**Amendment Transmittal**

**A Overview**

The Agricultural Act of 2014 authorizes FSA to provide additional assistance coverage under NAP to eligible producers of 2012 fruit crops grown on a bush or tree that have experienced losses in a county for which a Secretarial disaster designation was issued because of frost or freeze, including contiguous counties.

**B Reasons for Amendment**

Part 15 has been added to provide policy and procedure for administering the 2012 NAP Frost Freeze (NAPFF) Program.

Exhibit 76 has been added to provide a list of 2012 frost and freeze Secretarial designations.

**1781 Reports**

**A Overview**

Several standard reports are available to use as tools within the Application for Payment system. To access reports, CLICK “Reports” from the Main Menu.

**\*--Part 15 2012 NAP Frost Freeze Program****1800 General Information and Administrative Provisions for NAPFF****A Purpose**

This part provides policy and procedure for the administration of the NAPFF program.

**B Source of Authority**

The Agricultural Act of 2014, Section 12305 (1) (3) authorizes the NAPFF program.

**C NAPFF Assistance**

NAPFF provides additional assistance coverage under NAP to eligible producers of **2012 fruit crops grown on a bush or tree** that have experienced losses in a county for which a Secretarial disaster designation was issued because of frost or freeze, including contiguous counties. Producers are **not** required to have previously purchased 2012 NAP coverage to be eligible for this additional assistance coverage; however, producers who did **not** previously purchase 2012 NAP coverage for a NAPFF-eligible crop **must** pay the applicable administrative service fee to receive NAPFF assistance.

**D Additional Coverage Levels**

The Agricultural Act of 2014 authorizes FSA to retroactively apply additional levels of NAP assistance coverage that requires payment of a premium in addition to the NAP service fee. Payments for the additional level of assistance will be calculated based on:

- 50 percent of the approved yield, and 100 percent of the average market price
- 55 percent of the approved yield, and 100 percent of the average market price
- 60 percent of the approved yield, and 100 percent of the average market price
- 65 percent of the approved yield, and 100 percent of the average market price.--\*

\*--1800 General Information and Administrative Provisions for NAPFF (Continued)

**D Additional Coverage Levels (Continued)**

Producers are **not** required to select their additional coverage level at the time of application. NAPFF payments will be automatically calculated using the 65/100 coverage level. The coverage level may be selected when:

- requested by the producer
- it is expected that the applicable payment limitation of \$125,000 will be reached
- as determined to be in the best interest of the producer.

**Example:** Greg timely purchased 2012 NAP coverage and suffered 100 percent loss on 140 acres of sweet cherries because of frost and freezing temperatures. Greg’s 2012 NAP payment was capped at the \$100,000 payment limitation for basic NAP 50/55 coverage. Greg applied for NAPFF and his 2012 NAP payment will be recalculated using 100 percent of the average market price, and is expected to reach the payment limitation of \$125,000 without increasing the approved yield coverage level of 50 percent. As such, 50/100 coverage level is the most beneficial based on Greg’s known losses and amount of the applicable premium.

All acreage and production of a pay group is summarized for loss calculation purposes; therefore, only 1 coverage level is applied by crop definition as defined in paragraph 170. NAPFF 2012 eligible crop groups are listed in subparagraph I.

The following is an example of acreage and production of a pay group summarized for loss calculation purposes.

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**\*--1800 General Information and Administrative Provisions for NAPFF (Continued)****E Applicability**

Unless specified in this part, procedure in this handbook remains applicable for administering NAPFF.

County Office staff administering NAPFF **must** review the following NAP policy and procedure before NAPFF signup:

- paragraph 27, Quality Losses
- paragraph 35, Multiple Benefits
- paragraph 174, Handling Crops Produced for Different Intended Uses
- subparagraph 251 F, Multiple Market Crops
- paragraph 306, Perennial Crops
- paragraph 307, Adjustments to Fruit and Nut Crops
- paragraph 322, Records of Production.

