**eLDP Software Enhancements to Allow Customer Profiles To  
Be Established for 2005 Crops and to Add Sorghum Silage as an Eligible Variety**

**1 eLDP Software Enhancements**

**A Background**

County Offices are required to establish Customer Profiles for each producer before eLDP may be processed. In the past, County Offices have only been able to establish Customer Profiles for 2004 crops.

In addition, eLDP software did not allow for grain sorghum silage eLDP's. County Offices were unable to establish Customer Profiles for grain sorghum that included "silage" as an eligible variety. Silage as an eligible variety was limited to Customer Profiles established for corn.

Software enhancements have been made to the eLDP software to allow:

- Customer Profiles to be established for 2005 crops
- sorghum silage as an eligible variety in establishing Customer Profiles.

**B Purpose**

This notice informs State and County Offices of the updated eLDP software enhancements for 2005 crop year and the addition of sorghum silage as an eligible variety when establishing eLDP customer profiles that list grain sorghum as an eligible commodity.

**Note:** Notice PS-504 informed County Offices that 2005 crop year wool, mohair, and pelt Customer Profiles could be established.

#### C Establishing Customer Profiles for 2005 Crops

Modifications have been made to the eLDP software to allow County Offices to establish 2005 Customer Profiles for:

- barley
- canola
- small chickpeas
- corn
- crambe
- dry peas
- flaxseed
- grain sorghum
- honey
- lentils
- mustard seed
- oats
- rapeseed
- rice
- safflower seed
- sesame
- soybeans
- sunflowers
- wheat.

#### D Sorghum Silage Added to Customer Profile as Eligible Variety

Modifications have been made to the eLDP software to allow County Offices to add “silage” as an eligible variety when establishing Customer Profiles for grain sorghum.
