

2 2012 GRP Initial Allocations

A State Allocations

GRP allocations were distributed to NRCS in the 2012 State Conservationist allocation letter. The funds have been provided for rental agreements and easements. Exhibit 1 provides State allocations by type of agreement. **Do not do either of the following:**

- **approve any rental agreements or easements**
- **obligate any of these funds until CCC-357 is received.**

Note: It is expected that funds will be reallocated based on State needs and national program objectives later in FY 2012.
