

2010 FSA Customer Calendar (issued September)

Disaster Programs:

September 30 – Final date to apply for Supplemental Revenue Assistance (SURE) for 2008 losses.

DCP/ACRE

October 1, 2010 through June 1, 2011 – Signup for 2011 Direct and Counter-Cyclical Payments (DCP) and Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) Program

Livestock Indemnity Program and/or Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees, and Farm-Raised Fish Program - File Notice of Loss within 30 days of when loss is apparent, File Application for Payment by Jan 30 of following year.

Commodity Loans & LDPs:

Wool & Mohair - Jan. 31
Unshorn Pelts (LDPs) - Jan. 31
Small Grains - March 31
Honey - March 31
Upland Cotton - May 31
Feed Grains - May 31
Soybeans/Minor Oilseeds - May 31

Acree Certification Deadlines:

Small Grains for Grain - May 31
Small Grains for Grazing - 15 days prior to grazing
Small Grains for Haying - 15 days prior to haying
Spring Seeded Crops - August 1
CRP - August 1
NAP - August 1 or 15 days prior to the onset of harvest or grazing for all other crops.

Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP):

Eligible producers must apply for coverage and pay the applicable service fees by the application closing date. Must have NAP coverage on all noninsurable crops to be eligible for supplemental disaster assistance programs.

Application Closing Dates:

September 1 - aquaculture, canola, Christmas trees, nursery crops, turf grass sod, and all small grain crops, except oats.

December 1 - all grasses, alfalfa, apricots, asparagus, blueberries, cotton, pecans, pumpkins, safflower, sesame, squash, and walnuts, nectarines, oats, peaches, plums, strawberries, and vetch.

January 1 - apples and pears.

March 15 - coarse grains, vegetable and melon crops, amaranth, chestnuts, cotton, pumpkins, safflower, sesame, squash, and walnuts.

NAP Service Fees:

◆ \$250 per crop; \$750 per county; \$1,875 per producer for all counties.

Payment Limitations:

For wheat, corn, cotton, grain sorghum, barley, oats, soybeans, and minor oilseeds:
Direct - \$40,000
Counter-Cyclical - \$65,000
ACRE - \$65,000 plus any Direct payment reduction.
