Elections

The election of agricultural producers to Farm Service Agency (FSA) county committees is important to ALL farmers and ranchers, whether beginning or long-established, large or small. It is crucial that every eligible producer participate in these elections because FSA county committees are a link between the agricultural community and the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

County committee members are a critical component of the operations of FSA. They help deliver FSA farm programs at the local level. Farmers and ranchers who serve on county committees help with the decisions necessary to administer the programs in their counties. They work to ensure FSA agricultural programs serve the needs of local producers.

County committees provide local input on commodity price support loans and payments, conservation programs, incentive, indemnity and disaster payments for some commodities, emergency programs and payment eligibility.

FSA county committees operate within official regulations designed to carry out federal rules. County committee members apply their judgment and knowledge to make local decisions.

For election purposes, counties are divided into local administrative areas, or LAAs. Each LAA contributes one producer to serve a three-year term on the Farm Service Agency county committee.

Nominations

Nominees must complete and sign form FSA-669A available at USDA Service Centers and online at:

<http://www.fsa.usda.gov/elections>

Nomination forms for the 2013 election must be postmarked or received in the local USDA Service Center by close of business on Aug. 1, 2013.

Agricultural producers who participate or cooperate in an FSA program may be nominated for candidacy.

A 2013 election is being held in the following LAAs:

Southern County LAA -2

LAA-2 Includes the municipality of Anchorage, Valdez/Cordova Census area south of Chugach Mtns. Kenai Peninsula Borough north of Kasilof River.

Northern County LAA-1

LAA-1 Includes the area that encompasses the following areas: Yukon-Koyukuk and Nome Census areas, as well as the Denali and Fairbanks North Star Borough.

Election Period

June 17, 2013 – COC nomination period begins.

Aug. 1, 2013 – Last day to file nomination forms at the local USDA Service Center

Nov. 4, 2013 – COC ballots mailed to eligible voters

Dec. 2, 2013 - Last day to return voted COC ballots to the USDA Service Center

Jan. 1, 2014 - Newly elected county committee members take office

Who Can Vote

Agricultural producers of legal voting age may be eligible to vote if they participate or cooperate in any FSA program. A person who is not of legal voting age but supervises and conducts the farming operations of an entire farm also may be eligible to vote. Members of American Indian tribes holding agricultural land are eligible to vote if voting requirements are met. Producers may contact their local USDA Service Center for more information.



Don't Miss Out on Voting

Ballots will be mailed to voters by Nov. 4, 2013, and must be returned to the FSA county office or postmarked by Dec. 2, 2013. Eligible voters must contact their local FSA county office before the final date if they did not receive a ballot.
