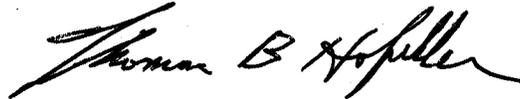

**FY 2009 Initial Allotments for the Continuing Resolution (CR)**

**Approved by:** Associate Administrator for Operations and Management



**1 Overview**

**A Background**

On September 30, 2008, the President signed Pub. L. 110-329, “Consolidated Security, Disaster Assistance, and Continuing Appropriations Act, 2009”. Division A of this legislation funds the operations of agencies, including USDA, that lack regular appropriations at the beginning of FY 2009. The CR is effective October 1, 2008, through March 6, 2009.

**B Purpose**

This notice:

- provides guidance for FSA operations during the CR
- issues initial allotments for non-Federal County Office administrative expenses through March 6, 2009 (Exhibit 1)
- issues initial State Office allotments for Federal administrative expenses through March 6, 2009 (Exhibit 2)
- informs State Offices that funding for Farm Bill implementation costs for temporary employees and training will be issued at a later date.

### 2 FY 2009 Budget Execution

#### A CR Calculation

Because of the length of the CR, FSA will be required to cover the approved pay adjustment effective January 2009, while continuing to operate at FY 2008 funding levels. CR funding is calculated by taking the number of calendar days in the CR (157) divided by the total calendar days in the year (365). The approved CR covers 43.01 percent of the FY. That percentage is then multiplied against the FY 2008 appropriation level and assumed FY 2009 reimbursement levels to determine total available funding levels for the period of the CR.

#### B Nondiscretionary Operations

To begin the process of distributing the available funding, FSA-wide monthly requirements for nondiscretionary operations were documented. Items considered **nondiscretionary** include the following:

- personnel
- rent and utilities
- postage
- certain contractual requirements
- some information technology (IT) requirements.

Funding availability under the CR is insufficient to cover each office's FY 2009 personnel ceiling. As a result, allotment levels include only funding levels needed to fund current bodies-on-board for each office as of September 2008.

#### C Discretionary Operations

Once all the nondiscretionary items were identified, the remaining funds available determined the funding for discretionary operating expenses. For the purpose of the CR allotments, discretionary operating expenses are defined as any operation expense **not** listed in subparagraph B as nondiscretionary. **This includes travel.**

In an effort to ensure that FSA has the ability to operate in as normal a fashion as possible, historic spending trends were analyzed for the items considered discretionary. It was determined that as an Agency, FSA historically uses 80 percent of the discretionary funding in the first 50 percent of the FY. This is primarily because of the upfront obligations for maintenance and IT contracts. Using the initial allotments provided in FY 2008 as the basis, it was determined that the funding remaining after covering the nondiscretionary operations would **not** cover the full 80 percent spending trend. Instead, under the current CR, only 65 percent of the initial FY 2008 allotment for discretionary operations will be provided.

It is important to stress that this calculation, although the CR would only provide 43 percent of the initial allotment level, is being done to allow FSA to operate as normally as possible. It is **not** known what the final appropriation will be or how that will impact operations after March 6, 2009.

#### D National Office Directed Travel

Certain travel expenses incurred by Federal and non-Federal employees will be reimbursed to the State. Travel reimbursements are provided in the following situations:

- when traveling outside the employee's State to assist other offices, such as for details or with jump teams
- when traveling outside the employee's State for consent decree work
- when attending National meetings or training initiated by the National Office with the exception of Farm Bill training that will be issued at a later date.

Budget contacts should submit a budget change allotment request to the appropriate Federal or non-Federal BUD analyst to request reimbursement to the travel allotment for the actual amount of travel costs.

### 3 Allotments

#### A Salaries and Benefits (Object Class (OC) 11 and 12)

CR allotment levels for salary and benefits for permanent full-time employees for both Federal and non-Federal were calculated as follows.

- Salary and benefit obligations for June, July, and August 2008 were averaged to determine the amount needed to fund current bodies-on-board.
- Current employment levels were reviewed to determine whether the monthly average needed to be adjusted. This figure was then used for October, November, and December 2008.
- The monthly average was adjusted for FY 2009 pay cost annualization, within-grades, and promotions, and this figure was used for January and February 2009.

