

USDA Designates California as Primary Natural Disaster Areas for Drought Emergency Designation | Arizona | March 28, 2025

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through <u>emergency loans</u>. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

According to the <u>U.S. Drought Monitor</u>, these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for eight or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: California

Triggering Disaster: Drought that occurred during/on 10/01/2025.

Application Deadline: 11/25/2025

Primary Counties Eligible: Imperial, Inyo, Kern, Los Angeles, Mono, Orange, Riverside, San Bernadino, San Diego, Santa Barbara, Ventura

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Alpine, Fresno, Kings, Madera, San Luis Obispo, Tulare, Tuolumne

Additional State: Arizona

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: La Paz, Mohave, Yuma

Additional State: Nevada

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Clark, Douglas, Esmeralda, Lyon, Mineral, Nye
