Low-Interest Emergency Loans Available to Producers Affected by Disease

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) extends muchneeded emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters and, in this case, quarantines
through <u>emergency loans</u>. Emergency loans can be used to meet various needs including the
replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or
refinancing certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available
and repayment ability.