CR allotment levels for salary and benefits for other (temporary and COC) employees for non-Federal were calculated as follows.

- An average cost per staff year was established for other employees.
- This average cost per staff year was multiplied by the base temporary ceiling level as provided by DAFO, for October through December 2008.

#### A Salaries and Benefits (Object Class (OC) 11 and 12) (Continued)

- The average cost per staff year was adjusted for FY 2009 pay cost annualization, within-grades, and promotions, and this figure was used for January and February 2009.

**Note:** The first pay period in March 2009 will **not** be paid until after March 6, 2009, so no funds for salary and benefits are provided for March 2009.

#### B Awards (OC 1152 and 1153)

Award allotments are being distributed on a per capita basis based on employment as of September 30, 2008. HRD will provide State Offices with instructions and guidance on the FSA Awards Program in a forthcoming PM notice. As a reminder, 75 percent of the award allotment is for rating-based awards and 25 percent is for superior accomplishment awards. When issuing Spot Awards, supervisors should deduct the award amount plus taxes (add 60 percent to the award amount) from their award budget.

FSA's Gainsharing Travel Savings Program pays a cash award to employees who save the Government money while on TDY travel. Funding for this award is covered by the savings in travel funds; therefore, State Offices must request that funds be transferred from travel to awards to cover the savings to the Government. Budget contacts should submit a budget change allotment to the Federal or non-Federal BUD analyst, at which time the award amount will be reprogrammed from the travel allotment to the awards allotment.

#### C Overtime (OC 1170 Through 1180)

Overtime is being allotted based on the percentage of the year covered by the CR multiplied against the FY 2008 obligations.

#### D Lump Sum and Other (OC 1183, etc.)

The lump sum allotment covers payments made to employees leaving Government service for their annual leave balances. Lump sum has **not** been allotted, but will be allotted as needs occur. Budget contacts should submit a budget change allotment request for additional funding through the appropriate Federal or non-Federal BUD analyst.

#### E Travel and Relocation (OC 21)

Travel allotments include funding for routine in-State travel. Federal travel allotments include funding for travel associated with FLP for appraiser training travel, Farm Loan Officer Training travel, and "in-progress" Farm Loan Chiefs' mentor/mentee situations. State Offices should ensure that proper consideration is given to FLP travel needs.

Costs associated with leased vehicles from GSA motor pool (MPOL) coded as **cars** will continue to be obligated against the travel allotment. Estimated funding needs have been provided to applicable States.

#### E Travel and Relocation (OC 21) (Continued)

BUD will closely monitor travel usage, by State, at the National Office level. State Offices should access the Hyperion FY 2009 Travel, Motorpool, and Relocation Report to monitor their travel obligations and expenditures. All State Offices shall review these reports to determine whether there are any erroneous obligations against the travel authorization.

Relocation was **not** included in the allotment exhibits. State Office budget contacts should submit a budget change allotment request for additional relocation funding through the appropriate Federal or non-Federal BUD analyst, as relocation needs arise. AD-202R should be provided as justification for the relocation funding request.

#### F Transportation of Things (OC 22)

Costs associated with leased vehicles from MPOL coded as **trucks** will be charged against the State's transportation of things allotment.

#### G Rent and Utilities and Telecommunications (OC 23)

Rent and utility allotments for Federal and non-Federal were based on information provided to FMD to cover leases where FSA is the lead Agency, and FSA reimbursement levels to another Agency when FSA is **not** the lead. The rent and utility allotments also include utilities **not** covered in leases, as well as equipment rental and meeting room rentals.

Contact the BUD analyst if a State has changes in the number of offices where FSA is the lead Agency.

**Note:** The CR allotment will provide for 6 months of rent rather than using the percentage calculation.

#### H Postage (OC 23.5)

The CR allotment will provide for 6 months of postage rather than using the percentage calculation.

#### I Printing and Reproduction (OC 24)

Printing and reproduction covers charges incurred for contractual printing for items such as newsletters, envelopes, letterhead, and training materials.

**J Other Services (OC 25)**

Other services cover the majority of the contractual services purchased by FSA. State Offices should no longer request reimbursement for Federal mediation services and must absorb those costs within their allotment. The Federal allotment for other services also includes amounts for State fees for appraisers training. The Federal allotment for training, BOC2523, requires tuition and includes all training tuition and books for appraiser's training.

