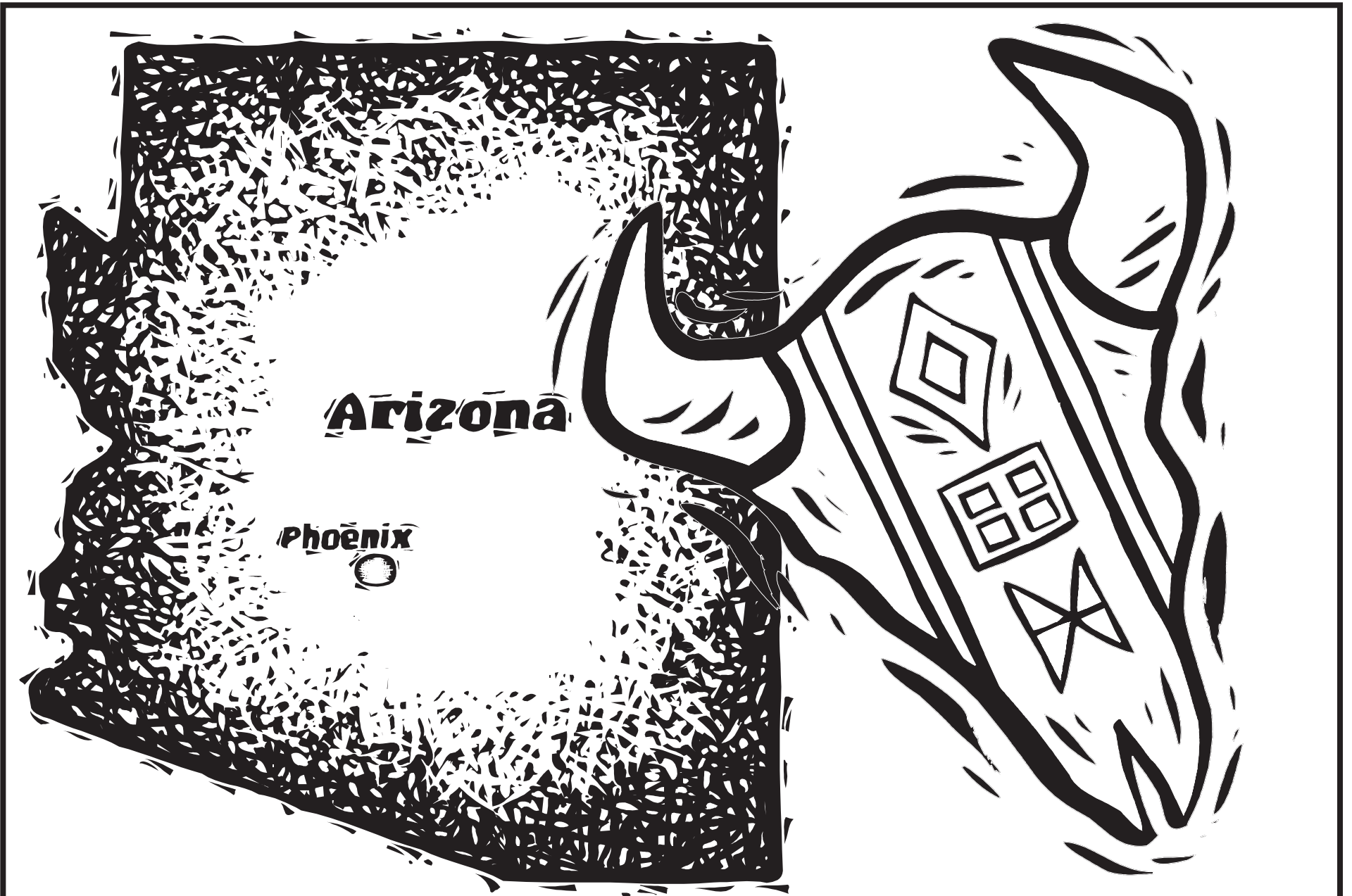

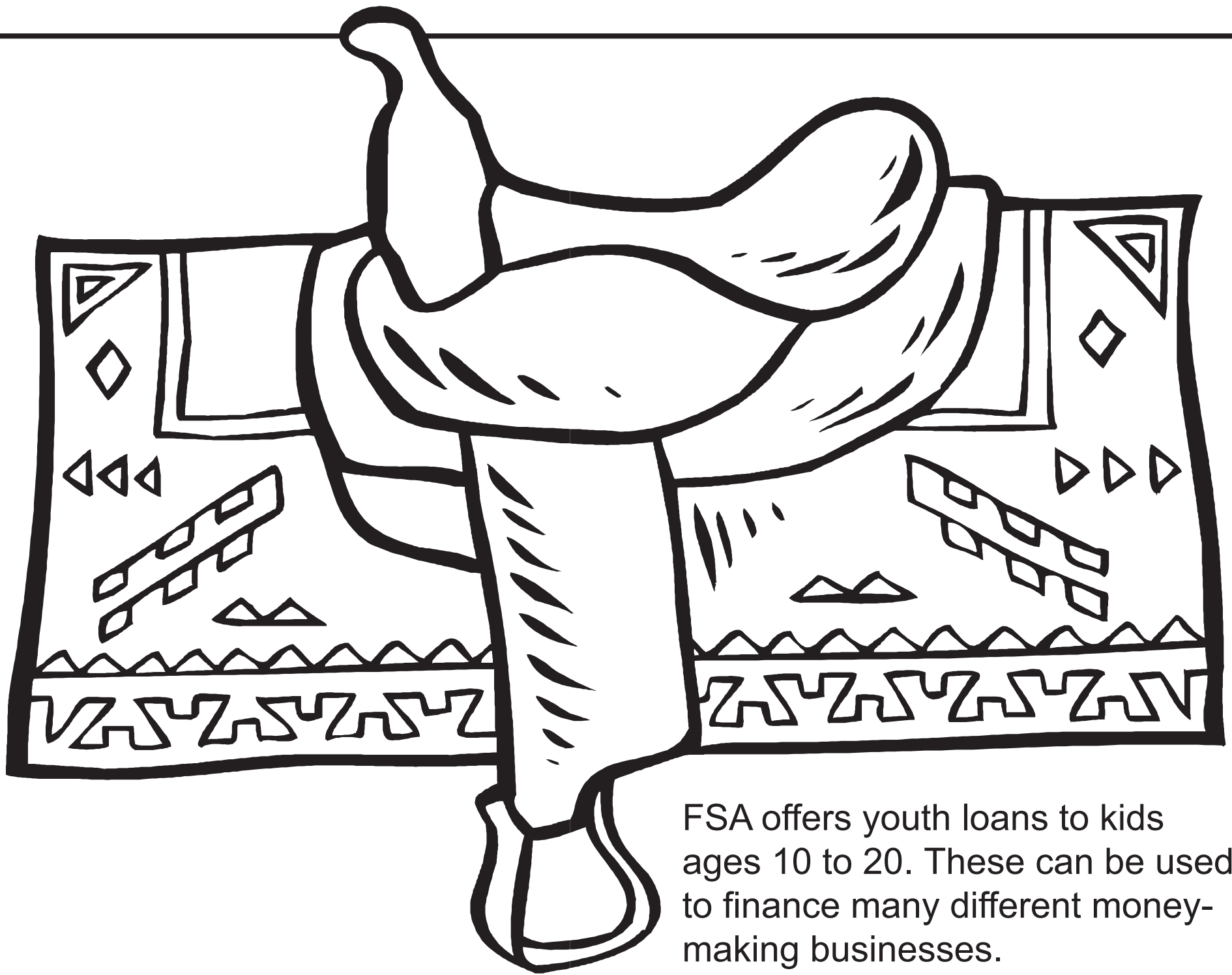

Arizona has 7,300 farms and ranches. And they are big! On average they are more than 3,000 acres each.

