

Federal Emergency Management Agency Designates Counties in Kentucky as Natural Disaster Areas due to Severe Storms, Straight-line Winds, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides with Assistance Available for Two Contiguous Counties in Tennessee

Emergency Designation | Tennessee | April 22, 2025

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This Presidential disaster declaration allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through emergency loans. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Triggering Presidential Designation M4860 Amendment 9:

Impacted Area: Kentucky, Tennessee

Triggering Disaster: Severe Storms, Straight-line Winds, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides on February 14, 2025, through March 7, 2025

Application Deadline: December 9, 2025

Primary Counties Eligible:

• Kentucky: Laurel, McCreary

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

• Tennessee: Campbell, Scott

• Kentucky: Clay, Jackson, Knox, Pulaski, Rockcastle, Wayne, Whitley
