



USDA Designates 1 Michigan as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

Emergency Designation | Indiana | December 13, 2024

LaPorte and St. Joseph Counties in Indiana Eligible as Contiguous Counties

INDIANAPOLIS, DEC. 13, 2025 - This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Triggering Disaster: Frost and freeze

Application Deadline: 08/11/2025

Primary Counties Eligible: Berrien

Indiana: LaPorte and St. Joseph
