DCP Program

Direct and Counter-Cyclical Program

It's time once again to sign-up for the DCP program! You can begin enrolling your farm in 2007 DCP.

This commodity based program *is not* a continuous program. Contracts for the DCP program must be updated each year. **Deadline to enroll without a late payment fee is August 3, 2007.**

The last day to sign your 2007 DCP contract is September 28, 2007, but you will be required to pay the \$100 late-file fee if you enroll between August 4th and September 28th.

When you sign the DCP contract, you are agreeing to:

- Comply with highly erodible land and wetland conservation provisions on all your land.
- Devote acreage equal to the base acreage to an agricultural or conserving use. (The planting of fruits and vegetables on base acreage may result in payment reductions or loss of benefits.)
- Effectively control noxious weeds and otherwise maintain base acres according to sound agricultural practices.
- File acreage report with respect to all cropland on the farm.

Loan Deficiency Payments

Don't forget that the Farm Service Agency rolled out a new, streamlined process for requesting loan deficiency payments. The CCC-633 EZ, "Loan Deficiency Payment (LDP) Agreement and Request" is now the required form.

By signing the first page of this form, you indicate your intention to receive LDP benefits. Once the form has been signed, you can submit an LDP request for payment at any time during the loan availability period – before or after losing beneficial interest.

One thing that hasn't changed is the statutory requirement that you request an LDP **before** beneficial interest in an eligible commodity is lost. Once beneficial interest in a commodity is lost, the commodity is ineligible for an LDP even if beneficial interest is regained.

A subsidy payment is available when the market price of the commodity falls below the loan rate.

An LDP on wool is currently available. A new payment rate is announced each Wednesday.

Acreage Reporting

It is time to begin filing your 2007 crop reports with our office. If you let us know in advance, we will be able to have your maps and all forms ready for you, and it will reduce the time required to complete this process.

ALL participating farms must file an annual crop report to be eligible for program benefits.

The deadline to report acreage is July 2, 2007. Reports filed after that date will be required to pay a \$46 late fee. COME IN TODAY!

Also keep track of your planting dates. These dates are required on your crop report. These dates are helpful to you in the event of a disaster program.

Gross Revenue

Many disaster programs state that a "person" as determined by payment limitation definition, shall not be eligible to receive certain payments and benefits if their gross revenue exceeds \$2 million or \$2.5 million.

CIVIL RIGHTS

As a participant or applicant for programs or activities operated or sponsored by USDA, you have a right to be treated fairly. If you believe you have been discriminated against because of race, color, national origin, gender, age, religion, disability, or marital or familial status, you may file a discrimination complaint. The complaint should be filed with the USDA Office of Civil Rights within 180 days of the date you became aware the alleged discrimination occurred. Eligibility Reviews

Just a reminder, our office is currently conducting in-depth reviews of documents used to support producer eligibility. The review is the agency's effort to ensure the accuracy of all payments made to producers. This process pays great attention to detail, takes time, and **must be completed before any 2007 crop-year program payments can be made.** You may need to complete new forms and provide additional supplemental documentation.


Position:

Controlled Substance

Any person who is convicted under federal or state law of a controlled substance may be ineligible for USDA payments or benefits. Violations include planting, harvesting, or growing a prohibited plant. Prohibited plants include marijuana, opium poppies and other drug producing plants

Spot Checks by FSA

All CCC-501's (Member Information) and CCC-502's (Farm Operating Plan for Payment Eligibility Review) are subject to spot-check through the end-of-year review process. If elected for a spot-check, producers will be asked to submit proof of their contribution to the farming operation such as seed, fertilizer and chemical bills; land lease agreements, land contracts or property tax payments; equipment lists; cancelled checks for paid labor or hired management; and any other items the FSA County Committee determines are necessary, to verify the operation is actually being performed as was stated.

NONINSURED ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

PRODUCERS WHO HAVE A NAP CONTRACT ON FILE WITH THIS OFFICE NEED TO FILE A "NOTICE OF LOSS" WHEN IT BECOMES APPARENT THAT A COVERED CROP OR PASTURE HAS BEEN DAMAGED BY DROUGHT, FROST, INSECTS, ETC. THIS "NOTICE OF LOSS" SHOULD BE FILED **WITHIN 15 DAYS** OF WHEN THE DAMAGE IS APPARENT—NO MATTER HOW SIGNIFICANT THE LOSS MAY SEEM AT THE TIME. PRODUCERS ALSO NEED TO NOTIFY OUR OFFICE IF YOU INTEND TO GRAZE A CROP INSTEAD OF HARVEST IT.

ADDITIONALLY, YOU NEED TO SUBMIT PRODUCTION EVIDENCE, EVEN IF YOU DID NOT HAVE A LOSS, IN ORDER TO ESTABLISH AN ACTUAL PRODUCTION HISTORY (APH) FOR EACH YEAR. THIS IS USED TO CALCULATE YOUR PRODUCTION YIELD; AND CONSEQUENTLY, WILL AFFECT YOUR NAP PAYMENT. **JULY 2, 2007 IS THE DEADLINE TO SUBMIT 2006 CROP YEAR PRODUCTION RECORDS.**

Special Accommodations

Special accommodations will be made upon request for individuals with disabilities, vision impairment, or hearing impairment. If accommodations are required, individuals should contact our office.



Delinquent Debtors Barred

Under the Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996 (DCIA), producers owing a delinquent non-tax debt to the federal government are ineligible for federal financial assistance, including marketing assistance loans and loan deficiency payments.

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) prohibits discrimination in all its programs and activities on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, religion, age, disability, political beliefs, sexual orientation or marital or family status. (Not all prohibited bases apply to all programs.) CONSERVATION PROGRAM SIGN UP DEADLINES ARE EARLIER THIS YEAR

The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) has announced that statewide signups for Farm Bill conservation programs will close **June 1st 2007**, for the 2008 program year.

By holding signups earlier, farmers will know the results of their conservation program applications when making planting decisions for the coming crop year. The new deadlines will apply to the major NRCS conservation programs – Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP), Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program (WHIP).

In the Environmental Quality Incentives Program, called EQIP, farmers can apply for cost sharing for many types of farmland conservation practices. For most practices, farmers who are awarded contracts will receive up to 50 percent of the costs of the project.

All of these programs are competitive. Generally, only the most environmentally beneficial projects are selected for funding. **Apply for all programs at the Randolph NRCS Office, which is located at 195 N Main Street, Randolph. FARM LOAN PROGRAMS

Need temporary credit? Maybe we can help. FSA makes and guarantees loans to farmers and ranchers who are temporarily unable to obtain private commercial credit. These may be beginning farmers who can't qualify for conventional loans because of insufficient net worth, or established farmers who have a lack of cash flow to meet bank standards. These loans are tailored to a producer's needs and may be used for the following purposes:

- **Farm Ownership (FO) Loans:** used to buy, develop, or expand a farm
- **Down Payment (FO) Loans:** used to assist beginning farmers and ranchers to purchase a farm or ranch
- **Participation Loans:** used to assist farmers or ranchers to purchase a farm with the assistance of a lender or the seller
- **Farm Operating Loans:** used for operating expenses, family subsistence, machinery, livestock, permits, and to refinance debt
- **Beginning Farmer Loans:** used to help farmers start an operation
- **Guaranteed Loans:** local lenders ask for assistance from FSA to guarantee their loans for farm ownership or farm operating purposes

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
