Farmers Reminded of Deadline of Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program

Lexington KY, November 13, 2006 - Farmers are reminded that the deadline to apply for coverage under the USDA Noninsured Crops Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) through the Farm Service Agency (FSA) is November 20, 2006.

Crops eligible are: Apples, Blueberries, Caneberries, Grapes, Honey, Peaches, Pears, Pecans, and Rhubarb.

NAP provides financial assistance to producers of non-insurable crops when low yields, loss of inventory, or prevented planting occurs due to natural disasters by providing coverage equivalent to the catastrophic level of crop insurance. An eligible producer is a landowner, tenant, or sharecropper who shares in the risk of producing an eligible crop.

To be eligible for NAP coverage farmers must file form CCC-471 with their local FSA County Office and pay the applicable service fee by the closing date listed above.