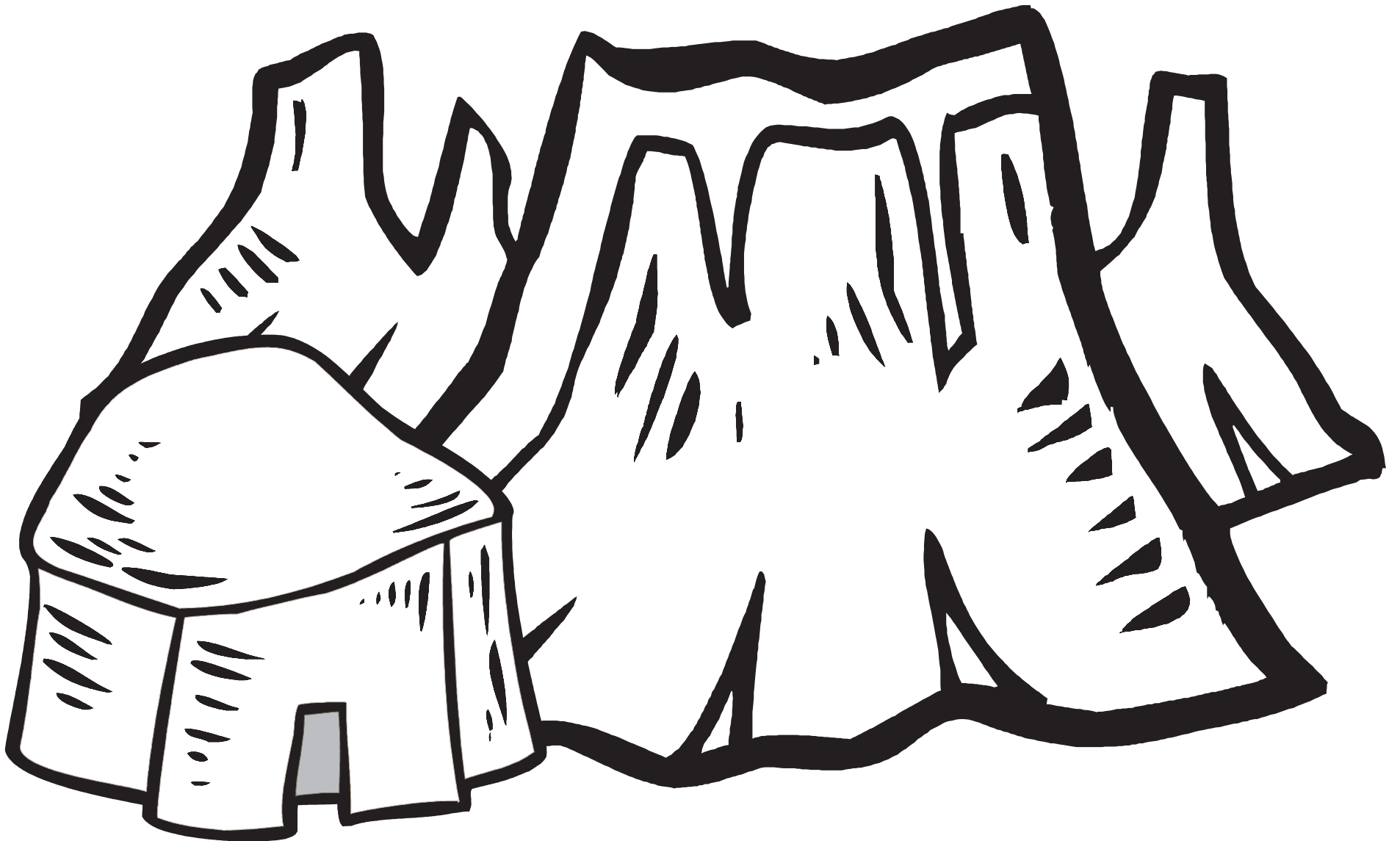
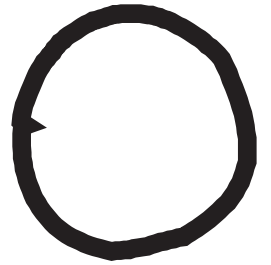


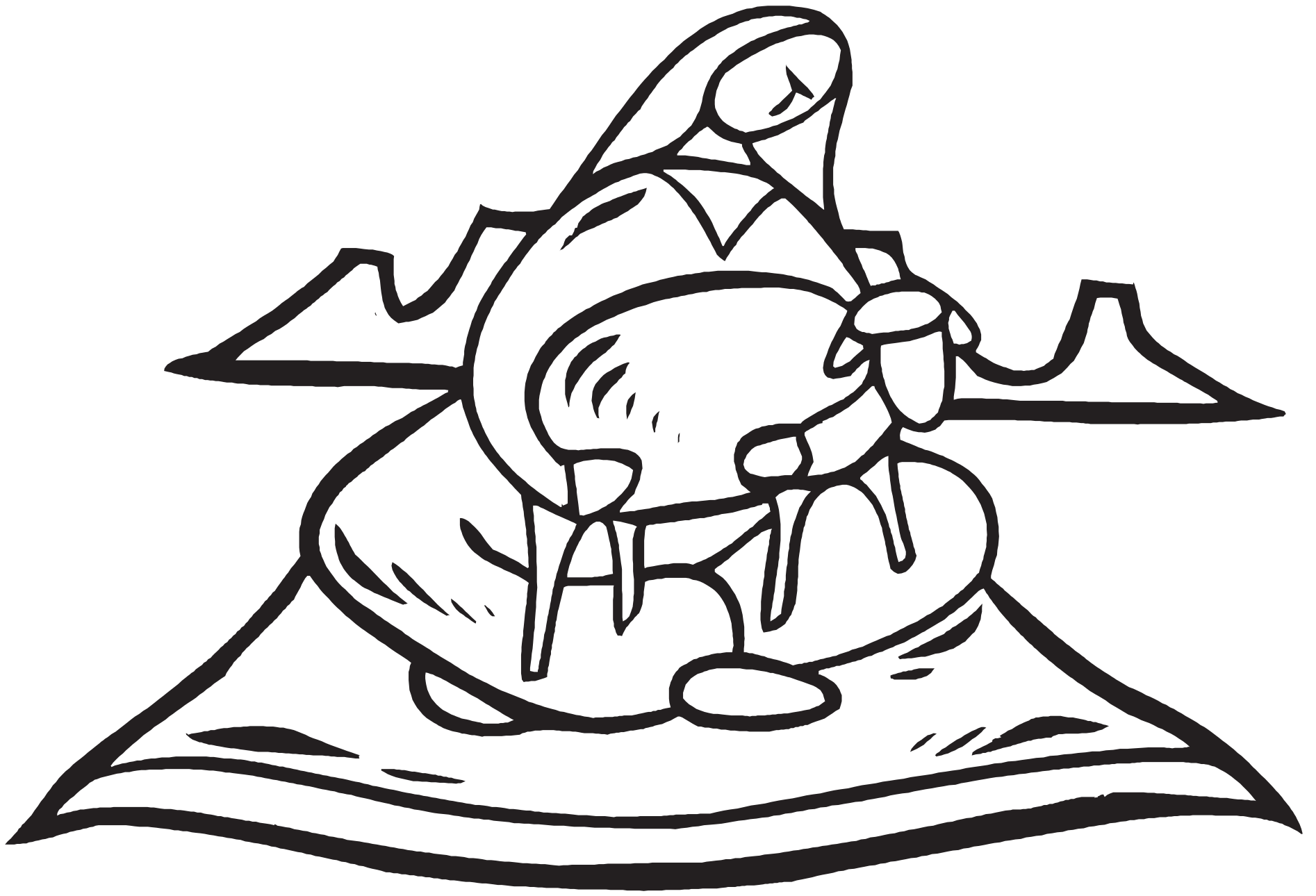
FSA offers youth loans to kids ages 10 to 20. These can