



Trump Administration Appoints Mike Mayfield to Serve as State Executive Director for USDA's Farm Service Agency in Tennessee

WASHINGTON, May 27, 2025- The Trump Administration recently appointed Mike Mayfield as the new State Executive Director (SED) for the USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) in Tennessee. Mayfield joined the Tennessee FSA team on May 5, 2025.

"When America's farming communities prosper, the entire nation thrives. This new group of USDA appointees will ensure President Trump's America First agenda is a reality in rural areas across the country. I am grateful for the leadership of these new state directors and look forward to their work reorienting the agency to put Farmers First again," said Agriculture Secretary Brooke Rollins.

"FSA State Executive Directors serve in a critical role carrying out USDA's mission at the state level - ensuring that our focus is on meeting the needs of local agricultural producers by putting farmers and ranchers first," said FSA Administrator Bill Beam. "Rural communities need our support now more than ever. Our newly appointed state leaders bring a wealth of knowledge and expertise to their position as SED and they will play an integral role in shaping the future of agriculture in their state."

Mayfield returns to FSA where he previously served as the FSA State Executive Director for Tennessee during President Trump's first term. Prior to that, he spent 35 years as the County Executive Director in Giles County, Tennessee. He owns and operates Mayfield Angus Farm with his family where they raise registered Angus cattle as well as row crops. Mayfield has served as Chairman of the Giles County Beef Marketing Alliance, Tennessee State Delegate at the American Angus Association Annual Business Conference, Tennessee Cattlemen's Association Board Member and District 3 Vice President, Giles County Farm Bureau Board Member and Giles County Cattlemen's Secretary/Treasurer.

As SED, Mayfield is responsible for overseeing the delivery of FSA programs to agricultural producers in Tennessee. These commodity, conservation, credit, and disaster assistance programs ensure a safe, affordable, abundant and nutritious food, fiber, and fuel supply for all Americans.