**F Signup Period**

Signup for NAPFF begins July 22, 2014, and ends September 22, 2014.

**G NAP Deadlines**

All deadlines in paragraph 9 are set aside for NAPFF. Late-filed CCC-471's and CCC-576's for specific eligible fruit crops that are now eligible for NAPFF consideration, previously disapproved by COC for filing after the applicable 2012 deadlines, are eligible and may be processed according to this part.

**H Publicity**

Offices will publicize NAPFF using available resources according to subparagraph 6 B.--\*

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**\*--1801 Eligibility****A Eligible County**

An eligible county is a county designated by the Secretary as primary or contiguous because of a frost or freeze in 2012. A list of NAPFF eligible disaster counties because of frost or freeze is provided in Exhibit 76.

**B Producer Eligibility**

Producer eligibility **must** be verified according to paragraph 29. Landowners, landlords, tenants, contract growers, or anyone else not having **both** a share of the risk and a valid claim of share ownership of a crop are ineligible for NAPFF.

**C Eligible Crops**

Eligible crops include commercially produced agricultural commodity fruit crops grown on a bush or tree for which the catastrophic risk protection level of crop insurance is **not** available and is grown for food. Eligible crops **must** have been harvested or expected to have been harvested during calendar year 2012.

Except for the specific list of eligible crops in subparagraph 1800 I, NAP crop provisions about ineligible crops found in paragraph 172 apply to NAPFF.

Field inspections required according to subparagraph 306 E for perennial crops are **not** required for NAPFF.

A listing of crop groups determined eligible for NAPFF is provided in subparagraph 1800 I.

**Note:** New crop requests for NAPFF eligibility are **not** authorized.

**D NCT Crop Data**

Approved 2012 NCT records must **not** be reset to modify price or yield data. The records will be monitored by the National Office for unauthorized resets and price modifications.

State Offices may add 2012 NCT records for eligible crops in eligible counties according to paragraph 777.

STC **must** establish and approve an average market price in the 2012 NCT for processed intended use according to subparagraphs 1803 C and 1806 A.--\*

**\*--1801 Eligibility (Continued)****E Eligible Acreage**

Eligible crop acreage is acreage that suffered production losses to a 2012 fruit crop grown on a bush or tree in a county for which a Secretarial disaster designation was issued because of frost or freeze, including contiguous counties.

If any portion of a producer's fruit crop unit acreage is physically located in an eligible county, the entire unit acreage of the crop is eligible.

**Notes:** Immature orchards are **not** eligible for NAPFF. COC must reduce T-yields, if age or spacing of trees on the unit is not capable of producing the county yield. See paragraph 307 for yield reductions.

Ineligible acreage must **not** be included in NAP unit calculations for premium or loss.

**F Eligible Cause of Loss**

Although the list of eligible NAPFF counties is limited to primary and contiguous counties having a Secretarial disaster designation because of frost or freeze, the unit within such county may have a production loss because of any NAP eligible cause of loss according to paragraph 21.

A cause of loss **must** have occurred during the prescribed coverage period and the cause of loss **must** have directly impacted the covered crop for the loss to be recognized as a peril eligible for payment consideration.

**G NAP Coverage Period for Eligible Fruit Crops**

Losses **must** have occurred during the NAP coverage period for the 2012 crop year. The 2012 coverage period for perennial crops, including any eligible fruit crop grown on a tree or bush under NAPFF, began 30 calendar days after the 2012 application closing date and ended the earlier of:

- 10 months from the application closing date
- the date harvest was completed
- the normal harvest date for the crop
- the date the crop was abandoned
- total destruction of the crop.--\*

**\*--1802 Fees****A Service Fee Information**

Producers who did not previously obtain 2012 NAP coverage for an eligible NAPFF crop **must** pay the applicable service fee at the time of application. The NAP service fee is \$250 per crop per administrative county, up to \$750 per producer per administrative county, but not to exceed \$1,875 per producer. The service fee will be applied per administrative county by crop definition and planting period according to paragraph 170. Producers who qualified as LR in crop year 2012 may request that the 2012 service fee be waived and **must** provide a certification of their status on CCC-860 at the time of application.

