REMEMBER TO REPORT NON-INSURED ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (NAP) LOSSES

NAP policy holders are reminded that a NOTICE OF LOSS must be filed within 15 days after a disaster occurrence, or damage to the crop is apparent. Please contact this office if you think you have suffered a loss event. Also, before grazing any acreage covered by NAP (that is intended for hay) you must request an appraisal of the production before grazing begins. Contact the office to request an appraisal. If you can not wait until the appraiser can make it to Uinta County, then you must put up representative panels through out the affected acres, so that an assessment of the hay stand (before grazing occurs) can be verified. If you choose to turn cattle in without the representative panels in place then you will be ineligible to receive NAP benefits for 2007 losses.

2007 Noninsured Assistance Program (NAP) Losses

Producers are reminded that crop losses must be reported the earlier of:

- within 15 days of the disaster occurrence OR
- when it is apparent that a loss has occurred.

The policy applies to both crops and pasture grass. We ask that all crop losses (if applicable), including pasture grass, be filed as stated above, when at least a 50 percent loss has occurred on the total acres or unit. Please note that on grazing land, all acreage is included. IE: BLM allotments share, Forest Service Allotment share, leased and private grazing acres.

FSA COUNTY COMMITTEE NOMINATIONS

From June 15 through August 1, ranchers and farmers can nominate eligible peers as candidates for election to the Uinta Farm Service Agency County Committee. The Farm Service Agency county committee members make decisions that can have significant effects on you. For example, committee members make decisions on application for federal farm programs and disaster payments. Committee members play a vital role by helping local ranchers and farmers manage tough financial times and natural disasters. County Committee members make many other important decisions that affect local ranchers and farmers. Visit with a county committee member or the County Executive Director for details on the types of decisions county committee members make. To hold office a committee member must meet basic eligibility requirements. Contact the county office staff or you may go to the website <http://www.fsa.usda.gov/pas/publications/elections> for details about candidate eligibility. Nominations forms are available at the county office or online at the above address. FSA-669A is the COC Election Nomination Form to be completed.

The 2007 COC Election will be held in Local Administrative Area 2, which is the areas of McKinnon, Lonetree, Mountain View, Fort Bridger, or the Mountain View School District boundary. A list of eligible voters is available in the FSA office. Remember, the nomination period runs June 15 through August 1, 2007. Voting takes place in the fall. Ballots will be mailed to eligible voters by November 2, 2007. December 3, 2007, is the last day to return voted ballots to the county office. Newly elected members and alternates take office January 1, 2008.
