### Reminder for WOOL LDP's

If you have not completed Form CCC-633EZ, you should do so before you lose beneficial interest.

Requesting LDPs and loans has been made easier with the CCC-633 EZ. Complete page 1 of the EZ form **before** losing beneficial interest. Once you've signed the EZ form you can submit an LDP request at any time during the loan availability period – before or after losing beneficial interest.

Beneficial interest means retaining the ability to make decisions about the commodity; responsibility for loss or damage to the commodity; and title to the commodity.

# **FSA Farm Loans**

The Farm Service Agency makes both direct and guaranteed farm ownership and operating loans to family-size farmers and ranchers who cannot obtain commercial credit from a bank, Farm Credit System institution or other lender. FSA loans can be used to purchase land, livestock, equipment, feed, seed and supplies. The loans can also be used to construct buildings or make farm improvements.

If you are having trouble getting commercial credit, check with the county office staff about eligibility, as well as maximum loan amounts, rates, term and use of proceeds.

CalAgrAbility is part of a nationwide network of United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) programs that began through the 1990 Farm Bill. A partnership between the University of California Farm Safety Center (Cooperative Extension) and Easter Seals Superior California. A project that helps link farmers, agricultural workers, and ranchers with disabilities to vital assistance services.

# **Minority Farm Register**

The USDA Minority Farm Register is a tool to promote equal access to USDA farm programs and services for minority farmland owners, farmers, ranchers, tenants, and other individuals with an agricultural interest. Participants may receive information or be personally contacted through USDA outreach efforts. USDA programs include direct and guaranteed farm ownership and operating loans, marketing loans, as well as conservation, housing & rural business, and risk management.

Participation in the Register is voluntary. All minority persons involved in farming or ranching are encouraged to participate. The information you provide may be shared through the USDA Office of Outreach with other USDA-approved outreach partners such as community-based organizations, educational institutions, and other government agencies. If you are involved with farming or ranching and wish to be included in the Minority Farm Register, you are invited to complete our form on the Farm Services Agency (FSA) eForms Web site at <a href="http://forms.sc.egov.usda.gov/eforms/mainservlet">http://forms.sc.egov.usda.gov/eforms/mainservlet</a> and submit it electronically if you have an eAuthentication account with USDA, or print it and mail it to:

# **Farm Reconstitutions**

In Farm Service Agency terms, farms are constituted to group all tracts having the same owner and the same operator under one farm serial number. When changes in ownership or operation take place, a farm reconstitution is called for. The reconstitution or recon is the process of combining or dividing farms or tracts of land based on the farming operation.

When combining different tracts into one farm unit, FSA simply adds each tract's base acreage to determine the base acreage for the newly constituted farm. If a tract is removed from a farm, such as when there is an operator or ownership change, the base acreage that is attributed to the tract is removed from the farm. In some cases, the base acreage could be distributed by different means. Visit your county office for more information.

The final date to request a 2006 reconstitution is Aug. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2006. If 2006 DCP direct payments have already been issued on the farm, the reconstitution will be effective for 2007, unless the payments are refunded.

### **Rural Youth Loans**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farm Service Agency (FSA) makes operating loans to individual rural youths age 10 through 20 to establish and operate income-producing projects. These projects must be of modest size and be initiated, developed, and carried out by rural youths participating in 4-H clubs, FFA, or a similar organization, or with a vocational teacher or county extension agent.

The project must be an organized and supervised program of work. It must be planned and operated with the assistance of the organization advisor, produce sufficient income to repay the loan, and provide the youth with practical business and educational experience.

Additional information and application forms for youth project loans are available from the local FSA offices. These offices are usually listed in telephone directories under "U.S. Department of Agriculture." The applicant must submit completed plans and budgets signed by the project advisor along with the FSA application for loan assistance.