**Note:** Fee limits apply to NAP fees cumulatively paid for all 2012 crops, including the NAPFF fees.

**Example 1:** If a producer originally paid \$750 for 3 crops that had NAP coverage in 2012 in the administrative county and now adds a new eligible crop for NAPFF, the producer would **not** owe an additional \$250.

**Example 2:** If a producer had originally paid for 1 eligible crop that had NAP coverage in 2012 and now adds 2 more crops for NAPFF in the same administrative county, the producer would owe an additional \$500 and cap out at \$750.

Payment of the nonrefundable service fee at time of application in no way ensures, guarantees, or obligates FSA to issue coverage. Service fees are **not** refundable.

**Note:** The NAP service fee waiver is **not** applicable to SDA and BF.--\*

**\*--1802 Fees (Continued)****B Premium Information**

To provide assistance in an efficient manner, a premium will be calculated after a completed application is received and will be deducted from any payment, if applicable. If NAPFF payment is **not** sufficient to cover the calculated premium, no payment will be issued and a premium is **not** due.

Premiums for NAPFF assistance will be calculated based on the lesser of either of the following:

- the product of multiplying the producer's share, times the number of eligible acres planted to the eligible crop, times the approved yield, times the coverage level, times the average market price, times 5.25 percent
- \$6,563 (the product of the applicable payment limitation of \$125,000 times 5.25 percent rounded up to whole dollar).

Premiums will be calculated separately by administrative county, NAP unit, and for each crop, type, and intended use or final use. A producer's total premium amount for a unit will be the sum of the premiums calculated for each crop, type, and intended use or final use for which a producer is receiving NAPFF assistance.

**Notes:** A manual receivable for the amount of the calculated premium **must** be established according to 64-FI, paragraph 21, so that it can be offset against NAPFF or another payment before NAPFF payment is issued.

The **2012 NAP Frost Freeze Premium Report** will provide the calculated premium amount by producer, unit number, and pay group.

BF's, LR's, and SDA's are eligible for a 50 percent reduction of their calculated premium for 2012 NAPFF. To be eligible for a reduced premium, producers who qualified as BF's, LR's, and SDA's in crop year 2012 **must** provide a certification of their status on CCC-860 at the time of application.--\*

**\*--1803 Reporting Requirements****A Producer Responsibilities**

Producers are responsible for providing accurate and complete information. The total amount of unit acreage and production shown on CCC-576 **must** be verified as true and correct by the producer **before** CCC-576 is certified by the producer.

**B Acreage Reporting Requirements**

Producers **must** file FSA-578, according to 2-CP, for all unit acreage of the crop for which NAPFF assistance is being sought. Late-filed acreage reports for the 2012 crop year will be accepted and a late-file fee will **not** be charged.

Although late-filed acreage reports are permitted for NAPFF purposes, a producer **cannot** revise FSA-578 for the 2012 crop year to increase a payment or create eligibility. This is because acreage reported for 2012 was used by FSA to determine loss and calculate NAP payments for 2012, and possibly other USDA benefits.

**C Production Reporting Requirements**

Producers are required to report all production harvested from the NAP unit during the crop year. If not previously reported, this information must be provided at the time CCC-473 is filed and must be captured on CCC-576, Application for Payment. Production evidence on file for an approved 2012 CCC-576 must not be replaced or changed for any reason.--\*

## \*--1803 Reporting Requirements (Continued)

**C Production Reporting Requirements (Continued)**

If a producer does not have an acceptable record of production, the production must be certified on CCC-576, Application for Payment. In this situation, COC will use the higher of the certified production or MALL established according to paragraph 1804 to determine unit net production. This policy applies both to producers who have not previously applied for 2012 NAP assistance, and to producers that were previously found ineligible for 2012 NAP payments because they did not submit acceptable production evidence. MALL will be used only for the purpose of processing the NAPFF application. It will **not** be used in the producer's approved yield or APH database for other purposes, including for subsequent NAP crop years. MALL is also only authorized for NAPFF and MALL will **not** be used for other NAP applications outside NAPFF.

