

success. The people's readiness, preparedness, and acceptance of WBSCM are critical to go-live success.

With the WBSCM program currently in the Test Phase, and only nine months until WBSCM goes live, the program team is diligently working toward completing and "checking off" readiness activities. A parallel track to the testing of the WBSCM system and processes is getting the people ready to use WBSCM. These activities are tracked by the HCT team whose mission is to address organizational changes required to get the agencies and external user communities ready to use WBSCM. The HCT activities contribute to answering the fundamental question "What are the Steps Involved in getting the people prepared for a successful WBSCM Launch?"



HCT Action Plans

The HCT Team held a series of working session in Kansas City, Missouri on Feb 25th and Feb 26th 2009 to develop action plans with the following parameters:

- Identification of transition approaches from legacy systems to WBSCM
- Identification of issues, interventions, detailed actions and responsible resources to execute these activities
- Identification of the timeframe in which the activities need to be completed

Working Session Objectives:

- Team alignment (across agencies and functional areas) on HCT issues
- Review and assess documentation on current and future organizational processes, roles & responsibilities
- Identify, discuss, and validate gaps between current and future state

- Discuss potential ways to fill the identified gaps (at a high level)
- Ensure team understanding of what is needed and when it is needed (needs and timing)
- Action items to go back to agencies to validate the gaps and define potential ways to fill them

Working Session Outcome:

 Draft Action Plans by agency with HCT timeline, prioritized actions, and resources per agency

Examples of HCT "Go-Live Readiness" Activities

Each agency's action plans are tailored specifically to meet the needs of their internal and external stakeholders, and the involvement and interaction with WBSCM. Examples of HCT golive readiness activities that may be common across the agencies' action plans include the following:

- Train and prepare USDA and USAID stakeholders (internal and external) for Go-Live
- Transition current and new employees to new WBSCM environment
- Identify and incorporate changes to daily roles, responsibilities, and business processes
- Complete all organizational readiness and awareness activities
- Execute and complete agency action plans
- Notify and guide external users on e-Authentication Level 1 registration

Your role is to **identify**, **understand**, **and participate** in the sessions and activities associated with transitioning from PCIMS and satellite systems to WBSCM. WBSCM Terms

Common HCT Terminology

- Action Plan Each agency's plan to effect the
 transition to WBSCM that includes organizational change activities with resource and time allocations.
- External Users- SDAs, schools, vendors, PVO/Freight Forwarders, transportation carriers, and other personnel that will use WBSCM to support food commodity operations.
- Internal Users USDA (AMS, FAS, FNS, FSA) and USAID users of the WBSCM system.
- Interventions Some type of action (training, communications, policy updates, and organization change) needed to move users to
 WBSCM.

Organizational Changes – Changes to the policies, procedures, processes, roles and responsibilities, position descriptions or other people infrastructure changes necessary to support WBSCM.