be used to finance many different money-making businesses.



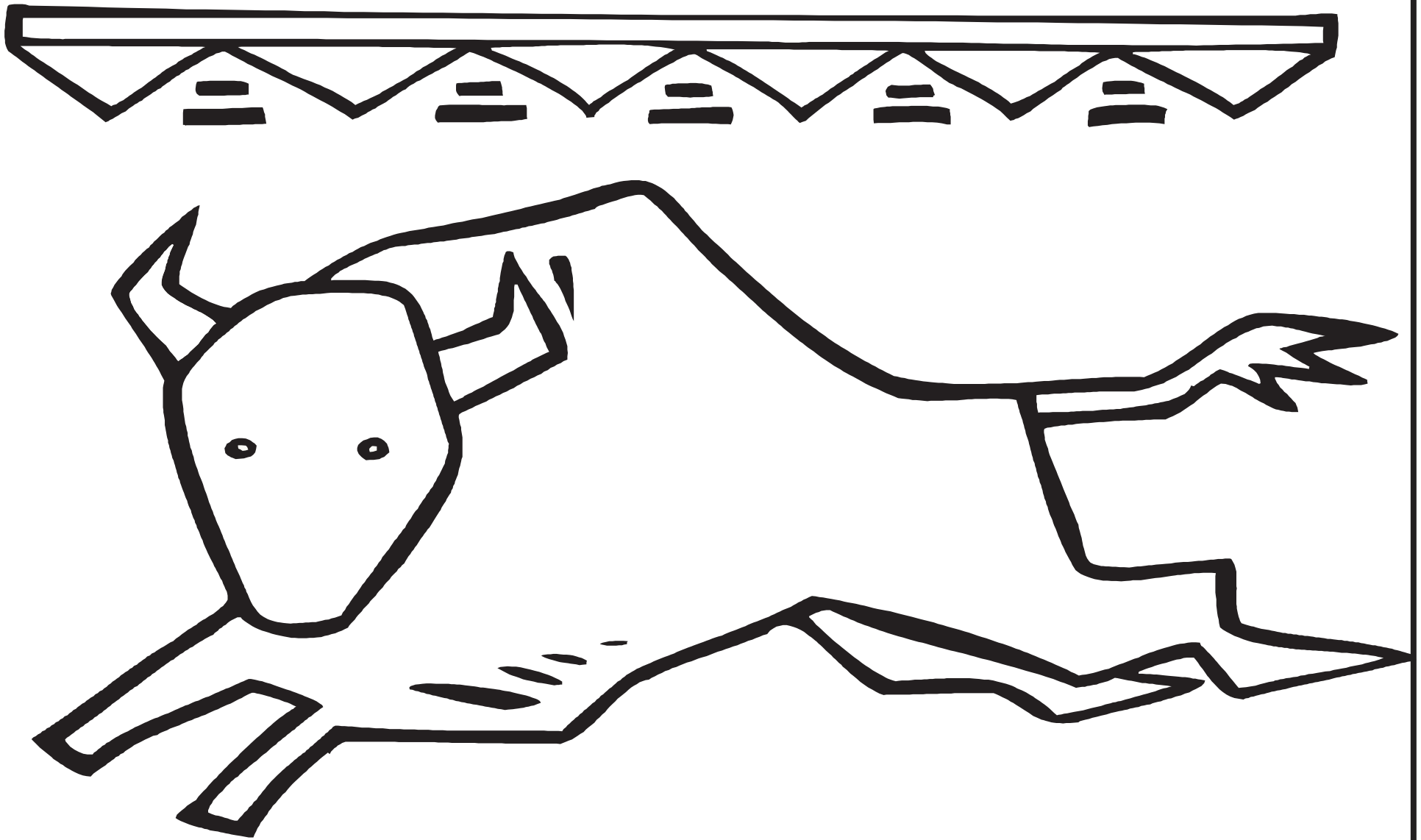
The Farm Service Agency has offices all over the U.S.