**Important:** The intended use processed must be applied when no production records are available unless a producer can provide records (to COC satisfaction) which support greater than 50 percent was intended for fresh market; such as, a contract, third party statement, or evidence from previous years, etc. In this situation, if an average market price for the processed intended use is not approved in the 2012 NCT, STC must establish an average market price for the processed intended use according to paragraph 108.

When production records are provided for multiple harvested crops that are harvested more than once during the same crop year, from the same plant, such as blueberries; records of production must be summarized and provided for the entire harvest season unless:

- an appraisal is on file that documents all potential production for the crop
- supporting documentation substantiates that cause of loss occurring before or during the harvest season resulted in total destruction or deterioration of the crop
- notice of loss indicates that producer abandoned, destroyed, or put crop acreage to another use. In this case, production shall be assigned according to paragraph 329.--\*

**\*--1804 Establishing Maximum Average Loss Level for NAPFF****A Establishing Maximum Average Loss Level**

COC will recommend, for STC review and approval, MALL for eligible fruit crops that reflect the impact that disaster conditions had on the crops in the county. MALL is used to determine the amount of production that a producer should have made given all eligible disaster conditions in the area or county consistent with the average amount of production of a substantial number of producers experiencing similar disasters.

COC will determine loss level based on all available information, including weather data, loss estimates from applicable industries, appraisals from LA's, damage assessment reports, and other verifiable county office records showing eligible disaster loss.

MALL will be expressed as either of the following:

- percent of loss
- yield per acre.

**Notes:** Land not physically located in the administrative county will be required to use MALL established by COC where the land is physically located. This may require County Offices **not** eligible for NAPFF to establish MALL based on eligibility in a Secretarial disaster designated county or contiguous county. In this situation, MALL **must** be requested by the administrative COC to COC where the land is physically located.

If MALL was established for 2012 SURE, the same MALL **must** be used for NAPFF.

**B COC Documentation**

COC will thoroughly document the basis for determining MALL. Weather data, discussions with NIFA, universities, NASS, or other source should be included as supporting documentation when submitting MALL recommendations.

**Note:** MALL for the specific crop in the county or area will be based on the losses incurred directly by the recognized disaster condition on a representative amount of acreage of that crop.

MALL for a specific crop will **not** be 100 percent, unless no acreage of the crop was harvested and all field appraisals reflect "0" production. If 1 specific area in the county was affected by a natural disaster that resulted in total destruction of the crop or crops, this area could be specifically identified by COC and MALL established at 100 percent.--\*

**\*--1804 Establishing Maximum Average Loss Level for NAPFF (Continued)****C Example**

MALL reflects the maximum average amount of production loss allowable for producers without verifiable records. MALL will be the average loss (or the average yield for crops not affected by a loss) experienced by producers of a particular crop within the county or disaster affected area.

**Example:** NCT yield for apples in the county is 200 bushels per acre. The average production of apples in the county for all producers was 60 percent of normal (40 percent loss).

A producer experiencing a disaster loss on apples, without acceptable production records, will be assigned the greater of the producer's certified production or the county-established MALL yield of 120 bushels per acre (200 bushels x 60 percent).

**1805 Approved Yields****A Producers With Previous NAP Coverage**

For producers who previously had 2012 NAP coverage, the approved yield previously established for their crop for the 2012 crop year will be used to determine the payment amount for NAPFF.

**Exception:** If production was not provided for a historical year in the 2012-approved yield database, producers may request to replace the yields for such years by providing production as long as verifiable or reliable records are provided to substantiate the reported production. These actual yields updated now for the purpose of NAPFF will be termed "exception actual yields". Including the exception actual yields for calculating NAPFF benefits will have **no** bearing on subsequent year 2013 and 2014 NAP applications for payments.

