Closeout of NAP Software for Crop Year 2010 and 2011

1 Overview

A Background

NAP application and payment processing for 2010 and 2011 NAP currently on the System 36 will be disabled on October 1, 2012. NAP applications and payment processing for crop year 2010 should be completed. Notice NAP-148 advised that crop year 2011 would close out in September 2012.

B Purpose

This notice informs State and County Offices that:

- software to disable NAP processing for crop years 2010 and 2011 will be transmitted on or about October 1, 2012
- the following NAP processing functions will **not** be available after the software is transmitted:
 - entering and printing application for coverage
 - entering, printing, and approving notice of loss
 - entering, printing, and approving application for payment
 - payment and overpayment processing
 - printing the following reports:
 - CCC-576E
 - National Crop Table Report
 - Reconciliation Report

B Purpose (Continued)

- the following 2010 NAP processing functions will be available after the software is transmitted:
 - PPH print
 - Approved Yield Maintenance
 - CAT Buy-In
 - CAT SURE Relief
 - NAP SURE Relief
- NAP payment reports for 2011 crop year will continue to be available on the web.

2 Action

A County Office Action

County Offices shall ensure that all 2010 and 2011 CCC-576's:

- are processed and acted upon according to 1-NAP, paragraph 502
- approved for payment by COC or designee, are processed for payment before the software is disabled.

After October 1, 2012, County Offices will be required to obtain authorization from the National Office to issue 2010 and 2011 NAP payment earned by the producer, but **not** issued **before** the NAP payment processing is disabled.

B State Office Action

After the software is closed, State Offices will be able to submit a request for authorization to issue 2010 and 2011 payments through the Sharepoint web site. A forthcoming notice and/or handbook amendment will provide instructions for submitting requests to the Sharepoint web site.
