



Federal Emergency Management Agency Designates Pennsylvania Counties as Contiguous Natural Disaster Areas Due to Severe Storms, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides

News Release | Pennsylvania | June 18, 2024

This Presidential disaster declaration allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: West Virginia

Triggering Disaster: Severe Storms, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides that occurred April 11 to April 12, 2024.

Application Deadline: 1/24/2025

Primary Counties Eligible: Boone, Brooke, Doddridge, Gilmer, Hancock, Lincoln, Marshall, Ohio, Tyler, Wetzel

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Ohio: Belmont, Columbiana, Jefferson, Monroe, Washington

Pennsylvania: Beaver, Greene, Washington

West Virginia: Braxton, Cabell, Calhoun, Harrison, Kanawha, Lewis, Logan, Marion, Mingo, Monongalia, Pleasants, Putnam, Raleigh, Ritchie, Wayne, Wyoming
