USDA Designates Three New Mexico Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas for Drought

Emergency Designation | Colorado | April 10, 2025

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through emergency loans. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

According to the <u>U.S. Drought Monitor</u>, these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for eight or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: New Mexico

Triggering Disaster: Drought that started on January 28, 2025

Application Deadline: December 1, 2025

Primary Counties Eligible: Rio Arriba, San Juan, and Socorro

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

New Mexico: Catron, Cibola, Lincoln, Los Alamos, McKinley, Mora, Sandoval, Santa Fe, Sierra, Taos,

Torrance, and Valencia

Arizona: Apache

Colorado: Archuleta, Conejos, La Plata, and Montezuma

Utah: San Juan
