## *Committee Election Results*

Producers in local administrative area (LAA) 1 in Webster County have elected Jerry McGill to serve a three-year term on the local administrative area. Mr. McGill replaces Charles Ashley Mitchell II who was ineligible to seek re-election due to a nine-year term limit. LAA 1 includes the communities of Bellville, Diamond, Blackford, Wheatcroft, Clay, Williams, and Hearin.

## *Nominations for Committee Advisor*

Applications are being accepted for the position of advisor for the area committee. Advisors are needed to represent African-Americans and female producers. ## *Farm Records Changes*

If you have bought, sold or are renting different land, or have changed bank accounts, make sure you report the changes to the staff at your local Farm Service Agency as soon as possible so farm records can be updated. Specific proof of ownership is required to support record changes and signature authority. Copies of partnership, estate, or corporation documents are required for entities for FSA program purposes. Remember, failure to maintain accurate records with FSA on all land you have an interest in can lead to possible program ineligibility and fines if you are participating in farm programs.

## *Annie's Project*

Annie's Project is an extension risk management program geared to the needs of farm women. Getting a grip on today's agriculture technology and becoming an effective farm business partner is the focus of Annie's project.

The program is based on the experiences of a wife who spent her lifetime learning how to be an involved business partner with her husband. Together they did great things, but it was not easy. Annie's project takes life experiences and share's it with farmwomen living and working in a complex dynamic, evolving business environment.

At the end of the program farm women will have increased their knowledge about: the importance of goal setting, their personalities and how they affect relationships with others, the importance of organizational and time management skills, and how to work with professional to meet goals.
