



Leave a Legacy – Plant a Seed



The second annual Women in Ag Conference is set for April 12th at the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Norton from 1 to 5 p.m. The 2013 event will focus on passing on the family farm along with other interesting topics for women in agriculture. Flyers will be out and registration begins soon.

Keynote speaker Stacey Seibel is a fifth generation Kansan who practices estate planning law. Mrs. Seibel comes from a long line of farmers and ranchers and understands the necessity of proper estate planning for rural Kansans. After completing her Juris Doctorate from the University of Kansas School of Law, she furthered her education with a post-doctoral Master of Laws in Taxation Degree from the University of San Diego College of Law. Mrs. Seibel is well respected for her expertise with advanced estate planning techniques, such as limited liability entities and trusts.

Doug Beech from the 4-H Foundation will present “Leaving a Legacy: Charitable Estate Planning.” This program will give a brief overview of the major tools—some familiar, some not—that allow someone to preserve and pass on their values through their estate plan. Mr. Beech completed a Masters degree at Cornell before coming to Kansas State University in 1979. He has served in the K-State Extension to educate rural Kansans about numerous issues, including estate planning and inheritance issues.

Participants may choose a breakout session. Byron Hale with K-State Research and Extension will have a container gardening demonstration entitled “Planting a Seed.” Farm Service Agency County Executive Director, Carl Warner and FSA Loan Officer, Pat Bohl will speak about the various programs FSA offers to Ag producers.
