**2010 Supplemental Revenue Assistance Program (SURE):**  
**Nov. 14 to June 1** – signup for 2010 losses under SURE.

### DCP/ACRE:

**Jan. 23 to June 1** – Signup for 2012 Direct and Counter-Cyclical Payments (DCP) and Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) Program.

**Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees, and Farm-Raised Fish Program (ELAP), Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP), and the Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP):**

**Jan. 30, 2012** final date to file applications.

### Commodity Loans & LDPs:

Wool - Jan. 31  
Unshorn Pelts (LDPs) - Jan. 31  
Small Grains - March 31  
Honey - March 31  
Upland Cotton - May 31  
Feed Grains - May 31  
Soybeans/Minor Oilseeds - May 31

### Acres Certification Deadlines:

Small Grains for Grain - May 31  
Small Grains for Grazing - 15 days prior to grazing  
Small Grains for Haying - 15 days prior to haying  
Spring Seeded Crops – July 15  
CRP – July 15  
NAP – July 15 or 15 days prior to the onset of harvest or grazing for all other crops.

**Contact your local Farm Service Agency office to make an appointment to report acreages and signup for programs.**

### Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP):

Eligible producers must apply for coverage and pay the applicable service fees by the application closing date. Must have NAP coverage on all noninsurable crops to be eligible for supplemental disaster assistance programs.

#### Application Closing Dates:

**September 1** - aquaculture, canola, Christmas trees, nursery crops, turf grass sod, and all small grain crops, except oats.

**December 1** - all grasses, alfalfa, apricots, asparagus, blueberries, caneberries, cherries, clover, grapes, lespedeza, honey, mixed forage, nectarines, oats, peaches, plums, strawberries, and vetch.

**January 1** - apples and pears.

**March 15** - coarse grains, vegetable and melon crops, cotton, pecans, pumpkins, safflower, sesame, squash, and walnuts.

#### NAP Service Fees:

♦ \$250 per crop; \$750 per county; \$1,875 per producer for all counties.

### Payment Limitations:

**For wheat, corn, cotton, grain sorghum, barley, oats, soybeans, and minor oilseeds:**

Direct - \$40,000  
Counter-Cyclical - \$65,000  
ACRE - \$65,000 plus any Direct payment reduction.

**Conservation Reserve Program:**  
\$50,000

**Emergency Conservation Program:**  
\$200,000

**Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program:** \$100,000

**Supplemental Revenue Assistance Program, Livestock Indemnity Program, Livestock Forage Program, and Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees and Farm-Raised Fish** - \$100,000
