Area Committee Election Results

Landowners, farmers and producers in local administrative area (LAA) 2 have elected Kenneth R. Autry of the Horse Branch community to serve a three- year term on the Ohio County Farm Service Agency Committee. Mr. Autry's term will begin January 1, 2008.

The LAA consists of all farms with headquarters north of the Green River Parkway and Butler County to the intersection of Highway 69 near Hartford and east of a line following Highway 69 and going north-east to Fordsville and south of Highway 54 in Fordsville following Highway 54 south-east to the intersection of Highway 110 then north-east on Highway 110 to the Breckenridge County line.

Charles E. Davison was elected as the First Alternate. Alternates serve when regular members are unable to attend committee meetings.

Have you moved?

Direct Deposit Reminder

Agriculture Foreign Investment Disclosure Act

The Agriculture Foreign Investment Disclosure Act requires foreign investors who acquire, transfer, or hold interest in U.S. agriculture land to report these holding and transactions to the Secretary of Agriculture through the FSA office. Reports are due 90 days of the transaction or change in status. Failure to report could result in a fine of up to 25 per-cent of the property's value.