**Notes:** Revisions for 2012 **cannot** be reflected in a 2013 and future year approved yield. If any of the revised data rolls to a subsequent year's approved yield, the revision **must** be removed from that year's database.

For each historical year that is revised in the 2012-approved yield database, in the Web approved yield "**Remarks**" section, ENTER "**Exception actual yields in [insert year that was revised]**".--\*

**\*--1805 Approved Yields (Continued)****B Producers Without Previous NAP Coverage**

For producers who did **not** previously obtain 2012 NAP coverage, the approved yield for NAPFF will be calculated according to paragraph 254. Producers who did not previously obtain 2012 NAP coverage will be allowed to submit production for the APH base period for NAPFF purposes as long as verifiable or reliable records are available to substantiate the reported production.

See paragraph 308 for lag year crop procedure.

**1806 Payments****A Payment Calculation**

NAPFF payments will be calculated with changes to address additional assistance coverage levels, premium deductions, and 2012 NAP assistance previously paid to a producer. Assistance will be calculated separately for each crop type and intended use.

NAP assistance for crop acreage reported with a specific intended use **must** be based on the smaller of the approved average market price established for the:

- specific intended use reported on FSA-578 or final use when final use is reported on FSA-578
- actual market or actual use for which more than 50 percent of the acreage's harvested production is marketed. In this case, STC **must** establish an average market price in the 2012 NCT if an average market price does not exist.--\*

\*--1806 Payments (Continued)

A Payment Calculation (Continued)

The following table explains the steps for calculating NAPFF payments.

Step	Action
1	Multiply the total eligible acreage planted to the eligible crop by the producer's share.
2	Multiply the result of step 1 by the approved yield per acre for the commodity for the producer.
3	Multiple the result of step 2 by the applicable additional assistance coverage level.
4	Multiply the applicable production (the net production of the total eligible acreage based on acceptable production records, the higher of the producer's certified production, or MALL) by the producer's share.
5	Subtract the result of step 4 from the result of step 3.
6	Multiply the result of step 5 by the average market price and apply applicable unharvested factor approved in the 2012 NCT.
7	Multiply the value of any salvage and secondary use by the producer's share, and subtract the result from the result of step 6.
8	Verify that the amount in step 7 does not exceed \$125,000 payment limitation.
9	Subtract the amount, if any, of 2012 NAP assistance previously paid to the producer for the commodity from the result of step 7.
10	Subtract the applicable premium amount based on the applicable additional coverage level from the result of step 9.

NAPFF payments **cannot** be issued until 2012 CCC-576 software modifications are completed. A directive will be issued when payment software is available.

**Note:** Sequestration will **not** apply to NAPFF payments issued in FY 2014.--\*

**\*--1806 Payments (Continued)****B Payment Limitation (Continued)**

Under the 2008 Farm Bill, NAP assistance for the 2012 crop year was limited to \$100,000, directly or indirectly, per person or legal entity. The Agricultural Act of 2014 increases the payment limitation for 2012 NAPFF and 2014 and subsequent crop year NAP benefits to \$125,000 per person or legal entity. Similar to the 2008 Farm Bill, attribution of payments applies in administering the payment limitation of the Agricultural Act of 2014.

As specified in the Agricultural Act of 2014, no person or legal entity, excluding a joint venture or general partnership, may receive more than \$125,000 total in 2012 crop year payments under NAPFF.

COC shall apply payment limitation provisions according to 5-PL, Part 5.

**C AGI Limitation**

The Agricultural Act of 2014 establishes an average AGI limit for additional 2012 NAP assistance of \$900,000, and the applicable years for determining average AGI are 2008, 2009, and 2010. Under the 2008 Farm Bill, NAP payments were subject to a limit of \$500,000 nonfarm average AGI. The \$900,000 limit under the Agricultural Act of 2014 is for total average AGI, and this single AGI limit replaces the multiple limits for farm and nonfarm income, and the separate limit for conservation programs, that were required by the 2008 Farm Bill. The \$500,000 average AGI limitation from the 2008 Farm Bill does **not** apply to NAPFF assistance under the Agricultural Act of 2014, but remains in effect for any other 2012 NAP assistance.