**K Supplies and Materials (OC 26)**

Supplies and materials allotments cover the purchase of non-IT office supplies.

**Note:** State Offices should follow previously issued procedure for purchasing IT equipment and supplies.

**L Program Outreach Targeted Activities (Project Code A026)**

Funds for program outreach activities are included in the States' Federal allotments for supplies and materials (OC 26). This year, the outreach funds are included in OC 26 instead of OC 25 as in previous years. This change is to help eliminate the reprogramming from OC 25 to OC 26. See Exhibit 2.

The allotments were developed by the Outreach Staff (OS), based on each State Outreach Coordinator's (SOC) State Outreach Program (SOP) allotment request. All SOP allotment requests were reviewed, ranked, and approved on a line-items basis. State Offices shall include project code A026 in the line of accounting when:

- reconciling credit card purchases
- processing payments
- buying anything related to program outreach targeted activities.

**Note:** Direct any questions about the authorized use and coding of these funds within the State to the respective SOC.

The funds allotted are authorized solely for the designated program outreach targeted initiatives and activities as noted and approved by OS for costs related to the following.

#### L Program Outreach Targeted Activities (Project Code A026) (Continued)

State Offices shall adhere to the program outreach budget line-items approved for the year. If additional SOP funds are needed, SOC, through the respective SED, will need to submit a written request to the OS Director. The request must be supported by an appropriate justification along with the previously approved SOP line-item amount and the additional amount requested.

OS will maintain an adequate reserve of funds in the National Office for additional approved program outreach budget line-items. Allotments will be monitored by BUD and OS. The assigned OS Regional Outreach Coordinator (ROC) will be communicating with each SOC to provide the SOP line-items approved for the period covered under the FY 2009 CR.

Expenses associated with program outreach targeted events and activities shall be paid within 30 calendar days of the event. SOC shall monitor all outreach expenses within the allotment total and ensure that expenses do **not** exceed the total State Office SOP allotment. For questions about this allotment, contact the appropriate ROC.

**Note:** Program targeted outreach funds are **not** interchangeable among other State Federal allotments.

#### M Public Promotion of the Agency Outreach (Project Code A028)

Each State Office was allotted \$1,300 in supplies and materials (OC 26) to conduct its general public contact events. This year, the public promotion funds are included in OC 26 instead of OC 25 as in previous years. This change is to help eliminate the reprogramming from OC 25 to OC 26. The funds will be limited to the following 2 expenses:

- event participation fees, such as rental space, exhibits, and miscellaneous supplies
- promotional items carrying FSA's web site address.

These items should be coded using project code A028. These funds are **not** associated with specific objectives or targeted audiences.

Public promotion of FSA outreach allotments are under the control of OEA. For questions about this allotment, contact OEA.

#### N Equipment and Furniture (OC 31)

Equipment and furniture allotments cover the purchase of non-IT furniture and equipment.

**Note:** State Offices should follow previously issued procedure for purchasing IT equipment and supplies.

**O Insurance Claims and Indemnities (OC 42)**

No allotment for insurance claims and indemnities is being provided. If there is a need, contact the BUD analyst.

**P Interest and Dividends (OC 43)**

No allotment for interest and dividends is being provided. If there is a need, contact the appropriate Federal on non-Federal BUD analyst.

**4 Action**

**A Action on Federal Allotment**

State Offices shall monitor all expenses through the CR within their respective allotment totals and ensure that expenses do **not** exceed the total State Office CR allotment. See Exhibit 2 for State Office Federal CR allotments.

**B Action on Non-Federal Allotment**

See Exhibit 1 for non-Federal CR allotments. State Offices shall administer County Office allotments according to the following.

<b>Step</b>	<b>Action</b>
1	Determine and issue CR operating expense allotments in Exhibit 1 to County Offices using the sub-allotment spreadsheet to pay administrative operating expenses for FY 2009.
2	Hold a reasonable reserve at the State Office to cover non-Federal expenditures made for County Offices.
3	Advise County Offices by a single State Office notice that all FY 2009 administrative payments issued to date, before receiving this additional allotment, are to be applied to the total allotment.
4	Monitor <b>all</b> payroll and nonpayroll expenses within their respective allotment totals and ensure that neither fund exceeds the respective County Office allotment.
