CHANGES IN THE LIVESTOCK COMPENSATION PROGRAM

The Livestock Compensation Program (LCP) now includes the 2007 crop year. Feed losses incurred from the drought of 2007 will now be eligible for assistance.

Producers incurring a loss in more than one of the 2005, 2006 or 2007 calendar years must choose only one year for which they want to receive benefits.

ANNIE'S PROJECT COMING TO THE FARMWOMEN IN CRITTENDEN AND LIVINGSTON COUNTY

Annie's Project is a program geared to the needs of farm women. Annie's Project, is based on the experiences of a farm wife who spent her lifetime learning how to be an involved business partner with her husband.

Farmwomen receive hands-on training in the area of financial records, production records, marketing plans and risk management, legal regulations and records and human resources. This program is designed to empower farmwomen to manage information systems used in critical decision making processes and to build local networks throughout the state.

The Crittenden and Livingston County Extension Service and the Farm Service Agency are working to bring this program to the area in the fall of 2008. Classes are tentatively scheduled to start October 16, 2008 and end November 20, 2008. Workshops have a maximum of 25 participants in each group.
