

Federal Emergency Management Agency Designates Four Counties in Tennessee as Natural Disaster Areas due to Hurricane Helene with Assistance Available for 11 Contiguous Counties in Tennessee

Emergency Designation | Tennessee | November 14, 2024

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This Presidential disaster declaration allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through emergency loans. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Triggering Presidential Designation M4832, Amendment 2:

Impacted Area: Tennessee, Virginia, and Kentucky

Triggering Disaster: Hurricane Helene that occurred on Sept. 26, 2024, and continuing

Application Deadline: June 9, 2025

Primary Counties Eligible:

• Tennessee: Claiborne, Grainger, Jefferson, Sullivan

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

• Tennessee: Campbell, Carter, Cocke, Hamblen, Hancock, Hawkins, Johnson, Knox, Sevier, Union, Washington

• Kentucky: Bell, Whitley

• Virginia: Lee, Scott, Washington, Bristol
