Brenda Blair Selected as Seneca County FSA Executive Director

COLUMBUS, Ohio -- March 7, 2016 -- State Executive Director for the Ohio Farm Service Agency (FSA), Steve Maurer, announced that Brenda Blair was selected as the County Executive Director (CED) for the Seneca County FSA Office, effective December 27, 2015.

Blair began her career with the Wyandot County FSA in 1982 as a program technician. She was responsible for implementing various programs including, common management, price support, payment limitation, price loss coverage (PLC) and the agricultural risk coverage (ARC) programs. During her tenure, she designed a Farm and Food Tidbits program to promote agriculture. The program has been presented to Wyandot County 4th graders for more than 19 years.

In 2015, Blair was accepted into the County Operations Trainee (COT) program for Ohio and traveled throughout the state to study FSA programs and learn county office operations. After completing the training program, she was selected by the Seneca County FSA Committee to serve as CED.

Blair continues to help her father with his livestock and grain operation.

She is also very active with youth organizations and has organized multiple fundraisers over the past 10 years so students in Wyandot County junior and high schools have the opportunity to hear positive messages from several motivational speakers. Blair also organized a Haiti benefit fundraiser and Youth Encounter Service program that focused on home improvement for the elderly and underserved.
