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DCP & ACRE Signup Deadline

Signup for the 2009 Direct and Counter-Cyclical Program (DCP) and the Average Crop Revenue Program (ACRE) has been extended until August 14, 2009. No late file provisions are available.

Please contact your local FSA Office in advance to ensure timely enrollment.

CROP ACREAGE REPORTING

The deadline to report all 2009 planted and/or considered planted crop acreage is:

June 30th – small grains

July 15th – all other crops

All cropland acreage must be reported by the above deadline dates. Planting dates are required.

Prevented Planting Acreage

must be reported no later than 15 calendar days after the final planting dates. Those dates are:

Wheat – October 25th

Oats – May 20th

Sugar Beets – May 20th

Corn – June 5th

Soybeans – June 15th

Dry Beans – June 25th

Failed Acreage due to approved disaster provisions must be reported prior to disposition of the crop acreage.

SODBUSTER/SWAMPBUSTER PROVISIONS

Sodbusting violations may result when unauthorized tillage practices on highly erodible lands converting native vegetation, such as grassland and/or woodlands to crop production after December 23, 1985 have occurred.

Farmers should be aware that if they convert highly erodible land to crop production without proper conservation measures, they risk losing eligibility to participate in most USDA programs.

Wetland violations may result when wetlands have been converted for crop production. This includes draining, dredging, filling, leveling or otherwise manipulating a wetland to engage in crop production.

Any drainage clearing, cleaning and/or improvement must also be reported to FSA to ensure program provisions are met and violations will not result.

For FSA program purposes, tracts having the same owner and the same operator will be combined as one farm serial number. When changes in ownership of land or operation of parcels take place, a farm reconstitution may be required.

The process of combining or dividing farms or tracts of land based on the farming operation are necessary to ensure accurate farm records. All farm changes requiring these actions must be requested by **August 1st**.

The different methods used when completing reconstitutions are:

Estate Method is the division of bases of a parent farm among heirs in settling an estate.

Designation of Landowner Method may be used when (1) part of a farm/tract is sold or ownership is transferred (2) an entire farm/tract is sold to two or more persons; (3) farm/tract ownership is transferred to two or more persons. In order to use this method the land sold must have been owned for at least three years, or a waiver granted, and the buyer and seller must sign a Memorandum of Understanding.

DCP Cropland Method is the division of bases in the same proportion that the DCP cropland for each resulting tract relates to the DCP cropland on the parent tract.

Default Method is the division of bases for a parent farm with each tract maintaining the bases attributed to the tract level when the reconstitution is initiated in the system.

Banking Changes?

Farm Service Agency payments made electronically require accurate Direct Deposit information. To eliminate delays in direct deposit functions, it is critical to keep the county office staff up to date on changes made to your financial institutions.

Changes in accounts and/or institutions require an update of your financial information in the Farm Service Agency computer.

Please notify FSA timely of those changes.

Controlled Substances

Program participants convicted under federal or state law of planting, cultivating, growing, producing, harvesting or storing a controlled substance are ineligible for program payments and benefits.

If convicted of one of these offenses, the program participant shall be ineligible during the crop year and four succeeding crop years for DCP payments, ACRE payments, price support loans, loan deficiency payments, market loan gains, farm facility loans, Non-insured Crop Disaster Assistance payments or SURE program payments.


Program participants convicted of the distribution (trafficking) of a controlled substance shall be ineligible for all benefits:

*for up to 5 years after the first conviction

*for up to 10 years after the second conviction

*permanently for a third conviction

Rural Youth Loans



The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farm Service Agency (FSA) makes operating loans to individual rural youths age 10 through 20 to establish and operate income producing projects. These projects must be of modest size and be initiated, developed, carried out by rural youths participating in 4-H Clubs, FFA, or a similar organization or with a vocational teacher or county extension agent. The project must be an organized and supervised program of work. It must be planned and operated with the assistance of the organization advisor, produce sufficient income to repay the loan, and provide the youth with practical business and educational experience. PAYMENT LIMITATION/ELIGIBILITY

New forms for 2009 and subsequent years

Participants enrolling into the 2009 program are required to submit a completed CCC-902, CCC-926, and CCC-901, if applicable, for payment eligibility and payment limitation purposes. Form CCC-502 was used in previous years.

Another change for 2009, ALL MEMBERS OF AN ENTITY MUST MAKE A CONTRIBUTION

All partners, stockholders, or members with an ownership interest in the legal entity must make a contribution, whether compensated or **not** compensated, for active--*

- personal labor,
- active personal management,
- or a combination of active personal labor and active personal management to the farming operation;

*Note: there are exceptions for spouses.

1/ Under ACRE, this amount will be a combined limitation for counter-cyclical and ACRE payments. If a person or legal entity has a direct or indirect interest in payments earned on a farm participating in ACRE, this limitation will reflect an increase for the amount that direct payments are reduced.

2/ If the person or legal entity has a direct or indirect interest in payments earned on a farm that is in ACRE, this limitation will reflect a 20 percent reduction in direct payments on each far that is participating in ACRE.

Appointments

Civil Rights Complaint Process

Any person, class or group of persons may file a discrimination complaint within 180 days of an alleged discriminatory action.
