to replant or rehabilitate eligible trees, bushes and vines damaged by natural disaster. Apply for TAP and provide supporting documentation within 90 calendar days of each disaster event or the date when the loss is apparent.

Transition Incentive Program (TIP) for expiring CRP contracts: Allows a retired or retiring producer with an expiring CRP contract to sell or long lease (5-years minimum) the land to a beginning farmer, veteran farmer or socially disadvantaged farmer and retain CRP annual payments for an additional two years. A TIP application (CRP-1R) must be filed before the land sell or lease.

Livestock Disaster Programs

Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP): Compensates eligible livestock producers for grazing losses due to drought, or fire on federal lands.

Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP): Compensates eligible livestock producers for livestock death losses in excess of normal mortality due to adverse weather and attacks by animals reintroduced into the wild by the federal government or protected by federal law.

Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honeybees, and Farm-Raised Fish Program (ELAP): Provides emergency assistance to eligible producers of livestock, honeybees and farm-raised fish for losses due to disease, adverse weather, or other conditions, such as wildfires.