Did you know that you can sign up for many FSA programs right from home? If you have a computer you can do lots of FSA business without coming in to our office.

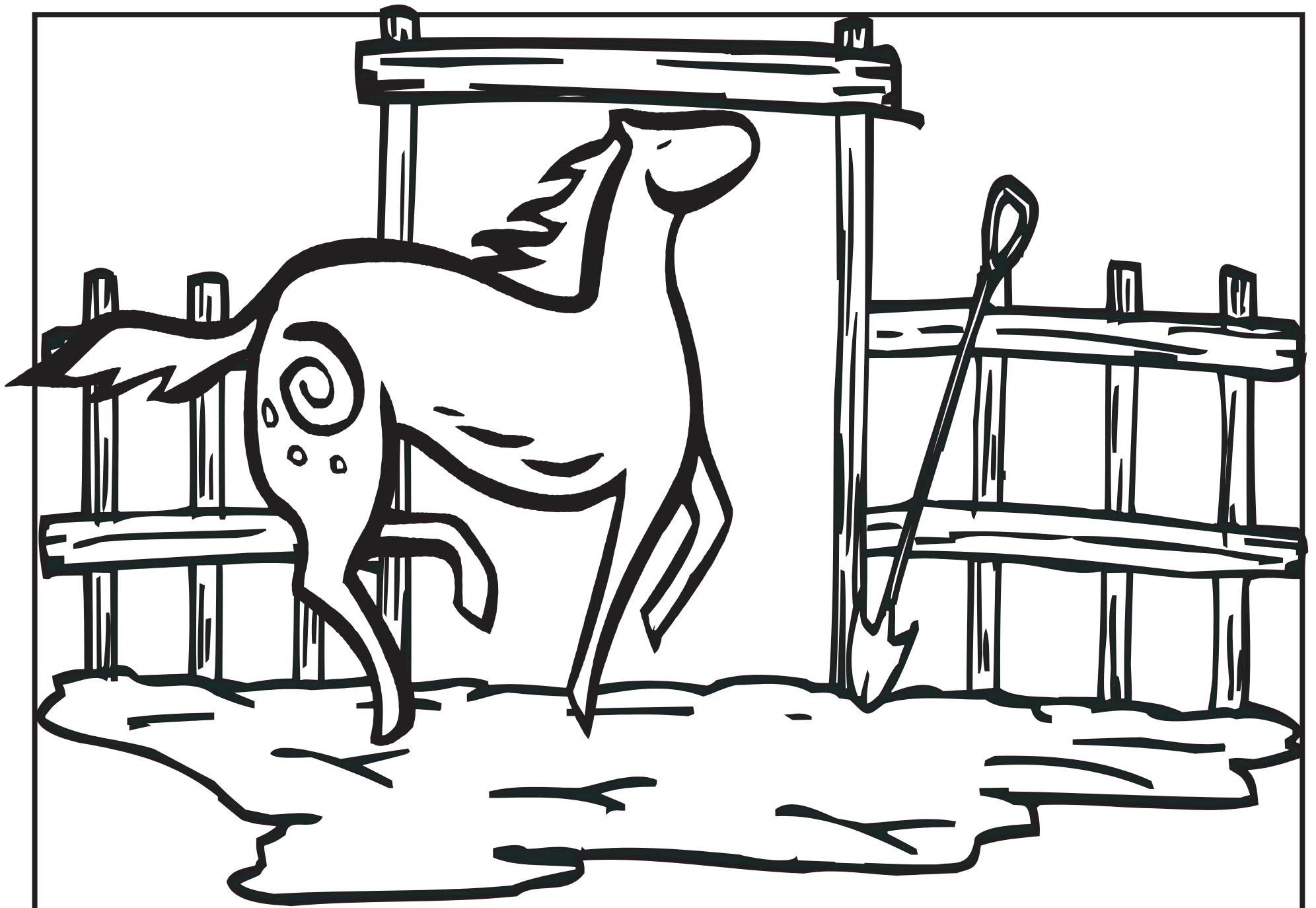