All persons or legal entities, directly or indirectly applying for NAPFF **must** certify by the application deadline that the person or legal entity does not exceed the \$900,000 average AGI limit. This includes members of legal entities, who **must** provide a certification by the application deadline. The certification is in addition to any previous AGI certifications that the person or entity may have previously made about average AGI limits under the 2008 Farm Bill.

County Offices will follow average AGI limitation procedure in 5-PL, Part 6.--\*

**\*--1807 Applying for NAPFF****A NAPFF Application**

Producers interested in NAPFF **must** file an application on CCC-473 during the signup period beginning July 22, 2014, through September 22, 2014, in the administrative county for the NAP unit.

In addition to CCC-473, producers applying for NAPFF benefits **must** either file or have the following on file for crop year 2012 by September 22, 2014:

- AD-1026
- applicable payment limitation and AGI forms, according to 5-PL
- automated CCC-452
- automated CCC-471
- approved CCC-576 Notice of Loss and Application for Payment
- copy of contract grower contracts, if applicable
- FSA-578
- production records.

See subparagraph F for CCC-473 and instructions and paragraph 1808 for modifications to 2012 software application for CCC-471.

Follow instructions in Exhibit 43 when completing a 2012 CCC-576 for NAPFF.

**B Signing and Certifying CCC-473**

By signing CCC-473, Part C, the applicant is:

- applying for NAPFF benefits for the producer listed on CCC-473, item 2A
- certifying all of the following:
  - information provided on CCC-473 is true and correct
  - that the participant suffered a loss to an eligible crop on eligible acres in an eligible county
  - production loss was because of an eligible cause of loss.--\*

- acknowledging:
    - a premium will be calculated after a completed application is received and will be deducted from the payment
- Note:** If NAPFF payment is not sufficient to cover the calculated premium, no payment will be issued and no premium is due.

  - that any payment made under NAPFF program will be treated as revenue under the 2012 SURE program, 7 CFR Part 760, Subpart G.

**C CCC-473 Approval or Disapproval**

The administrative COC is responsible for either approving or disapproving information on CCC-473.

**Important:** CCC-473 and all required documentation, according to subparagraph A, **must** be complete and contain all required information **before** the producer signs. No entries will be made by FSA employees on any form, except entries designated for COC use, after producer signature is obtained. Any additions or corrections by the producer must be initialed and dated by producer.

- Is an approved CCC-576, Notice of Loss, on file for the crop, type, and intended use according to Part 5, Exhibit 43, and subparagraph 1800 G?
- Is an approved CCC-576, Application for Payment, on file according to Part 8, Exhibit 43, and subparagraph 1800 G?
- Are all applicable payment eligibility and AGI forms, according to 5 PL, on file?

If all answers are “**Yes**”, indicate approval of the crop, type, and intended use in CCC-473, item 7. If any answer is “**No**”, document the basis for disapproval and indicate disapproval for the crop, type, and intended use in CCC-473, item 7.

**D Exclusion of Multiple Benefits**

If producer received any other USDA benefit, including a 2012 indemnity under policy or plan of insurance for a selected crop, type, and intended use, or an AGR/AGR Lite indemnity, the producer must choose between NAP and the other benefit.

**Note:** If a producer elects to receive NAPFF benefits, any other benefits paid under a program administered by the Secretary for the same crop loss must be refunded before receiving NAPFF payment for the crop.

**The producer cannot receive more than 1 benefit for the same loss.**

County Offices **must** verify indemnity was refunded **before** issuing NAPFF payments.

**E Notification of Disapproval**

If COC determines CCC-473 must be disapproved, County Offices will immediately notify the producer in writing of the determination. The letter to the producer will include the following:

- notification that CCC-473 was disapproved
- reasons for disapproval
- applicable appeal rights according to 1-APP.--\*

COC or CED, if delegated, **must** act on all completed and signed CCC-473.
