Direct Farm Ownership - \$300,000
Direct Farm Operating - \$300,000
Direct Conservation Loan - \$300,000
Micro Loan - \$35,000

Supplemental Revenue Assistance Program (SURE):

Signup for 2011 losses October 22, 2012 through June 7, 2013.

Average Crop Revenue Election Program Payments (ACRE):

Signup for 2013 runs February 19 through June 3, 2013.

Direct and Counter-Cyclical Payments (DCP):

Signup for 2013 runs February 19 through August 2, 2013.

Commodity Loans & LDPs:

Wool - Jan. 31
Unshorn Pelts (LDPs) - Jan. 31
Small Grains - March 31
Honey - March 31
Upland Cotton - May 31
Feed Grains - May 31
Soybeans/Minor Oilseeds - May 31

Acres Certification Deadlines:

Peaches – January 15
Spring Oats, Pecans and Potatoes – May 15
CRP – July 15
Spring Seeded and all other Crops – July 15
NAP - July 15 or 15 days prior to the onset of harvest or grazing for all other crops.
Perennial Forage (Grass) – November 15
Fall Seeded Small Grains and Canola – December 15
Small Grains for Grazing – Earlier of 15 days prior grazing or December 15

Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP)

Eligible producers must apply for coverage and pay the applicable service fee by the application closing date. NAP coverage is currently required for all noninsurable crops to be eligible for supplemental disaster assistance programs. Application closing dates include:

January 31 – various early planted fruit & vegetable crops

March 15 – summer and fall harvested crops as well as warm season grasses intended for summer grazing

May 1 – ornamental nursery

August 31 – alfalfa, aquaculture, canola, Christmas trees, turfgrass sod, cool season grasses intended for fall or next spring early grazing, & all small grain crops for grazing or hay

September 30 – greens & most perennial fruit crops

November 30 – asparagus, hay crops (except small grains), honey, & pecans

NAP Service Fees: \$250/crop; \$750/county; \$1,875/producer for all counties.

Conservation Programs

Conservation Reserve Program (CRP):
General Sign up May 20 through June 14, 2013

Continuous Conservation Reserve Program (CCRP):
Applications received on a ongoing basis for application of Environmental priority practices.

Emergency Conservation Program (ECP):
Provides assistance to repair farmland damaged by Natural disaster (tornado, flood, ice, wildfire, drought, etc) Report damage when it occurs. Watch for local announcement of a sign up period for assistance.

Grasslands Reserve Program (GRP):
Applications received on an ongoing basis with periodic evaluations for funding. Watch for Local announcement of evaluation cutoff date.

Adjusted Gross Income

Form CCC-933, Average Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) Certification and Consent to Disclosure of Tax Information must be completed and submitted for everyone receiving payment directly or indirectly before program payments can be issued. If consent to disclosure of tax information has not been previously submitted (for a prior year), payments will be required to be refunded.
