WEEKLY NATIONAL MARKET PRICE FOR WOOL AND MOHAIR

Washington, March 13, 2012 - The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Commodity Credit Corporation today announced the national posted prices for wool and mohair. The effective repayment rate is the lower of either the 30-day average or weekly rate.