FSA offers many different programs for livestock



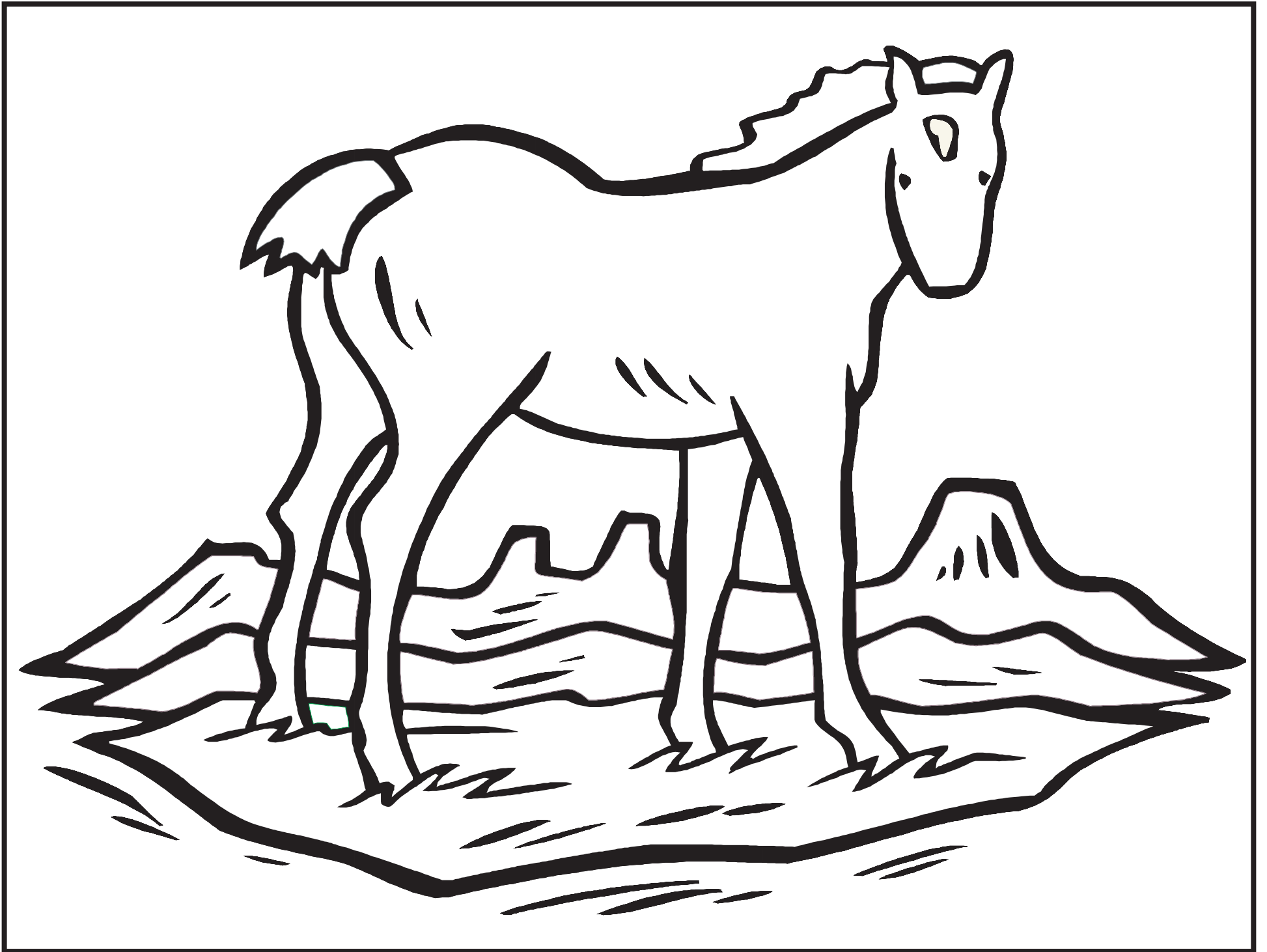
Looking for a disaster program? Many years FSA offers them to livestock producers.

