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## **Twenty West Virginia Counties Declared a Natural Disaster Area Gallia and Meigs Counties in Ohio are Eligible as Contiguous Counties**

**News Release | Ohio | September 03, 2024**

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to farm operators in primary counties and those contiguous counties through FSA [emergency loan](#) assistance. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability. The deadline for producers in designated primary and contiguous counties to apply for loans is April 21, 2025.

According to the [U.S. Drought Monitor](#), these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for eight or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

**Impacted Area:** West Virginia and Ohio

**Triggering Disaster:** Drought

**Application Deadline:** April 21, 2025

**Primary Counties Eligible:**

**West Virginia** – Calhoun, Gilmer, Jackson, Kanawha, Mason, Putnam, Roane and Wirt Counties

**Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:**

**Ohio** – Gallia and Meigs Counties

**West Virginia** – Boone, Braxton, Cabell, Clay, Doddridge, Fayette, Lewis, Lincoln, Nicholas, Raleigh, Ritchie and Wood Counties