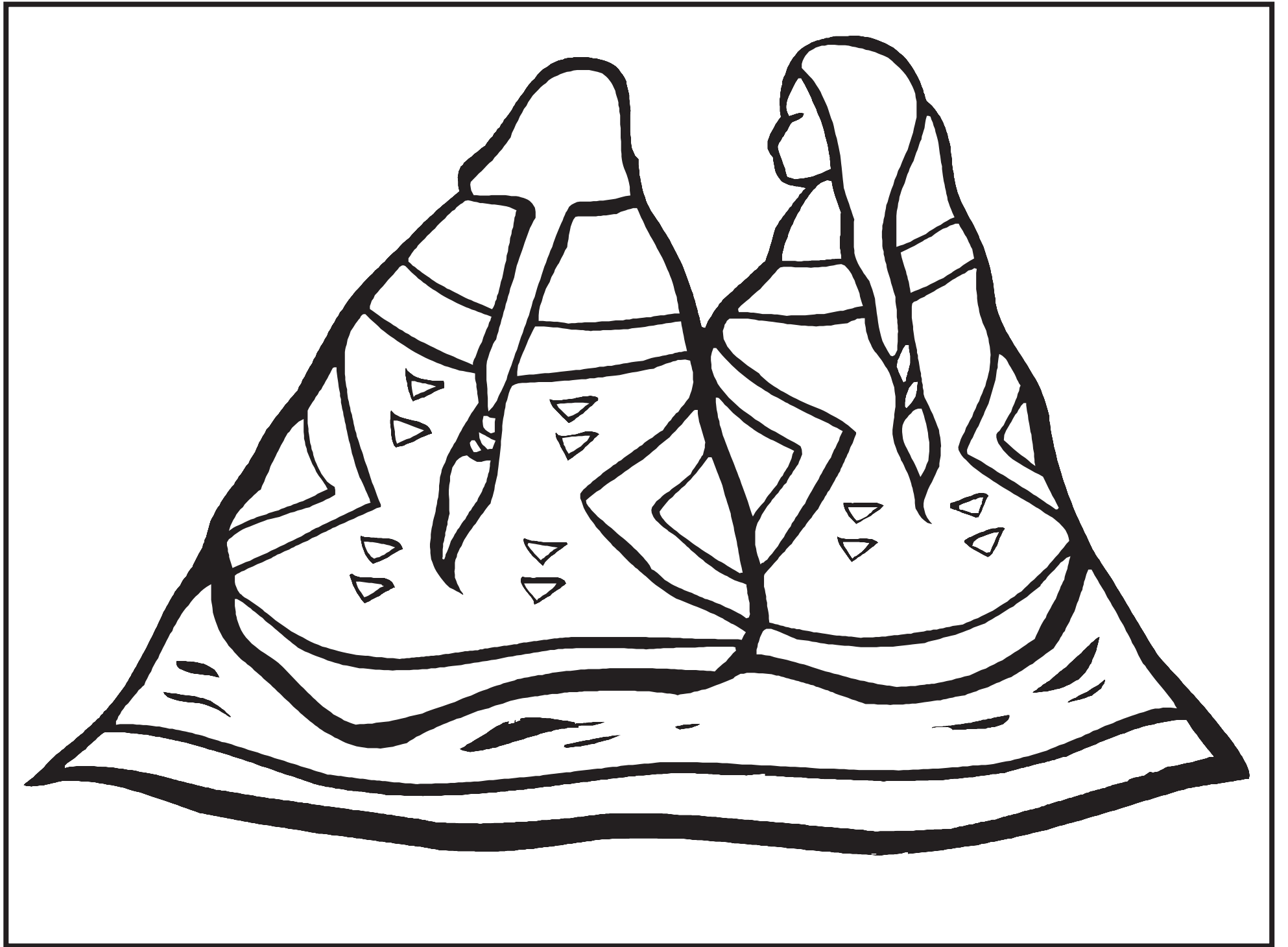


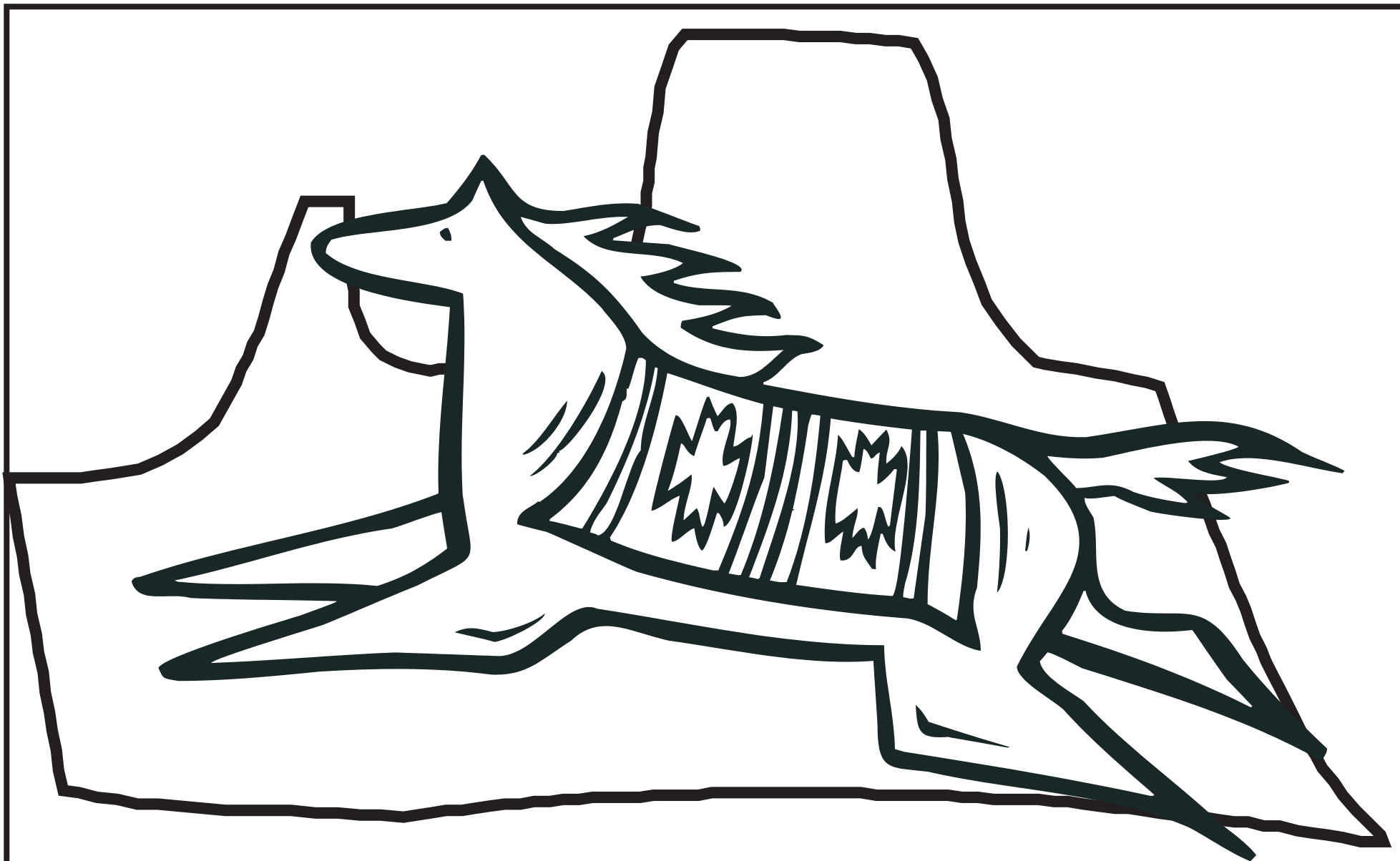
FSA helps farmers and ranchers stay in business.
